Dear Dr. Miller:

Excuse from your
letter to E. P. Goldschmidt regarding
a copy of Carbon marked "sold"
in my last Cat., have been forwarded
to me for answer. I bid Thomas
Bair, in attendance on the P. Graupe
Sale, about \$250, as I recall, for this
copy & lost it to E. P. G. from whom
I later bought it for 400. As to
provenance I fear I can tell nothing.
The copy was, however, bound by
a certain V. Arian, a name perhaps
which can be traced, as the green
morocco-velvet & double paper
sum absolutely modern & the relief
must be living. The copy is complete
save for blank end-leaves (if
they exist in other copies). I have
compared my title with yours (as
reproduced by Moggs) & find no
variation except my lines in title
are regular in interspacing whereas
yours are markedly irregular.

(i.e. below woodcut ll-374 7-8.)

I think I have given you all
the clues as to origin of my copy
that I can discover. Draw your
own conclusions as to whether there
are 4 copies extant, but grant
me the favor of withdrawing
from a catalogue that you
propose to print any specific
argument based on the name
of the binder etc., merely as a matter
of prudence. I think personally that
this is a 4th copy - unearthed in
Spain, possibly - but the less we
discuss it the better from that particular
Group's Sale. The better - so I
learned this spring in Europe. The
point is this, it is rumored that
the former owner of these books,
now dead, is under some measure
of censure for having been caught
with the mass of books found
in his estate at Valencia, of number
& importance out of relation to the
modest salary he drew. As he
was a figure ^{on} of some international
commission I am urging you to

refrain from printing particulars
about this book, I am liable
to cause both of ^{us} annoyances
which we cannot force - but
can forestall.

I see no objection to the
following notation.

"A copy, possibly 4th, in full
green morocco is now in the library
of C.C.B.; bought in 1926 from
E. V. Goldschmidt. It lacks blanks:
gothings are complete; it ends on
fol. CXVIV verso - corrigenda. etc."
(without conjectures as to origin,
for reasons partly stated above)
I might dwell on, but let me say that
I am delighted to give you, for your
own pondering, any data I can
get hold of. John Rubink is
anxious to get a summary of
the printed contents of the volume,
as you probably know. I think
you must be solicited for bagging
