# Texas Aggie Coaches

Homer Norton, head football coach, at A&M, is entering his fourteenth year at the helm of Texas Aggie football teams. This is his twenty-eighth year in coaching with that tenure divided between Centenary and A&M.

At Aggieland his teams have won 79 games, lost 47 and tied eight to give him a winning percentage of .619.

Coach Norton attended Birmingham Southern College and won letters in football, baseball, basketball and track. He played professional baseball for four years but went on the voluntary retired list so that he might accept the head coach job at Centenary. His all-time football record shows 129 victories, 66 losses and 17 ties for a winning percentage of .664.

Bill James, line coach is known to all the Aggies as "Uncle Bill". He played with the Centre College "Praying Colonels" in his undergraduate days. He graduated from Centre in 1922. He coached at Texas University from 1925-33. He came to A&M in 1934.

He coaches at A&M only during football season and during spring training. He devotes the rest of his time to private business.

Barton (Botchey) Koch is assistant football coach. He graduated from Baylor University where he won

All-America honors in 1931. After graduation he played professional baseball for several years. He has held coaching posts at Baylor, George Washington and Tulsa University. He came to A&M in 1945.

Johnnie Frankie is assistant football coach. He joined the Aggie staff in 1945.

Frankie attended Rice Institute where he won letters in football, basketball and baseball. He formerly coached at San Jacinto and Milby High Schools in Houston.

Harry Stittler, backfield coach, came to Aggieland this year. A graduate of the class of '31 at A&M, Stittler enjoyed phenomenal success coaching Texas High School football teams.

His Corpus Christi team won three district and one state championship title under his tutelage. His Waco team shared the state title with Highland Park (Dallas) in 1945.

He served as assistant football coach at Rice Institute last year.

Charlie DeWare, head coach of the freshman football team won grid letters at A&M in 1934-35-36. He is the son of the late Charlie DeWare, famous Aggie end of more than a quarter century ago.

JOHN BALLENTINE, Yaleta, Blocking back and conversion specialist; He had an unbroken string of 13 conversions at the end of the 1946 season and kicked 15 of 16 attempted during the season. He also kicked two of three field goals attempted to score 21 points. Mechanical Engineering Major; Married; 1 son; 2 years of eligibility left. Letter in 1945 and 46.

BURL BATTY, Paris, Tailback; Led Aggie passers with 415 average in 1946 with 27 completions of 65 attempted. Physical Education Major; Married; Two years of eligibility left. Lettered in 1946.

JAMES (JIMMIE) CASHION, College Station, Tailback; Won most valuable player award in 1944. Is rated as smart signal caller and good passer. Born and raised on A&M campus. Physical education major; Single; Three years of eligibility left. Lettered in 1944.

RALPH DANIEL, Jefferson, Fullback. Carried ball 19 times for gain of 54 yards last year. Petroleum Engineering Major; Single; Two years of eligibility left. Lettered in 1946.

BOBBY DEW, Corsicana, Wingback. Punted 39.5 average on A team last year. Industrial Education Major; Single; Three years of eligibility left. Lettered in 1946

ED (DUKE) DUSEK, Temple, Fullback. Carried ball 32 times in 1946 for net gain of 85 yards. Wears contact eye glasses. Physical education major; Married; One child; One year of eligibility left. Lettered in 1942 and 1946.

HERBERT (HUB) ELLIS, Kilgore, Center. His return will bolster an Aggie weak spot. Business and Accounting Major; Single; Two years of eligibility left. Lettered in 1944 and 1945.

ROBERT (BOB) GARY, Dallas, Center. Aeronautical Engineering Major; Single; One year of eligibility left. Lettered in 1943, 1944 and 1946.

ROBERT (BOBBY) GOPF, Kenedy, Blocking back. Animal Husbandry Major; Married; No children; Three years of eligibility left. Lettered in 1944.

ROBERT (BOB) GOODE, Wingback. Physical Education Major; Single; Two years of eligibility left. Lettered in 1945-1946. Carried ball 33 times for 62 yards in 1946.

NORTON (COUNTRY) HIGGINS, Galveston, End. Caught three passes for 60 yards in 1946. Agricultural Engineering Major; Married; One year of eligibility left. Lettered in 1944, 1945 and 1946.

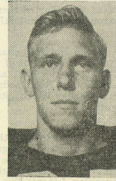

### 1947 FOOTBALL RULE CHANGES

New Rule Changes liberalizing substitutions seem to be the pattern for this football season. The NCAA fathers have decided to allow a college team to substitute one player while time is in. The ball must be dead (no scrimmage going on). This makes it possible to substitute one man without using those valuable time outs.

Many football fans will not like the new rule which makes a "shift play that simulates a regular play" illegal. Such plays will be ruled a false start.

On out of bounds plays, the ball will be put in play at a point exactly 17.8 yards from the sideline. The old rule required that the ball be put in play at a position 15 yards from the nearest sideline.

No more will players try to pick up the ball after the conversion try for extra point has been blocked. Henceforth on a try for point after a touchdown, (if a kick is attempted) and the kick is blocked or deflected the ball becomes dead.

In the future on disqualification fouls, the player will be removed from the game. The penalty will be changed from one half the distance to the goal to a mere fifteen yards.

After the ball has been kicked across the scrimmage line and before it has been touched by any player, penalties on all fouls except unnecessary roughness and illegal use of the hands will be inflicted at the point of the foul.

## LOSS OF FIFTEEN YARDS

18. Intentional grounding of forward pass.
19. Interference by member of passing team with defensive player for pass.
20. Interference with fair-catch or tackling player before ball is caught.
21. Illegal use of hands and arms by offensive players.
15. Team not ready to play at scheduled time.
14. Illegal return of suspended or disqualified player.
15. Failure to stop at least one second on shift play.

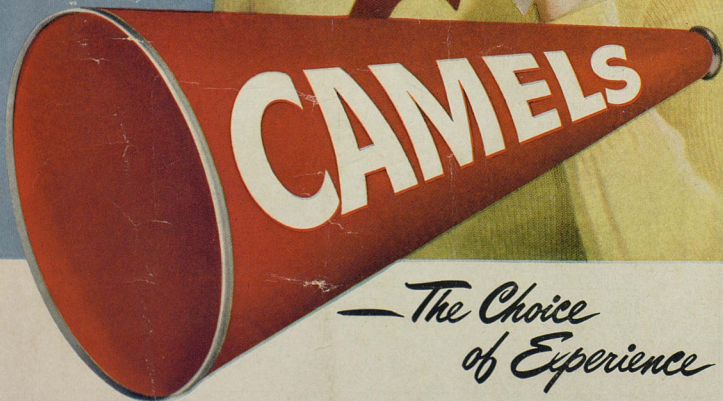
