AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 9:30 o'clock a.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 168 Present, 6 Absent-excused, 6 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

The Reverend Reginal King, Pastor, Tarrytown Baptist Church, Austin, Texas, offered the invocation as follows:

Lord, we address ourselves in an attitude of prayer this morning, to give thanks for the geographical blessings our state has that brings happiness to some eleven million people. The diversities of our climate, the variety of occupations, and the multitude of ethnic backgrounds we count as assets too. We are to consider ourselves among the most fortunate.

Our prayers this morning are not for the ills of the world nor for the less fortunate of our state. We bow together as men and women called to serve a state we love. Called by our constituents not because of the money we spend in publicity but because the people trust us to do what is right for our state, our cities, and our homes.

The august responsibility of voicing a single prayer in behalf of each delegate is a privilege, but the needs of each person remain unknown. Almighty God we are not presumptuous enough to claim the privilege of stealing each person's private moment of divine communication. We know you do not listen any more attentively to the amplified words prayed than the secret thoughts of each person present. Hear collectively the individual petitions that will be prayed during the next ten seconds of silence. Even though we are not touching each other physically, we are touched by your spirit which spans the spaces between each of us.

We conclude this sacred moment at the beginning of a busy day by saying thank you for hearing our prayers. In His name we pray. Amen.

ARTICLE VIII ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention as unfinished business Article VIII.

Question: Shall Article VIII be adopted?

Delegate Jones of Taylor moved to suspend all necessary rules and permit the consideration and adoption of separate or alternative submission issues to all articles on third reading by a majority vote and to defer all separate or alternative submission amendments offered from the floor until third reading.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Powers was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate McDonald of Dallas.

The motion was lost by the following vote: (Not receiving two-thirds vote of the members present) 88 Yeas, 75 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 15 Not Voting. (Record 2, Appendix)

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Allred who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Delegate Bales offered the following amendment to Article VIII, Section 6:

BE IT PROPOSED that the following be submitted as a separate proposal to the voters of Texas, which, if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question, shall amend Article VIII, Subsection 6(a) of the majority proposal by striking Subsection 6(a) and substituting the following in lieu, or, if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question and the constitution proposed by the majority is not adopted, shall amend Article VIII of the Constitution of 1876, as amended, by striking Section 7-a and substituting the following in lieu:

Sec. 6. ALLOCATIONS AND USES OF CERTAIN REVENUES. (a) Subject to legislative appropriation, allocation, and direction, all net revenues remaining after payment of all

refunds allowed by law and expenses of collection derived from motor vehicle registration fees, and all taxes, except gross production and ad valorem taxes, on motor fuels and lubricants used to propel motor vehicles over public roadways, shall be used for the sole purpose of acquiring rights-of-way, constructing, maintaining, and policing such public roadways, and for the administration of such laws as may be prescribed by the legislature pertaining to the supervision of traffic and safety on such roads; and for public transportation; and for the payment of the principal and interest on county and road district bonds or warrants voted or issued prior to January 2, 1939, and declared eligible prior to January 2, 1945, for payment out of the County and Road District Highway Fund under existing law; provided, however, that no less than one-fourth of such net revenue from the motor fuel tax shall be allocated to the Available School Fund; and provided, however, that the net revenue derived by counties from motor vehicle registration fees shall never be less than the maximum amounts allowed to be retained by each county and the percentage allowed to be retained by each county under the laws in effect on January 1, 1945. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as authorizing the pledging of the state's credit for any purpose.

The amendment was read.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegate Calhoun moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 115 Yeas, 50 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 14 Not Voting. (Record 3, Appendix)

REASON FOR VOTE

I voted against the Bales amendment, because I preferred the Sullivant amendment.

PENTONY

Delegate Sullivant offered the following amendment to Article VIII, Section 6:

Be it proposed that the following be submitted as a separate proposal to the voters of Texas, which, if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question, shall amend Article VIII, Section 6 of the majority proposal by adding a new paragraph or if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question and the Constitution proposed by the Constitutional Convention is not adopted, shall amend Article VIII of the Constitution of 1876, as amended, by adding a new paragraph thereto as follows:

That portion of the net revenues from all taxes on fuels and lubricants used to propel motor vehicles over public roadways, except gross production and ad valorem taxes, derived from any increase in the respective rates of these taxes over the rates in effect at the time of the adoption of this constitution shall be deposited as follows: one-fourth (1/4) to the Available School Fund and the balance to the General Revenue Fund to be allocated as provided by law.

Be it proposed that the following be submitted as a separate proposal to the voters of Texas, which, if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question, shall amend Article VIII, Section 6, of the majority proposal by adding a new paragraph or if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question and the Constitution proposed by the Constitutional Convention is not adopted, shall amend Article VIII of the Constitution of 1876, as amended, by adding a new paragraph thereto as follows:

That portion of the net revenues from all taxes on fuels and lubricants used to propel motor vehicles over public roadways, except gross production and ad valorem taxes, derived from any increase in the respective rates of these taxes over the rates in effect at the time of the adoption of this constitution shall be deposited as follows: one-fourth (1/4) to the Available School Fund and the balance to the Fund created for public roadways in Article VIII, Section 6(a), provided the legislature may by a two-thirds (2/3) vote allocate all or any

The substitute for the pending amendment failed of adoption by the following vote: 75 Yeas, 86 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 17 Not Voting. (Record 5, Appendix)

ARTICLE VIII ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the convention as unfinished business Article VIII.

Question: Shall Article VIII be adopted?

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Schieffer who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

Delegate Cooke offered the following amendment to Article VIII:

Be it proposed that the following be submitted as a separate proposal to Article VIII to read as follows and renumbering accordingly:

"The Legislature shall be prohibited from approving any act authorizing the levying of taxes on personal income."

The amendment was read.

Delegate Caldwell moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 78 Yeas, 74 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 27 Not Voting.

PAIRED VOTE

Delegate Simmons (present), who would vote "Nay", with Delegate Schwartz (absent), who would vote "Yea".

Delegate Hoestenbach requested a verification of Record 7. The verification was ordered and reflected the following: 75 Yeas, 70 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 33 Not Voting. (Record 7, Appendix)

Be it proposed that the following be submitted as a separate proposal to the voters of Texas, which, if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question, shall amend Article VIII, of the majority proposal by adding a new section or if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question and the Constitution proposed by the Constitutional Convention is not adopted, shall amend the Constitution of 1876, as amended, by adding a new paragraph thereto as follows:

Sec. _____. State Taxes on Income. No income tax may be levied or increased unless approved by two-thirds vote of the membership of each house of the legislature.

Delegate Finney offered the following amendment to Article VIII, Section 8:

Be it proposed that the following be submitted as a separate proposal to the voters of Texas, which, if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question, shall amend Article VIII, Section 8 of the majority proposal to read as follows or if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question and the Constitution proposed by the Constitutional Convention is not adopted, shall amend Article III, Section 49(a) of the Constitution of 1876, as amended, to read as follows:

Sec. 8. APPROPRIATIONS. (a) No money shall be drawn from the state treasury except in accordance with specific appropriation made by law. No appropriation of money from the state treasury shall be made unless authorized by preexisting law.

(b) No appropriation of money from the state treasury shall be made for a term longer than two years.

(c) No bill containing an appropriation may be considered as passed or be sent to the governor for consideration until and unless the Comptroller of Public Accounts certifies that the amount appropriated is within the estimated revenue for the applicable fiscal period.

(d) No appropriation in excess of the estimated revenue shall be valid unless it is made in response to imperative public necessity and approved by four-fifths vote of the membership of each house of the legislature.

(e) A report shall be prepared by the Comptroller of Public Accounts in advance of each regular session of the legislature and submitted to the governor and legislature upon its convening which shows the condition of the state treasury at the close of the last fiscal period and an estimate of the probable receipts and disbursements for the then current fiscal year. The report shall contain an itemized estimate of the anticipated revenue based on the laws then in effect that will be received by the state from all sources, showing the fund accounts to be credited during the succeeding biennium, and said report shall contain such other information as may be required by law. Supplemental statements shall be submitted at any special session of the legislature and at such other times as may be necessary to show probable changes.

(f) No bill shall be passed which would have the effect of increasing total revenue from state taxes to more than 6.75 percent of the estimated total personal income for the State unless by a two-thirds vote of the total membership of each House of the Legislature. For the purpose of this Section, "state taxes" means all receipts to the State government of Texas, except the following: intergovernmental transfers, including any funds received from other levels of government as reimbursements for performance of general governmental functions and specific services in lieu of taxes; all receipts from contributions required of employers (including the State of Texas) and employees for funds (and earnings on assets held by such funds) for retirement and social insurance purposes; all receipts required to become a part of the Permanent School Fund or the Permanent University Fund (and earnings

on assets held by such funds); user fees, including all receipts imposed, collected, or received where the fee is based on the receipt of a specific service or privilege or where the fee is collected to regulate a noncommercial or nonprofessional activity; and any taxes collected for, or on behalf of, a unit of local government.

Delegate Willis offered the following amendment to the amendment as amended to Article VIII, Section 8:

Amend Finney, Mengden, Blythe, Poff amendment by striking from Section 8(f) the numbers "6.75 percent" and inserting in lieu thereof "10 percent".

The amendment to the amendment as amended was read.

Delegate Finney moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 110 Yeas, 54 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 15 Not Voting. (Record 10, Appendix)

Section 8. APPROPRIATIONS. (a) No money shall be drawn from the state treasury except in accordance with specific appropriation made by law. No appropriation of money from the state treasury shall be made unless authorized by preexisting law.

(b) No appropriation of money from the state treasury shall be made for a term longer than two years.

(c) No bill containing an appropriation may be considered as passed or be sent to the governor for consideration until and unless the Comptroller of Public Accounts certifies that the amount appropriated is within the estimated revenue for the applicable fiscal period.

(d) No appropriation in excess of the estimated revenue shall be valid unless it is made in response to imperative public necessity and approved by four-fifths vote of

the membership of each house of the legislature.

(e) A report shall be prepared by the Comptroller of Public Accounts in advance of each regular session of the legislature and submitted to the governor and legislature upon its convening which shows the condition of the state treasury at the close of the last fiscal period and an estimate of the probable receipts and disbursements for the then current fiscal year. The report shall contain an itemized estimate of the anticipated revenue based on the laws then in effect that will be received by the state from all sources, showing the fund accounts to be credited during the succeeding biennium, and said report shall contain such other information as may be required by law. Supplemental statements shall be submitted at any special session of the legislature and at such other times as may be necessary to show probable changes.

(f) No bill shall be passed which would have the effect of increasing total revenue from state taxes to more than 7.25 percent of the estimated total personal income for the State unless by a two-thirds vote of the total membership of each House of the Legislature. For the purpose of this Section, "state taxes" means all receipts to the State government of Texas, except the following: intergovernmental transfers, including any funds received from other levels of government as reimbursements for performance of general governmental functions and specific services in lieu of taxes; all receipts from contributions required of employers (including the State of Texas) and employees for funds (and earning on assets held by such funds) for retirement and social insurance purposes; all receipts required to become a part of the Permanent School Fund or the Permanent University Fund (and earnings on assets held by such funds); user fees, including all receipts imposed, collected, or received where the fee is based on the receipt of a specific service or privilege or where the fee is collected to regulate a noncommercial or nonprofessional activity; and any taxes collected for, or on behalf of, a unit of local government.

Delegate Schwartz offered the following amendment to the amendment to Article VIII:

Amend the Denson amendment by adding the word "individual" between the words "on" and "income" in the proposal section title and adding the word "individuals" between the words "levied" and "or" in the body of the proposed section.

The amendment to the amendment was read and failed of adoption by a non-record vote.

Question again recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

The amendment by Delegate Denson failed of adoption by the following vote: 80 Yeas, 83 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 16 Not Voting.

Delegate Denson requested a verification of Record 17. The verification was ordered and reflected the following: 82 Nays.

By unanimous consent, the verification of the "Yeas" was dispensed with.

The President announced the vote as follows: 80 Yeas, 82 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 17 Not Voting. (Record 17, Appendix)

Delegate Donaldson offered the following amendment to Article VIII, Section 8:

BE IT PROPOSED that the following be submitted as a separate proposal to the

voters of Texas, which, if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question, shall amend Article VIII, Subsection 4(d) of the proposed constitution by striking Subsection 4(d) and substituting the following in lieu, or, if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question and the proposed constitution is not adopted, shall amend Article VIII of the Constitution of 1876, as amended, by striking Subsection 1-b(b) and substituting the following in lieu thereof:

The governing body of any political subdivision may exempt from ad valorem taxation \$3,000, or any larger amount as authorized by the legislature, of the assessed value of a residence homestead owned and occupied by persons 65 years of age or older. The governing body, on a petition signed by qualified voters equal in number to at least five percent of the voters registered in the political subdivision, shall call an election to determine by majority vote whether to grant, repeal, increase, or reduce such exemption. After the first petition, no such petition shall be effective if submitted less than 12 months from the date of a preceding valid petition.

Any contract with the State of Texas or any agency or political subdivision thereof, which collects or expends public funds, and any contracts among or between individuals, partnerships, corporations or associations employed by or doing business with the State of Texas, or any agency or political subdivision thereof, which requires or prescribes that employees or applicants for employment in order to seek, obtain or hold employment, in the State of Texas shall or shall not be or remain members of a labor union, or shall or shall not pay monies to a labor union, shall be null and void and against public policy; and no public funds shall be paid to any individual, partnership, corporation or association which is a party to any such contract.

The amendment was read.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Traeger was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Adams of Jasper.

Delegate Caldwell moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 93 Yeas, 68 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 18 Not Voting. (Record 21, Appendix)

REASONS FOR VOTE

I voted against the Scoggins amendment because I felt it was not voting on the Right To Work, and did not technically belong in the Finance Article. I intend to work for and vote for the Right To Work in the General Provisions Article where I feel it properly belongs.

KASTER

I voted no on the Scoggins amendment because it unduly hindered local government in providing the needed services. This was undue state control in local government operations.

GREEN OF HARRIS

I voted against Scoggins amendment

March 27, 1974

because this amendment would restrict the state's ability to take low bids on transportation and other important contracts. It would also interfere with the operation of local governments.

WHITMIRE

Delegate Doyle moved that the amendments to Article VIII be limited to those pending on the President's desk.

The motion was duly seconded.

The motion was lost by the following vote: 78 Yeas, 84 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 17 Not Voting. (Record 22, Appendix)

Question: Shall Article VIII be adopted?
