

What's new in print with Kevin Wilson

SIMPLE MINDS (Sidgwick and Jackson £7.95) is Adam Sweeting's attempt to heap legend status on Jim Kerr Sweeting's attempt to heap legend status on Jim Kerr and his merry men and, guess what, he succeeds! Formed in the hedonistic euphoria of a punk-inspired late 70's, Simple Minds (would you believe né Johnny and the Self Abusers) were, at one point, labelled the new Genesis (poor sods). Their emergence into the bigtime coincided with the futurist movement and 'I Travel' was as fine an example of the genre as any Spandau or Duran ditty of the period. The Minds seemed to attract critical acclaim but deflect fan adulation, something that has only changed with the adulation, something that has only changed with the post New Gold Dream success. Adam Sweeting charts every step on the ladder to the top, never easy, always walking the temperamental tightrope that talent invariably throws up yet Simple Minds are one of our top exports, close now to emulating U2's god-status in America, still striving to succeed and not resting on any laurels.

One of the real inspirations of the punk movement; that's Iggy Pop so his new biography, THE WILD ONE (Omnibus £6.95), by Per Nilsen is more than interesting as it comes when the Ig is in an unusually quiet time of life. To many, Iggy Pop and the Stooges were the only true punk band, all aggression, sweat and a self destruct fascination that often left Iggy literally bleeding and battered. In 1977, saved from a drug obsession Iggy turned to Bowie who produced two classic albums, 'The Idiot' and 'Lust For Life'; a new Ig emerged, still angry but now channelled and more refined. Bowie responded in like kind and embarked on a new side to his career too. The rest is history. 'Blah Blah Blah', released in 1986, was the lighter Pop, a near 40 year old rock star coming to terms with himself. But it's the Stooges, 'Raw Power', that's the real Iggy Pop and thankfully the

author concentrates on that fact.

YESTERDAY (Sidgwick and Jackson £12.95) is subtitled 'The Beatles Remembered' and is written by one time personal assistant to Brian Epstein, Alastair Taylor. It's a well written account of some of the lesser known happenings in the life of the fab four; we learn that 'Lucy in the Sky with Diamonds' does not refer to LSD but to a picture brought home from school by young Julian Lennon. The connection? Read the book! Taylor spent ten years with The Beatles and it shows. His style

is affectionate but never sychophantic and that helps! A good read and informative along the way.

IRON MAIDEN, A PHOTOGRAPHIC HISTORY (Zomba £8.95) is a photo-history of the band compiled by leading rock lensman Ross Halfin. It starts in '79 and works its way to '87. In between we travel the globe and see IM in various poses, playing instruments, playing the fool or play-acting. Get the picture? Maiden fans will ... and plenty of them too.


