I was so disappointed to-day in not getting a letter from the one I love so dearly, but I realize how far you are from the depot and that you have little chance to send mail, but oh! how I did ~~no~~ want a letter to-day. Maybe I will get two to-morrow. I must have one at least. I have thought of you so much to-day. I

did not get any breakfast or dinner to-day till 3³⁰ PM and was so tired and hungry but whenever I would think of you, dear, I would feel better. It is after eight o'clock and still four or five calls to make, but must get as close to you as I can for a few moments, so am writing you a few lines.

We are having some clouds to-night that look hopeful. People all over the country are becoming very despondent over the prospects, but if it will only rain in a few days we will pull through some way or other.

I wonder what my dear sweet girl is doing to-night. God bless her, I love her so dearly that I long for the time to come to claim her as my own. She is the inspiration of my life and my chief hope is to be able to make her supremely happy.

Aunt Sarah called me by phone yesterday and had me to send her

some medicine as she was
not feeling very well.

I have something to tell
you that Robert said the
next time I see you. I
get reports every day as I
go over town about ap-
proaching events, some to
the effect that it has al-
ready happened etc.
