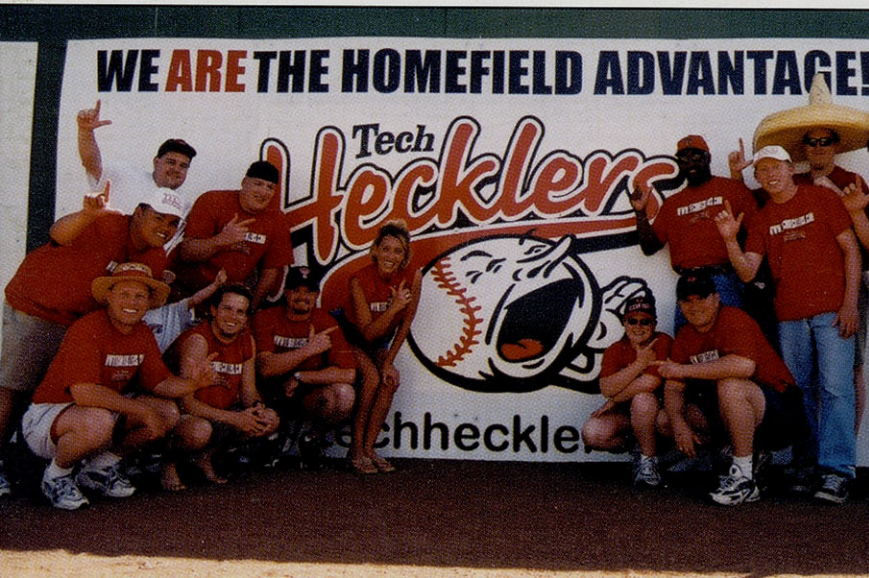

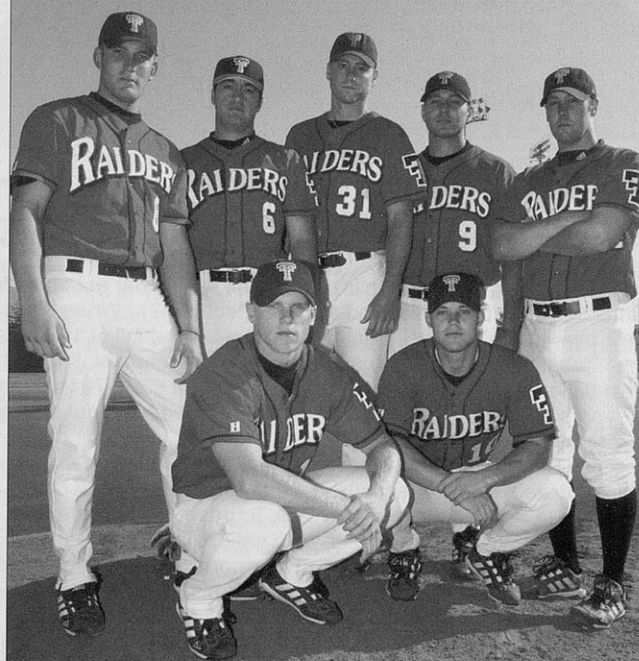

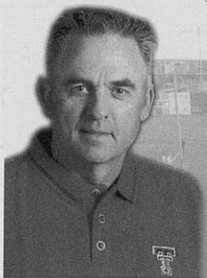

HEAD COACH LARRY HAYS



HEAD COACH LARRY HAYS #27

16th Season at Texas Tech
Eastern New Mexico '66

There is an old sports cliché that reads "Behind every great team is a great coach." When you take a glance through the history of Texas Tech baseball, you will find this overused cliché come to life in Texas Tech head coach Larry Hays.

Amazingly, Hays has spent his entire collegiate coaching career in Lubbock where he is the all-time win leader at Lubbock Christian University (695) and at Texas Tech (583). When Hays took over the Texas Tech baseball program in the fall of 1986, he inherited a very unusual situation. Prior to Hays arrival, the Tech baseball program had a losing overall record of 550-576 through 37 years of play meaning Hays had plenty of work cut out for him just to get Tech to the .500 mark.

Hays has led the Red Raiders to three conference championships, posted winning seasons in 14 of 15 years as head coach, led Tech to seven consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and has established Texas Tech as a national power in baseball.

Successful seasons have been the norm for Larry Hays, who won his 1,000th game on April 12, 1995. In his 31 years as a college head coach, he has produced 19 teams that have surpassed at least 40 wins. He has led teams to 12 league titles and guided his 1983 Lubbock Christian University team to the national NAIA championship.

Hays' players have also seen unbelievable individual success. He has coached 29 NAIA All-Americans, one NAIA Player of the Year, 36 All-Southwest Conference performers, 12 First Team All-Big 12 recipients, 13 consensus NCAA Division I All-Americans, five NAIA Academic All-Americans and three NCAA Academic All-Americans. To date, 69 of his former Red Raider players have been drafted by Major League Baseball while five of the six Texas Tech former players to appear in a big league uniform played for Hays.

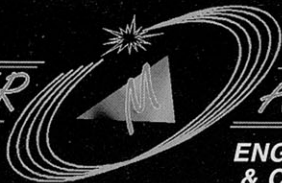
Texas Tech has played in the last seven (two SWC/five Big 12) conference tournaments, winning both the 1998 Big 12 Conference title and the 1995 Southwest Conference crown and placing runner-up in the inaugural 1997 Big 12 Conference tournament. Hays is currently ranked among the nation's top-10 all-time and active NCAA Division I head coaches in victories (1,278) and is the sixth winningest coach on the NCAA all-time list.

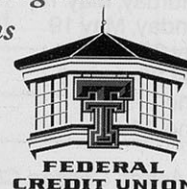

Greg Evans enters his eighth season as an assistant baseball coach at Texas Tech University. Evans, Texas Tech's first base and infield coach, has been primarily responsible for Texas Tech's improved fielding over the past years. Evans rejoined the Red Raider coaching staff in 1998 for the first time in two seasons after serving an assistant at Texas Tech from 1993-1995.

Under Evans' direction, Texas Tech had a fielding percentage of .971 in 1999 which was ranked in the nation's top five. In 2000, Evans guided the team to a .967 fielding percentage and in 2001 his team was the best in the Big 12 at .971.

A former collegiate baseball player at Ole Miss from 1981-85, Evans played second base, third base and in the outfield. He graduated from Ole Miss in 1985 with a Bachelor's degree in Public Administration and received his Master's degree in Sports Administration from Texas Tech in 1987.

Evans and his wife, Allyn, have a four-year old daughter named Kathryn Adele.

Entering his second season at Texas Tech is Ryan Brewer. Brewer serves the Red Raiders as the team pitching coach and was a former pitcher for the Texas Tech in 1995 and 1996.

Brewer came to Texas Tech following a career in minor league baseball in which he played in the Kansas City Royals organization. He spent two seasons on the Texas Tech pitching staff in 1995 and 1996. During his two year career at Tech, the Red Raiders went 100-29 overall and claimed the 1995 Southwest Conference Championship. During the 1996 season, Brewer recorded 10 wins on the mound while racking up a .769 winning percentage. Following the 1996 season, he was rewarded by the Southwest Conference as a second-team All-SWC selection.

Last season, Brewer directed the Tech pitching staff to a final 4.24 ERA and had two players finish with more than 11 wins (Chris Phillips - 11; Brandon Roberson - 13).

He is married to the former Lacy Nye who was a standout volleyball player at Texas Tech from 1993-1996. Lacy is a teacher/volleyball coach at Coronado High School. The couple has one son, Noah.

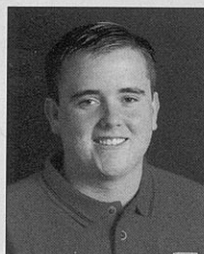

Daren Hays, entering his third season at Texas Tech, works directly with the Red Raider outfielders and hitters. Hays spent the 1991 season as an assistant baseball coach at Texas Tech where he served as hitting coach. He helped lead the Red Raiders to a 42-18 record in 1991 as Texas Tech led the Southwest Conference with a .303 team batting average.

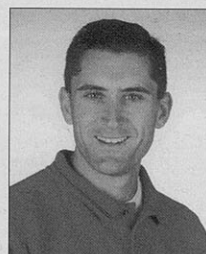
Hays spent the following eight seasons as head baseball coach at crosstown Lubbock Christian University where he amassed a 356-163 overall record. He became the first coach in LCU history to win 300 games in only seven seasons.

Since Hays, joined the Texas Tech staff, the Red Raider hitting attack has been nothing short of impressive. Last season, the Red Raiders hit .318 which was second-best in the Big 12.

Hays is married to the former Kristi McGee of Lubbock. The couple resides in Lubbock and have two daughters, Brittany and Brogan.

THE HOMEFIELD ADVANTAGE

The Infamous Tech Hecklers

The visitor's batters box at Dan Law Field can quickly become one of the most lonely and intimidating places in the entire world. In part because of the pressures that are placed on a collegiate athlete, in part because of the Tech pitcher who will be staring him down from the mound, but a large part of it comes from the people who are seated a few feet behind him. The group calls themselves the Tech Hecklers and they can generally make life a living nightmare for Red Raider opponents.

Like the Texas Tech baseball program, the hecklers have grown over the last decade to become a recognized force in college baseball. They evolved into a troop of unwavering delegates of Texas Tech that follow the team near and far and through the good times and the bad.

The origins of the Hecklers can be traced back to when a young Chris Snead brought a love and understanding of baseball as he first stepped onto the Texas Tech campus in 1987. His love for America's past time and school pride began to coincide when Snead first began to fire barrages of words and humor at the teams who came calling on Larry Hays' Red Raiders. When the Hecklers actually became an organization is somewhat hard to say, but Snead soon developed a following of his own. Witty baseball fans such as he soon began to join forces to provide visitors a new obstacle to playing at Dan Law Field.

As the program began to rise in prominence across the nation, so did the reputation of this motley crew of diehard Texas Tech fans.

"In 1995, I asked the guys if they wanted to get shirts and we got Conference Cafe to sponsor us and it just kind of evolved from there," said Snead.

Teams soon began to prepare for the Red Raiders in the stands as well as the Red Raiders on the field, prompting the Lubbock Avalanche Journal to



write "Some of the best pitches thrown at Texas Tech's opponents come from the stands."

However the Hecklers are very aware that baseball is a family environment and strive to handle themselves in a playful and classy way. Chris Snead laved down the 10 commandments of heckling in his book, "The Bleacher Bible." The book outlines the do's and don'ts that the Hecklers obey at all times.

The Bleacher Bible commands that the Hecklers steer away from profanity and mother jokes while remaining witty and intelligent.

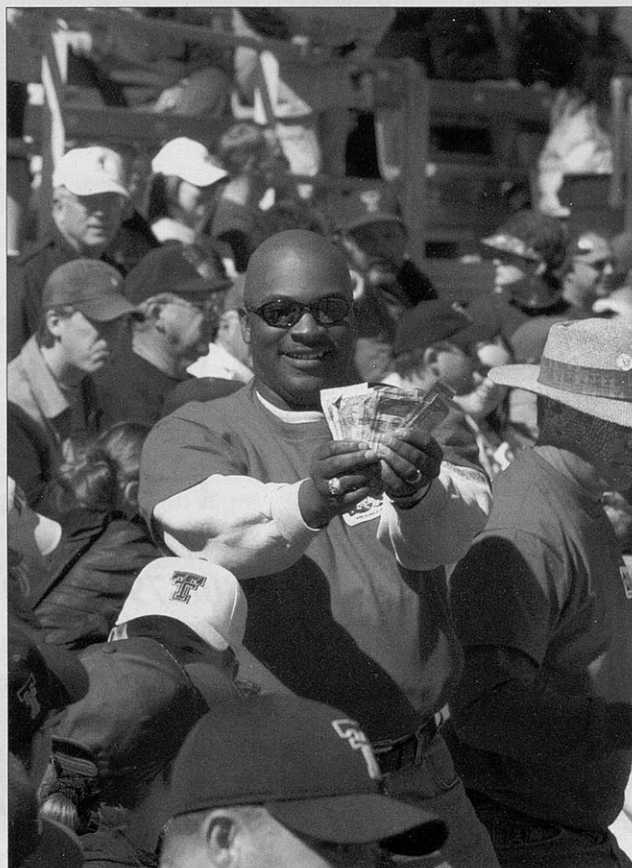
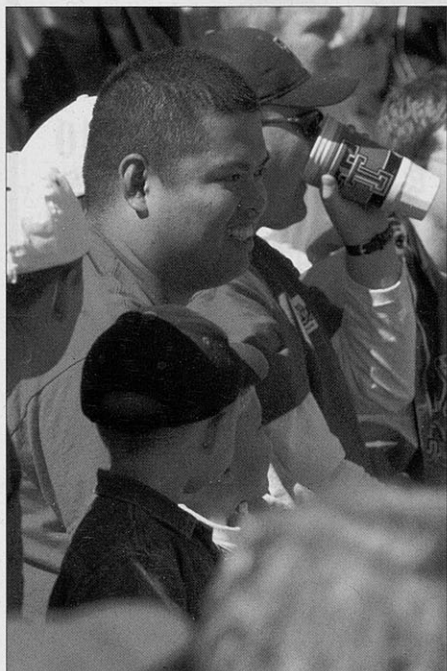
Opposing players have also singled out the group as being one of the best heckling groups in all of college baseball. When Nebraska pitcher Shane Komine was asked which group of fans were the best when the Huskers were on the road, he responded, "I always enjoy going down to Texas Tech because the 'Tech Hecklers' always put on a show. They take heckling to a new level and I really think they do a great job."

Snead and the Hecklers have received support from the community with donations allowing them to travel to Texas Tech's appearances in the NCAA tournament the last few years including last year's trip to Las Angeles. This year the Hecklers decided to become more of a booster organization for Tech baseball so in January they hosted the First Pitch

Luncheon in which with the help of Texas Tech basketball coach Bob Knight raised approximately \$13,000 for the program. With the funds from the luncheon, the Hecklers bought the team "throw back uniforms" that modeled the look from the 1926 season, purchased new speakers for Dan Law Field, and bought line-up boards for both the baseball and softball teams.

"We were fortunate to be able to raise a lot of money this year and help out the program and I hope that it becomes something we can do every year," said Snead.

So as you are taking in the next game at Dan Law Field, look to the section just about the opponents on deck circle, that is where you will see Texas Tech's home field advantage.

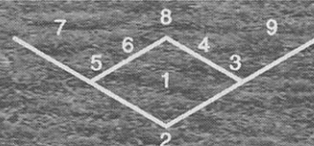

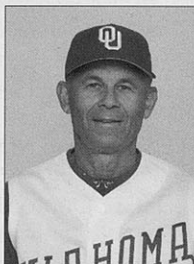

Oklahoma Closing In On 2000

In its 97th season of intercollegiate baseball, the University of Oklahoma has 1,968 all-time wins, which ranks No. 25 among all American colleges and universities. At start of the 2002 season, Fordham University led the way with 3,109 wins over 141 seasons and in the Big 12 Conference, only Texas (2nd overall, 2,617 wins), Texas A&M (1,981 wins) and Oklahoma State (1,986 wins) began the season with more all-time wins than the Sooners.

Arkison Out For Season With Injured Leg

Oklahoma Outfielder Matt Arkison will miss the remainder of the 2002 season after breaking his left fibula and his left ankle on a gruesome play against Baylor on Friday, March 29.

The junior from Broken Arrow, Okla., had season-ending injury on April 1. In his first at bat of the game, which Baylor won 5-4, Arkison smacked the ball into the right center field gap. As he rounded second base, he stopped abruptly and collapsed on an injured left leg. Arkison managed to crawl back to second base, and because the Baylor relay throw ended up in the Oklahoma dugout, pinch runner Greg Kish advanced to third and then home on the two-base error. Arkison was taken to Norman Regional Hospital from L. Dale Mitchell Park.

Sooners Hit the Books

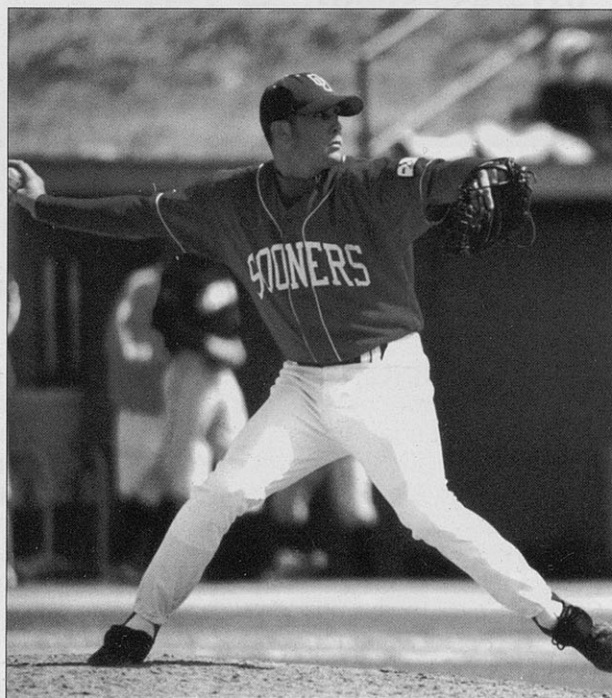
