



ROBERT BONNER HALLEY

(MAY 14, 1823 - OCTOBER 4, 1875)

A NATIVE OF GEORGIA, ROBERT B. HALLEY BROUGHT HIS FAMILY TO THIS AREA ABOUT 1853. WITH PARTNER T. J. EUBANKS, HE OPERATED A LIQUOR DISTILLERY AND A FLOUR AND GRIST MILL ON THE LAMPASAS RIVER. HALLEY SERVED AS BELL COUNTY COMMISSIONER IN 1859 AND AS A DELEGATE TO THE STATE DEMOCRATIC PARTY CONVENTION THE FOLLOWING YEAR. HE RECRUITED AND SERVED AS CAPTAIN OF A VOLUNTEER CAVALRY UNIT DURING THE CIVIL WAR. ELECTED BELL COUNTY SHERIFF IN 1874, HE DIED WHILE IN OFFICE IN 1875. HALLEY AND HIS WIFE LYDIA (1831-1928) WERE THE PARENTS OF EIGHT CHILDREN.
