## Information Please On B.Y.U. Assistants

### Floyd Millet

Assistant Coach

Floyd Millet came to Brigham Young to act as assistant to Eddie Kimball in 1937. At the present he capably fills the positions of assistant basketball coach, backfield coach in football, and head track coach.

Floyd first came to the "Y" as a student in 1931, being a junior college transfer from Gila College in Thatcher, Arizona. During his college career he starred in football, basketball, and track. In all of these fields he won many honors, among them a selection on an all-conference basketball team.

After graduation, Floyd became football coach at Davis high school, Kaysville, Utah. For three years he produced great football teams, two of them beaten only by the team that went on to win the state championship in that year—one year it was Kimball's Jordan high team. Floyd also assisted in producing a state championship basketball team at Davis in 1937.

In the autumn of 1937, Floyd began his duties on the coaching staff at Brigham Young. Since that time he has produced two Track and Field championship teams in the Western Division of the Mountain States conference.

Floyd, still only 28, is as robust and active as any of the athletes he leads. He demonstrates everything he teaches, and there are very few sports that he cannot do well. His responsibility is to produce a proper functioning backfield, a job vital to the success of Cougar teams.

### Wayne Soffe

Freshman Coach

Twenty-four year old Wayne Soffe (pronounced "Sofe") has one of the most responsible jobs on the B. Y. U. coaching staff. It is his role to mold the new freshman material into competent varsity performers in one short season. He's done it well for the past two years.

Wayne was a student of Eddie Kimball in Jordan high school, through B. Y. U., and now as an assistant coach, so there are few who know Eddie's tactics better.

Sofe is one of the main contacts between the

coaching staff and the boys on the squad mainly because of his youth. Many of the fellows he played with during his senior year in 1937 are still on the squad at the Cougar camp. He was captain and all-conference end in that season, his third for B. Y. U.

Last winter Wayne took over the "Y" wrestling squad, and to the surprise of all college wrestling fans turned out a Western Division M. S. C. Championship team.

### Ken Soffe

Assistant Frosh Coach

Fresh from producing a state runner-up team at Grand County high school, Moab, Ken Soffe, brother of Wayne, comes to the campus of his Alma Mater to help his brother handle the freshman stars that have enrolled at the "Y". This was the same school that Kimball coached in 1927.

Ken left his coaching job at Moab to help run a hotel in Provo, but found that he could not entirely leave coaching alone and so accepted a part-time job putting the Cougar kittens through their paces.

As one of the greatest place-kickers ever developed in the mountain country, Ken was regular quarterback on the Cougar teams for three years. In his last year, 1938, he was rated as one of the best quarterbacks in the M. S. C. Like Wayne, he also has been tutored by Kimball both at Jordan high and B. Y. U.

### Rodney Kimball

Trainer

Rod "Dictator" Kimball is the fellow who sees that the boys are in shape and takes care of their cuts and bruises. As a brother of Eddie, he completes the second brother pair on the "Y" coaching staff. He was somewhat of an athlete in his prep school days at Jordan high.

He comes by the name "Dictator" because he is custodian of athletic equipment and directs many of the athletes as helpers. His sense of humor goes with the "dictatorship" to make it all fun. At game time, when he goes out on the field with his little black bag, he assumes a solemn manner and a new appellation—"Doc".






GAIL LEWIS - GIANT B.Y. U. GUARD

# Some Outstanding Cougars

## Roland Jensen

End

"Musc" is one the married men on the squad. He is big, rugged, and aggressive. He is expected to repeat at his regular end position this year. He hailed from Mantua where he was a member of the great Jensen and Jensen (Kenny) passing combination which began at Box Elder high and has continued the past two seasons at Brigham Young.

## Shirl Blackham

Center

Returning for his last year of football competition, Shirl is due for his best performance. He is the giant of the squad, and for that reason has been named "Gulliver" by his teammates. He hails from Castle Dale where he won state recognition in both football and basketball at Central high.

## Dee Chipman

Quarterback

"Chip" is a product of Davis high school, hailing from Kaysville. He was a semi-regular last year, and will alternate again with Ken Jensen at quarter. He plays both quarterback and right half back, and is an expert place-kicker. He is married.

## George Wing

Left Half

George is the rare player without a nickname, but is called by any term typical of speed. Last year he was acclaimed as a great sophomore in spite of a knee injury that kept him out of most of the games. He can pass and kick, but is particularly valuable as a ball carrier, having speed and deception aplenty. When tackled he has a fast twisting motion that enables him to get free and keep going for additional yards. Off the field George is affable, studious, and music loving—playing a guitar for amusement. His home is in Edgemont, S. D.

## Lloyd Brink

Right Half

"Pawnee," one of the co-captains, is a quiet fellow, the exact opposite of his mate, Gilbert. He was given all-conference honors last year, and was a three-letter man in football, tennis and basketball, for the past two years. Brink and Gilbert were the only sophomore regulars on the B. Y. U. "senior" team of 1938, and were mainstays in 1939. Lloyd is relatively small for a blocking back, but his 165 pounds are dynamite. He is also a fast, shifty runner that is hard to stop. He hails from Kaysville and prepped at Davis high.

# Something About Kimball Of B.Y.U.

A true success yarn is the story of Edwin R. Kimball's meteoric career. From the turf of Jordan high school's football field to the swivel chair that goes along with the title "Director of Athletics of Brigham Young University," the story runs true to Horatio Alger form.

At Jordan high school (Midvale, Utah) where he prepped, he was a four-letter man. Football and basketball were his specialties, but he was versatile enough also to win letters in track and baseball. Eddie chose Brigham Young University as his college, and for three years was a regular end on the Cougar football teams of '23, '24, and '25. To climax his college football career, he was elected captain of the 1925 grid team. The fact that he was only five feet eight inches in his socks and weighed only 150 pounds made Eddie's football record more memorable.

Graduating from B. Y. U. in 1926, Kimball went south to Fillmore to coach at Millard County high school for one year. The next year he moved east to Grand County high school in Moab, and for that season and the two following he produced winning teams from a very small fund of material. These years were some of the most enjoyable in his coaching career, and he tells many tales about "some of the boys" he had while at Moab. In 1931 Eddie moved into the upper bracket of high school inter-school athletics in Utah, starting a four year coaching span at Jordan high school. While there he produced two state championship football

teams—one of these went on to gain the title of Southwest Champions—and one state championship basketball team. While at Jordan he coached the most famous prep backfield in Utah football history, "The Four Norsemen".

In 1935, Kimball came again to the B. Y. U., this time as freshman coach under G. Ott Romney. The next year he took over the coaching of the varsity line as assistant coach. In 1937 he succeeded Romney as head football coach and Director of Athletics at the Brigham Young. His present faculty position also includes associate professorship in physical education.

When Eddie became head coach of the Cougar grid teams, he was called by some sport scribes "The Kid Coach". The name still recurs because he is only 36 at the present time. With thinning sandy hair and yet a young appearance, he has a healthy sense of humor. Often he lets up in a strenuous skull drill to tell one of his many humorous stories.

Kimball's three-year record with the Cougars is as follows: 1937—won 6, lost 3, tied 0; 1938—won 5, lost 3, tied 1; 1939—won 5, lost 2, tied 2; total won 16, lost 8, tied 3.

Eddie, "The Little Red Fox", is always close to his boys. With an abundance of material this year, he is counting on their spirit to "win one or two games."

# Professor Wiley's Recording *Makes Hit*


