Stewart Cemetery is a private cemetery located on Dog Ridge earlier, but removed Sept. 1973 because of highway 190 construction. All are now buried in Salado Cemetery.

Stewart Cemetery was formed as a place to bury two people who died of small pox and were not permitted to be buried in the Belton City cemetery.

# Work to begin on fire station

The city breaks ground today on a \$2.8 million fire station to serve the growing population in West Temple.

Construction starts on Fire Station No. 8 Training and Emergency Operations Center at 7268 Airport Road after the ceremony at 9 a.m.

"We are really looking forward to the new station," Temple Fire & Rescue spokesman Thomas Pechal said. "We've just outgrown what we have now. The space is really needed."

Over the past decade about two-thirds of the growth in the city has occurred west of Interstate 35, City Manager David Blackburn said.

Last month, the Temple City Council approved a contract with Chaney-Cox Construction of Temple to construct the project at a cost of \$2,885,000.

That money is part of \$14 million in general obligation bonds approved by Temple voters in May 2008 for public safety projects. Funds were authorized for the construction of a new Central Fire Station, as well as Fire Station 8. Funding for new fire engines 1, 4 and 8 were

included in the project.

Fire Station 8 will be a multi-use facility on the east side of the Draughton-Miller Central Texas Regional Airport, with a footprint of 9,422 square feet. It will have three apparatus bays, station offices and housing for firefighters.

"The building can be used in several different ways providing different uses," Pechal said.

The west end of the building will be 6,423 square feet and will house the new Training Center and EOC, Pechal said. The wing will have a large classroom, a medium classroom, two smaller classrooms,

an EOC Command Center, three offices, a lookout tower and a future fire training drill field.

A generator will provide auxiliary power to the building in the event of a power failure.

Earlier this year, the council authorized a design services agreement with Architectural Edge in the amount of \$199,730.

Emergency Services Consulting International of Oregon conducted a comprehensive study for Temple Fire & Rescue in January 2007, which they presented to the council in October of that year.

According to the report,

growth in West Temple projected increased demands for services provided by firefighters. The construction for Fire Station No. 8 is expected to be completed by the summer of 2011.

With regard to plans for the old Station No. 1 and the old Training Center, the city is formulating a process for disposition of the facilities and properties, Blackburn said.

"I would anticipate being able to release additional information about that process and the plans within the next 60 to 90 days," he said.

"MDA has helped us a lot. We just really need money for research. It will give my boys hope," Fleming said.

Belton firefighters have in previous years volunteered extra hours after their shift for

the fundraising effort.

"It's a special year because this will be the first time that firefighters will be on street corners on duty," said Kristen Wheeler, executive director of the Muscular Dystrophy Association's Waco office.

Firefighter paramedic Jennifer Howard believes that the change will reach more people.

"This will get us out in the public more," she said. "We're all just as excited as we were last year despite the changes. It's all for a good cause."

Firefighters will be out with

their boots at local intersections such as Sparta Road and Main Street.

Last year, firefighters raised \$4,500, collecting in the Wal-Mart parking lot off duty. Locations, the amount collected is expected to skyrocket.

"Now that they're out in the streets, we expect the numbers to double," Wheeler said.

Belton firefighters will be on the streets filling the boot for MDA from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

## Judge: Enough evidence to hold Killeen teen

**BELTON** — A judge told a 19-year-old Killeen man Thursday there is enough evidence to hold him on an aggravated assault charge and his \$100,000 bond would not be reduced.

Andre Franklin asked for the examina-

tion before his case was presented to a grand jury. He is accused of participating in the beating of a Nolanville man who was escorting people from his home after a birthday party for the man's niece "got out of hand."

Franklin told police he was at the party and saw a fight but denied fighting.

In an attempt to get his bond reduced, Franklin took the stand in his own behalf. His testimony did not help him.

He admitted being charged with assault of a public servant related to an incident at Killeen High School in 2005, a charge that was later reduced because the officer who said Franklin fractured his hand did not show up in

court.

Franklin was initially evasive when talking about two other charges, evading arrest and making a terroristic threat.

He told the judge he threatened to shoot up a Killeen school during a fit of

## Jerry Haisler, Melody 5 to make Hot Summer Sounds

After seven unique performances, Hot Summer Sounds concert series attendees might think they have seen everything live instruments have to offer. Jerry Haisler and the Melody 5 say otherwise.

The band performs tonight as part of the series.

Haisler's group, 43 years in the making, has kept polka alive in Central Texas for decades. It also plays both old and new country, but the Czech heritage in many of the band members keeps polka the top priority.

"I grew up in a Czech family. My dad, (Bob), played polka music, and my uncle played. I heard them playing accordion,

and typically they were playing polka or waltz songs," Haisler said.

Haisler became so enthralled with music that he began picking up the accordion at age 10. By the time he was 13, Otis Beck founded the Melody 5 with Haisler on accordion.

In 1971, when Beck quit, Haisler became the band's manager as a 20-year-old University of Texas student.

Although Bob Haisler also played in the group, the band took Jerry's name as Bob was happy to see his son formally enter the music world.

Bob, who played in bands as early as the 1930s, stayed in the Melody 5 until his death in 2004 at 92.

Haisler also gained his country music background, including Bob Wills and Hank Williams, from his father. He learned to play music at Tom Sefcik Hall, which Melody 5 member Alice Sulak's family has owned since 1923. Sulak and Haisler have been band members since 1967.

"Playing in a small radius, we have lots and lots of fans who've been around in some

## A vine with an attitude

The wonders of wisteria in your garden

BY ROBIN POHL

Wisteria vine is a popular plant here in Central Texas known best for its sweet scented purple flowers in early spring. What some homeowners do not know is that the reputation of wisteria is of an invasive plant. It is no secret that wisteria can kill off many of your plants but, through proper techniques, you can enjoy the purple flowers without damaging the rest of your yard and garden.

Wisteria is dangerous because it grows quickly and spreads over other trees and shrubs, eventually choking out the light. It has no limit to how high it can climb or fast it can grow. The parent plant sends out long vines from the top that can reach several feet into the air and then twine onto an adjacent branch of another plant and eventually smother it.

The most important part of wisteria care is selecting a suitable location. The proper place to plant a wisteria is in the middle of a yard surrounded by grass where you can mow on all sides around it. Isolated in the middle of a lawn, wisteria can be shaped into the form of a small tree or shrub. Plan for routine maintenance of the vine by cutting back long tendrils and removing suckers from the base. The vine should be pruned heavily in the fall to control size for the next growing season. Wisteria vines can be planted about 4 feet apart from one another and grow together for a larger hedge-like plant.

Wisteria plants are also useful for covering arbors that are located in open areas and fences that are away from other plants. To ensure sustainable, attractive coverage of the structure the following practices should be used. First, use the primary center vine to twine up the center of the arch or fence. Select side shoots that twine away from the center vine to cover the sides of the structure. Remove all extra shoots that are not needed for even coverage. Remove suckers from the base as soon as they appear. Remember, it's very important to heavily prune in the fall to control the size of the plant for the spring growing season. Wisteria needs to be closely monitored for the entire growing season to prune extra shoots and also correct twine vines.

Wisteria is an attractive plant but usually is not a good choice for a low maintenance garden. With proper attention, you can safely use wisteria to provide an attractive, fragrant feature to your garden in early spring.

## HINTS FROM HELOISE

### A fluid situation

**Dear Readers:** With the daily uses of the garage, the floors can get stained with fluids from vehicles. Here's how to clean them up:

■ To remove fresh oil stains, first pour 1 cup of baking soda over the spot and let sit for a while. Scrub, scrub, scrub, then rinse and mop dry. Clay-type cat litter can be used to absorb large spills. Pour it on the area and grind it in with your foot. Let it stay overnight, then sweep up and wash the area with deter-

gent and water.

■ If the spills are old, try to scrape off all residue with a paint scraper. Then grind in powdered absorbent. Sweep up after allowing it to sit awhile so that all the liquid is absorbed, then wash stains with detergent and mop dry.

■ Try to clean the floors in your garage at least once a month to prevent serious staining that will be harder to get off later. You can cover the floor where the car will sit with rubber mats or large aluminum pans, if you know

exactly where your vehicle leaks.

Denise, you're right — baking soda is fabulous and has a multitude of uses. Did you know that you can sprinkle some baking soda in the clothes hamper to keep odors away? You even can make a baking-soda sachet using a coffee filter filled with baking soda. Staple it shut and toss it in the hamper. Keep some baking-soda in a clean grated-cheese container by the side of sink, and it will be right at hand. — Heloise

# This camera talks trash

## Device scolds illegal dumpers

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Beware, illegal dumpers. The cameras are watching — and talking — in San Antonio.

New motion-sensor cameras are being installed in some areas to catch and deter illegal dumpers, but they don't just capture images. They also give the dumper a scolding.

When the motion detectors catch would-be dumpers in an

area, a voice tells them that it is illegal to throw trash there, that they're being photographed and will face prosecution. Leave the location immediately, the voice warns.

The new cameras are the latest effort to curb illegal dumping on the city's southside, an initiative started by City Councilwoman Jennifer Ramos last year. Her office won't reveal the locations or how many are being installed, but her spokesman Gabe Farias said the cameras can be moved where they are needed.

"I'd be scared out of my pants" by the voice, said Tim Dimmit, a member of the councilwoman's illegal-dumping task force, as he watched a camera being installed.

Ramos' office routinely receives complaints of illegal dumping on the city's southside, even though many of the neighborhoods are close to tourist attractions such as the San Antonio Missions National Historical Park.

"We're investing a lot of money in the district," said Ramos, noting new develop-

ments around the missions. "We just want to be able to help them succeed and make sure we beautify our community at the same time."

The new cameras are mounted on existing poles and have a 100-yard range. Made by Q-Star Technology, they snap several images, and the voice starts scolding once motion is detected.

Code compliance officers will check the new cameras once a week to see if they've nabbed anyone, but Farias said the goal is mostly deterrence.

## Dell Inc. paying \$100 million to settle SEC civil charges

WASHINGTON (AP) — Computer maker Dell Inc. is paying \$100 million to settle civil charges that it fraudulently used payments from Intel to pump up its profits to meet Wall Street targets over five years, the government announced Thursday.

Under the settlement with the Securities and Exchange Commission, company Chairman and CEO Michael Dell also agreed to pay a separate \$4

million civil penalty.

The settlement culminated a five-year investigation by the agency. While the \$100 million fine was far from the largest penalty levied by the SEC, the decision to charge a sitting chief executive of a major company and reach a seven-figure settlement with him is rare. Founder Michael Dell is one of the most prominent figures in the technology industry, credited for revolu-

tionizing the PC market by making the computers cheap and widely accessible.

The SEC had accused Michael Dell, former CEO Kevin Rollins and former Chief Financial Officer James Schneider of playing a role in the company's alleged violations of disclosure laws. Schneider and two other former executives were charged with taking part in the alleged fraudulent accounting.

## Nation's oldest person marks another year

JACKSONVILLE (AP) — The Texas's oldest person, an East Texas resident, has celebrated yet another year. But which year is a matter of mild debate.

The Gerontology Research Group in Los Angeles lists Eunice Sanborn at 114, validating her as the oldest person in the U.S. and the second oldest in the world.

A lady in France has her beat by about five months for top international supercentenarian.

However Sanborn, a longtime Jacksonville resident, and her friends say she was actually born on July 20 in 1895, not 1896 as the official record states. That makes her 115.

The Tyler Morning Telegraph reports that Sanborn has been resting up since partying with 100 well-wishers at her birthday bash at the First Baptist Church in Jacksonville on Tuesday.

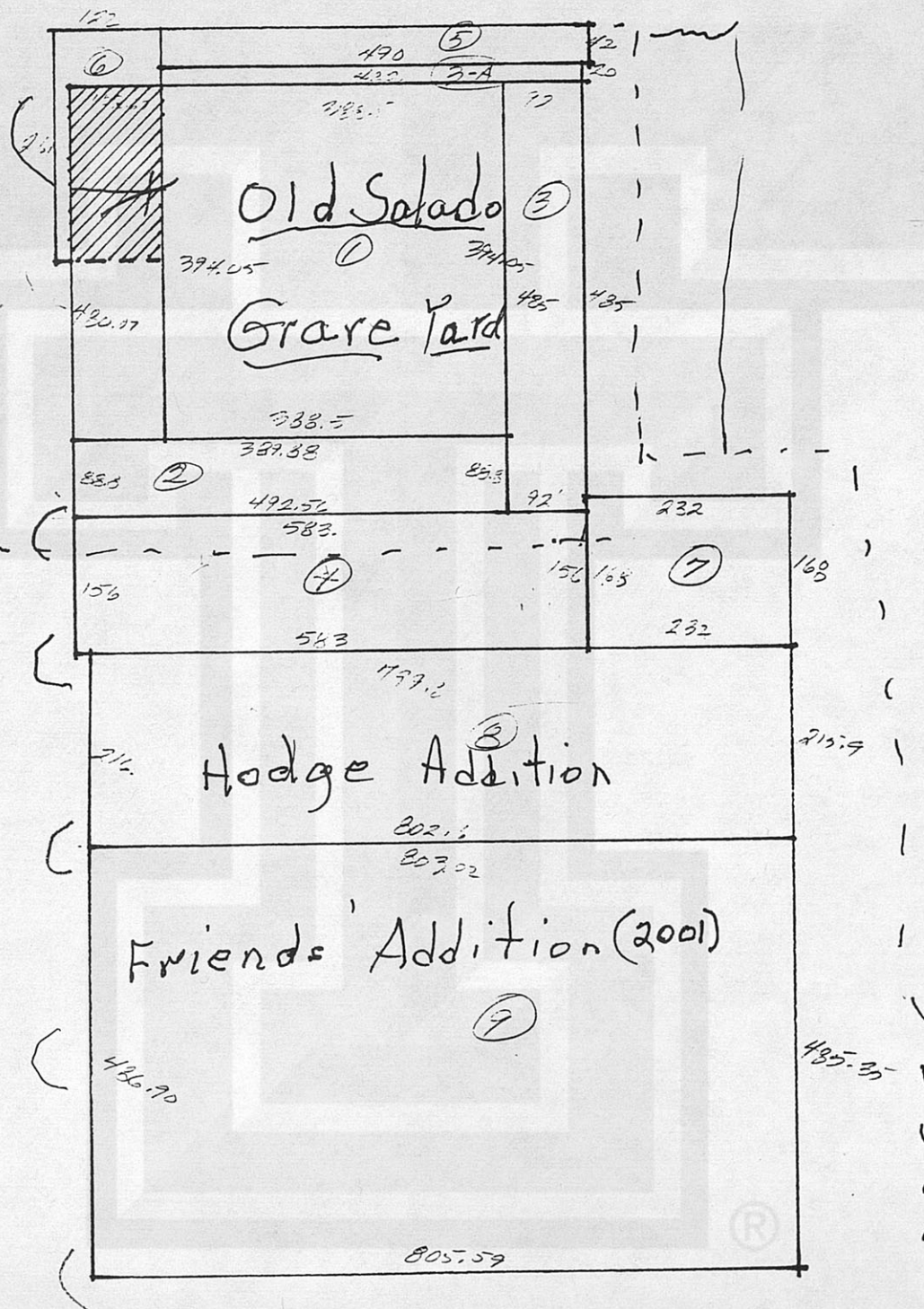




Map of Salado Cemetery. The plots are shown in numerical order of the dates of acquisition. The bottom area of the map, #9, is the most recent acquisition

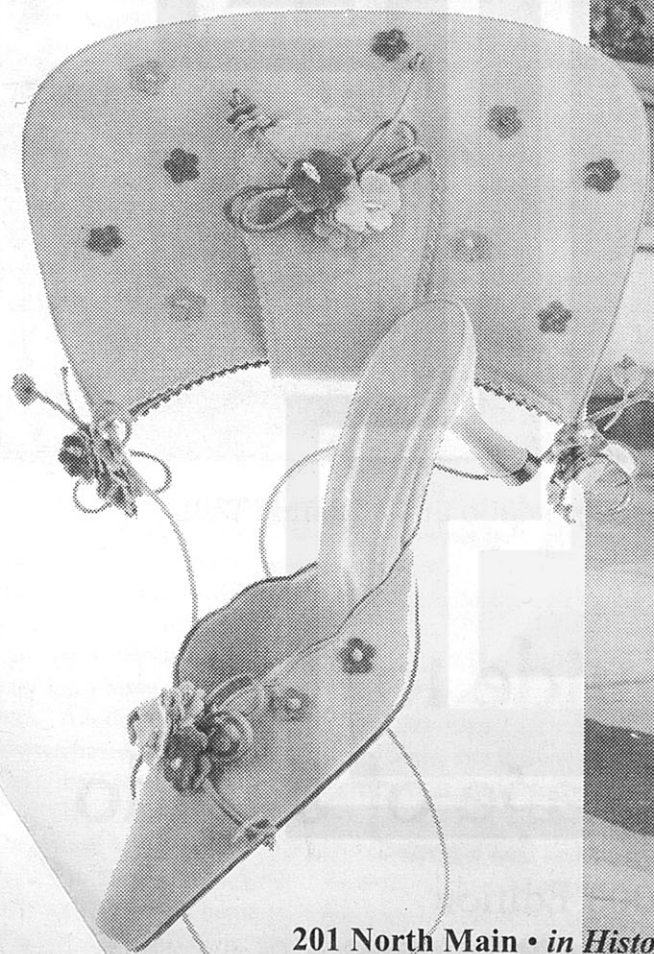

# History lives on in old cemetery

Four giant, solitary oaks lord over the middle of the property like celestial sentinels. Planted almost divinely in the center of the grounds, they seem to have their roots encircling every aspect of the cemetery, silently drawing in the unrecorded history of a nearly forgotten landmark.

The West Salado Cemetery, taken in and of itself, is a somewhat nondescript parcel of land, neat and well-maintained for the past decade, but hardly a vision to inspire awe. It is tucked caddy-corner between Country Boy's and Harold's Piano, easy to miss, almost as if it's playing hide-and-go-seek with the 21st century. Located scant yards from the interstate, thousands of motorists pass by the cemetery each day, but at 70 miles per hour the full breadth of its unassuming story passes like the white and yellow stripes of the highway, unheard and barely seen.

It is, however, important, because it is one of the few active black cemeteries in the area. A cursory glance around Salado shows that not much remains of the African-American culture that helped clear and settle the village many generations ago. A fact that is either unknown or conveniently forgotten, the history of the black community in Salado stretches back as far as that of the whites. Largely scattered by the time the Depression hit, at one point the number of blacks residing in Salado totalled between 150 and 200, a population only slightly less than that of the whites, and this stoic little cemetery seems to be one of the few remaining threads of their legacy. In private hands since 1991, when current owner and caretaker Earnest Wilkinson purchased the property, the one and four-fifths acre plot was originally deeded in 1879 by Colonel E.S.C. Robertson to the freedmen of Salado. In a diary entry dated Christmas day 1875, Robertson writes, "Went up after dinner to see John Sanders f.m.c. (freed man of color) about hiring a cook and wash woman. Will let me know tomorrow. The freed men want a piece of land for a school house and church-have promised it to them."

It would be another four years before the freedmen and women got their land. Common tradition tell us that the land was donated to the black community in town by Robertson, however there are other, more quietly whispered rumors that suggest otherwise, that the black community had raised the funds amongst themselves to purchase the land. The fact that four years had taken place between the time the land was promised and the time the land was deeded does cause pause. However, it is also commonly held that Colonel Robertson was a kind and benevolent man who treated all his neighbors, both white and black, with respect, so the particulars might never be resolved.

In any case, the land was deeded on the first day of the year, 1879, for the aforementioned use of school, church and graveyard purposes. Another persistent little rumor that cannot be verified, that the purchased land had been used as a burial site in antebellum times, is almost certainly true. In fact, the oldest legible headstone in the graveyard, that of Jozie Fulbright, is dated 1877, two years before the land was deeded. This suggests that the land had been used for burial for some time prior. The oldest area of the cemetery, the northwest corner, is home to many simple, unmarked stones, whose origins are unknown. But it is not unsafe to assume that these markers are contemporaneous with, or predate the Fulbright grave, given that slaves lacked the means of producing ornate head-

stones, and often times, as Earnest Wilkinson explained, they used whatever was at hand, which was generally a large stone, to mark a location of burial. Some unfortunate, anonymous souls never received a marker. According to Wilkinson, this practice continued into the 20th century.

Also said to be buried on the grounds of the West Salado Cemetery is a man named Mtesa Uction, a former slave who followed his master to Texas after the Confederate surrender at Appomattox, who is a story all his own. According to the book, **Tales of Old Salado**, by E.M. Hutchens, Uction worked on the grist mills and over the years his hands "became inlaid with minute steel splinters," eventually becoming magnetized, and on several occasions, he was called to the College to demonstrate the principals of magnetics to students in natural philosophy class. Also said to have enormous physical strength, Uction "carried in his arms up the stairway the College chapel's first organ," according to Hutchens. Sadly, it will likely never be known where this character was laid to rest.

Wilkinson, in addition to his duties as caretaker, also has a strong historical connection to the cemetery. His grandfather, the patriarch of his family, Finn Wilkinson, was a native born Texas slave who became free after the Civil War. His master was one Melville Wilkinson, who is said to have donated land after the war to all of his slaves. This again, is a matter of debate, but however he obtained his land, Finn settled in Salado and several generations of his descendants have been reared here as well. Finn was yet another interesting man whose unique life is rarely mentioned when the history of old Salado is discussed.

Standing six feet tall and possessing considerable intellect, Finn could read and write, unusual for a man of slave derivation. He was also a cowboy who participated in many drives, keeping the spirits of the other cowhands high with his affability and lighthearted sense of humor. Finn, however, never forgot slavery. He would take a turn to the serious when explaining to his children and grand-

children about "the peculiar institution" of slavery. He explained that one particularly diabolical and popular method employed by slave traders was to throw a feast a short distance from the ship. Shortly thereafter, another celebration would be thrown, this time a little bit closer to the ship than the last. Finally, a third would be held, this time however, in the ship itself. Once safely on board, the ship would set sail with its unsuspecting passengers in tow, who were now trapped and resigned to their unenviable fate. Wilkinson's other grandfather, Finn Fullbright, was a stonemason whose mark of F.F. can still be read on some of the older headstones.

Once the land for the cemetery had been legally acquired, two churches and a school were erected, of which no traces remain. For such a small community, the presence of two churches is indicative of the importance religion played in the community. One church was Baptist, the other Methodist; however, no clear congregational lines were ever drawn, and most folks attended both regularly. The school served children grades one through six only, the high schoolers attending Harris High School in Belton. Because, up until relative recent history, central Texas was an overwhelmingly agriculture area, children did not attend school until early November, their hands being needed more for farming than scholarly pursuits.

During the 1920's, approximately 18 children attended the school, with teachers using textbooks donated from nearby Salado

College. But again, no buildings remain.

Unfortunately, when times got tough in Salado, as happened in other communities, most of the black families moved off to the cities or other towns such as Taylorsville, where they sought better job opportunities and less discrimination. The South has a long memory, and the humiliation of the Civil War had yet to part itself from public consciousness, and Salado was no different.

Efforts to recognize and renovate the cemetery, which is still an ongoing process, did not get off the ground until the mid 80's when a group of Saladoans developed an interest in its history. The Salado Historical Society, through the efforts of Fred and Dale Springer and the late Thelma Fletcher, exhaustively researched the existing records, including deeds, diary entries and oral histories, and then submitted their findings to the Texas Historical Society. Work done by the Bell County Historical Commission also helped to bring attention to the cemetery. Finally, on May 5, 1991, the West Salado Cemetery was designated with an historical marker, which stands outside the cemetery to this day.

It is a testament to many things, among them a family's link with its past, and of the hard work done by a small group of Saladoans to bring an overlooked cemetery its rightful distinction.

But what it doesn't speak aloud is something that is heard only in the soul, how as generations pass and memories are buried like caskets, we, like magnets, are drawn to our history for the sake of our future.

## HISTORIC SALADO CEMETERY

Salado Cemetery is one of the oldest and most beautifully kept cemeteries in the Central Texas Area. It is located on the southeast edge of the Village of Salado on Baines Street between Royal Street and Holland Road. ( 1 )

The exact date of the beginning of the cemetery, known as "Old Salado Grave Yard", is unknown but historians believe it had its beginning around the time the first United States Post Office was opened in the settlement known as Salado Springs. ( 2 )

The oldest grave marked by a tombstone is that of Zilla Bush who died in 1856. However, older residents of Salado recall seeing older gravestones when they, as children, visited the cemetery. One resident reported that she had noted a burial which took place in 1854 and was told there were older graves. The stone placed in 1854 disappeared a few years ago and was most likely taken as a prank. There were "ghost stories" and legends circulated among residents of Central Texas regarding burials in the Salado Cemetery for generations. Visitors have always been drawn here and the cemetery has become a tourist attraction because of its history. ( 3 )

A number of prominent pioneers who led in the settlement and development of Salado and Bell County are buried in the cemetery and this adds to the interest of visitors to Salado. It is a regular stop for tour buses and for groups of children from Bell County schools who are studying local and Texas history. ( 4 )

The land for the cemetery, referred to by historians and deed records as "Old Salado Grave Yard", was donated to the "People of the Town of Salado" by E.S.C. Robertson when the land for the town and for Salado College was donated in 1859-60. ( 5 )

Robertson had moved to Salado in 1854 and had purchased a large tract of land. It was on this tract of land that the town and the college came to be located. An old burial ground was located on Robertson's property and it was this piece of ground that was donated and referred to in deed records as the "Old Salado Grave Yard". (The exact date of this transaction is unknown but historians believe it was at the same time the land for the town and the college was donated.) The burial ground was located a short distance southeast of the college property.

The title to the property was not filed for record until 1888. ( 6 )

Old Salado Grave Yard held approximately 2880 burial sites. This is based on a study of the number of rows of graves and the number of graves in each row. A survey done in 1967 was able to locate only a small part of this number, as there is known to be many unmarked and "lost" graves in the cemetery. A view of the Old Salado Grave Yard, now known as the "Old Original" part of the cemetery, reveals large vacant areas among the old graves where these lost and unmarked graves are located. (7)

There have always been a few interested individuals who have labored to take care of the cemetery and to acquire additional land. Since the initial gift of the land where the old graveyard is located, there have been seven purchases and one gift of land for gravesites and the cemetery has continued in use providing for approximately 2100 additional burials. (8)

Monies generated by a permanent endowment fund provide for care and maintenance of the cemetery. The cemetery is community-owned and is governed by an Executive Board made up of members from Friends of Salado Cemetery, Inc. (9)

A Memorial Day Service is held at the cemetery on the last Monday in May each year. (10)
