A Bektaşî¹ Rescues a Faithful Muslim
from Sin

It was the month of Ramazan,² and all devout Muslims were fasting. One especially faithful Muslim fasted during every day of the month except one, but he felt very guilty about that one day of delinquency. Wherever he went, he kept talking about this sin and expressing his regret for having committed it

A day or two after Ramazan had ended several men of that village were talking together in a coffeehouse. The conversation was pleasant and lighthearted until the group was joined by the man who had missed a day of fasting. He kept telling his sad account until those around him were tired of hearing about it.

¹A Bektaşî is a member of the order of dervishes founded in the 13th century by Hacı Bektaş Veli. They had considerable impact on both Islam and the Ottoman government. They were, nevertheless, among the dervish orders closed during the Kemalist reforms of the 1920s and 1930s. In Turkish folklore, however, they are represented as being irreverent scapegraces who outrage faithful Muslims. Many are the tales told about them.

²Ramazan (Ramadan in most countries) is the holy month of fasting in Islam, during which the faithful do not eat
