AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 2:00 o'clock p.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 145 Present, 15 Absent-excused, 20 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

The Reverend Keith M. Bardin, St. Michael's Episcopal Church, Austin, Texas, offered the invocation as follows:

Almighty God, look with favor upon these Delegates of the Constitutional Convention gathered here in the public trust. Make them faithful stewards of this--their power and authority. Give them strength, courage, and the love of truth in these difficult deliberations. Grant us as a people such wisdom, intelligence, and conscience about our government; that the organizing principles of our life, in which we all share both power and responsibility, may issue in a just and durable society, in some fit proportion to the many blessings we've received at Thy hands. We ask this in God's name and continuing renewal. Amen.

ARTICLE IV ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention Article IV with an amendment as amended pending.

Question: Shall the amendment as amended be tabled?

On motion of Delegate Wyatt and by unanimous consent, the motion to table was withdrawn.

Question: Shall the amendment as amended be adopted?

Delegate Meier offered the following substitute for the amendment as amended to Article IV, Section 17:

Amend Article IV, Section 17, by striking the section and substituting the following:

Sec. 17. ADMINISTRATIVE REORGANIZATION. The governor shall submit to the legislature in sessions held in odd-numbered years a report on the organization and efficiency of the executive branch, and the governor shall within two years after the adoption of this constitution, and at other times may, submit to the legislature proposed reorganization bills reassigning functions among, consolidating, or abolishing any statutory state governmental agencies within the executive branch. A reorganization bill shall be considered by the legislature to which it is submitted, and as accepted, amended, or substituted, brought to a vote of each house. Nothing in this section shall prevent administrative reorganization by the normal legislative process.

The substitute for the amendment as amended was adopted by the following vote: 108 Yeas, 28 Nays, 3 Present-Not Voting, 41 Not Voting. (Record 2, Appendix)

Delegate Bales (present), who would vote "Nay", with Delegate McKinnon (absent), who would vote "Yea".

Delegate Hoestenbach (present), who would vote "Nay", with Delegate Schwartz (absent), who would vote "Yea".

The amendment as substituted was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Sutton explained Section 18 of Article IV.

(President in Chair)

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Mattox, Simmons, Waters, Hall of Harris, Ogg, Green of Navarro, Reyes and Leland who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

Delegate Bock offered the following amendment to Article IV, Section 18:

Amend Article IV, Section 18, to read as follows:

Section 18. Reprieves, Commutations and Pardons; Remissions of Fines and Forfeitures.

a. There is hereby created a Board of Pardons and Paroles, whose membership and terms of office shall be prescribed by law. An equal number of members of the Board shall be appointed by the Governor, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and the Presiding Justice of the Court of Criminal Appeals, respectively; the appointments of all members of the Board shall be made with the advice and consent of the Senate. Each vacancy shall be filled by the respective appointing officer that made the appointment to such position.

b. The Governor shall have exclusive power, on the written signed recommendation and advice of the Board of Pardons and Paroles, or a majority thereof, to grant pardons, reprieves, and commutations of punishment, to remit fines and forfeitures, and to revoke paroles and conditional pardons.

c. If the Court of Criminal Appeals is abolished, or merged into the Supreme Court

of Texas, by this constitution, or amendment thereto, the appointing power vested in the Presiding Justice of the Court of Criminal Appeals shall be vested in the Attorney General of Texas.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Sutton moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 33 Yeas, 112 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 34 Not Voting. (Record 3 Appendix)

Question: Shall the amendment be adopted?

Delegate Earle offered the following amendment to the amendment to Article IV, Section 18:

Amend the Bock amendment by striking the word "exclusive" in Subsection b.

The amendment to the amendment was read.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Bird and Doran who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" were announced "Present".

The amendment to the amendment was adopted by a non-record vote.

Question: Shall the amendment as amended be adopted?

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Hernandez and Sanchez who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" were announced "Present".

The amendment as amended was adopted by the following vote: 114 Yeas, 33 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 32 Not Voting. (Record 4, Appendix)

Delegate Cobb explained Sections 21 and 22. There were no amendments offered to Section 21 or Section 22.

Delegate Johnson explained Section 23. There were no amendments offered to Section 23.

Amend Article IV by striking Subsection (b) of Section 25.

Delegate Doggett offered the following amendment to Article IV, Section 26:

Amend Article IV by striking all of Section 26 thereof and renumbering the following section appropriately.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 66 Yeas, 94 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 19 Not Voting. (Record 6, Appendix)

Question: Shall the amendment be adopted?

The amendment was adopted by the following vote: 87 Yeas, 78 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 14 Not Voting. (Record 7, Appendix)

Delegate Meier explained Section 27. There were no amendments offered to Section 27.

Delegate Vick offered the following amendment to Article IV, Section 5:

Amend Section 5, Subsection (c), Article IV by striking the words "president pro tempore" and inserting the words "Speaker of the House of Representatives".

The amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Vick and by unanimous consent, the amendment was withdrawn.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Montoya who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Delegate Vick offered the following amendment to Article IV, Section 5:

Amend Section 5, Subsection (c), Article IV by striking the words "president pro tempore of the Senate" and inserting the words "Speaker of the House of Representatives".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Wyatt moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 69 Yeas, 85 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 25 Not Voting. (Record 8, Appendix)
