The law provides that promptly after such publication with the prescribed notice of copyright, there shall be deposited in the Copyright Office two complete copies* of the best



INSTRUCTIONS FOR SECURING COPYRIGHT AND REGISTRATION IN THE UNITED STATES UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 17 OF THE U. S. CODE

Copyright is a statutory grant of certain exclusive rights for 28 years in the works of authors, artists, composers, etc., and is obtained by complying with certain formalities. Provision is also made for renewing the copyright for an additional term of 28 years upon application being filed in the last year of the original term, thus affording a possible total of 56 years protection for the work. In the case of published works, the copyright term commences on the date of publication and in the case of unpublished works on the date of registration. The date of publication is defined in the copyright law as "the earliest date when copies of the first authorized edition were placed on sale, sold or publicly distributed."

The Copyright Office does not grant copyrights but merely registers claims to copyrights when there has been a compliance with the statutory requirements mentioned below.

Many types of works may be registered both as unpublished and published. In certain cases, namely, books, periodicals, newspapers, maps, and prints or pictorial illustrations, including commercial prints or labels, registration can be made only after actual publication. Upon completion of the registration a certificate is issued.

FOR WORKS REPRODUCED IN COPIES FOR SALE OR PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION

1. Publish the work with the notice of copyright. The notice of copyright shall consist either of the word "Copyright" or the abbreviation "Copr.," accompanied by the name of the copyright proprietor, and if the work be a printed literary, musical, or dramatic work, the notice shall include also the year in which the copyright was secured by publication. For example: "Copyright 1949 by John Doe." In the case, however, of copies of works specified in classes F to K, inclusive (see other side for list of classes), the notice may consist of the letter C enclosed within a circle, thus ©, accompanied by the initials, monogram, mark, or symbol of the copyright proprietor, provided that on some accessible portion of such copies or of the margin, back, permanent base, or pedestal, or of the substance on which such copies shall be mounted, his name shall appear.

The notice of copyright shall be applied, in the case of a book or other printed publication, upon its title page or the page immediately following, or if a periodical, either upon the title page, or upon the first page of text of each separate number or under the title heading, or if a musical work either upon its title page or the first page of music.

2. Promptly after publication, send to the Copyright Office two copies of the best edition of the work, with an application and fee for registration. In the case of contributions to periodicals, send one complete copy of the periodical containing the contribution with application and fee.

Note: If the work is one which is first published outside of the United States, request special instructions with respect to deposit and registration fee.

FOR WORKS NOT REPRODUCED IN COPIES FOR SALE OR PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION

Copyright also may be had of certain classes of works of which copies are not reproduced for sale or distribution, by depositing in the Copyright Office an application and fee for registration, and:

(1) In the case of lectures or other works prepared for oral delivery, or of dramatic or musical compositions, one complete manuscript or typewritten copy of the work.

- (2) In the case of photographs, one photographic print.
- (3) In the case of works of art (paintings, drawings, sculpture) models or designs for works of art, or drawings or plastic works of a scientific or technical character, one photograph or other identifying reproduction of the work.
- (4) In the case of motion-picture photoplays, a title and description with one print taken from each scene or act.
- (5) In the case of motion pictures other than photoplays, a title and description, with not less than two prints taken from different sections of a complete motion picture.

In case the works are later reproduced in copies for publication, the copyright law expressly requires that upon publication, two complete copies of the best edition shall be deposited. These should be accompanied by an application and fee for registration.

FEES

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SECURING REGISTRATION OF COPYRIGHT IN A PHOTOGRAPH

PUBLISHED PHOTOGRAPHS

Registration may be secured for a photograph after it has been published with notice of copyright, which must consist of the word "Copyright" or the abbreviation "Copr." or the symbol ©, accompanied in either case by the name of the copyright proprietor. The symbol © may be accompanied merely by the initials, monogram, mark, or symbol of the copyright proprietor, provided that on some accessible portion of the copies or of the margin, back, permanent base, or pedestal, or of the substance on which such copies shall be mounted, his name shall appear.

The "date of publication" in the case of a work of which copies are reproduced for sale or public distribution is defined in the copyright law as "the earliest date when copies of the first authorized edition were placed on sale, sold, or publicly distributed by the proprietor of the copyright or under his authority." The law provides that promptly after such publication with the prescribed notice of copyright, there shall be deposited in the Copyright Office two complete copies* of the best

edition thereof then published, which should be accompanied by application Form J and registration fee of \$4. In case the photograph is by a foreign author and published in a foreign country, one copy* is sufficient.

UNPUBLISHED PHOTOGRAPHS

Copyright may also be secured for an unpublisedh photograph by the deposit in the Copyright Office of a photographic print* accompanied by application Form J and the registration fee of \$4.

DURATION OF COPYRIGHT

The first term of copyright is 28 years, which is computed in the case of a work published in the first instance from the date of publication; and in the case of an unpublished work, from the date of registration. In the twenty-eighth year a renewal application (Form R furnished upon request) may be made to secure a second term of 28 years.

*For the purpose of identification, each photograph deposited in the Copyright Office should bear title which should correspond with the title given in the application for registration.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SECURING COPYRIGHT AND REGISTRATION IN THE UNITED STATES UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 17 OF THE U. S. CODE

Copyright is a statutory grant of certain exclusive rights for 28 years in the works of authors, artists, composers, etc., and is obtained by complying with certain formalities. Provision is also made for renewing the copyright for an additional term of 28 years upon application being filed in the last year of the original term, thus affording a possible total of 56 years protection for the work. In the case of published works, the copyright term commences on the date of publication and in the case of unpublished works on the date of registration. The date of publication is defined in the copyright law as "the earliest date when copies of the first authorized edition were placed on sale, sold or publicly distributed."

The Copyright Office does not grant copyrights but merely registers claims to copyrights when there has been a compliance with the statutory requirements mentioned below.

Many types of works may be registered both as unpublished and published. In certain cases, namely, books, periodicals, newspapers, maps, and prints or pictorial illustrations, including commercial prints or labels, registration can be made only after actual publication. Upon completion of the registration a certificate is issued.

FOR WORKS REPRODUCED IN COPIES FOR SALE OR PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION

1. Publish the work with the notice of copyright. The notice of copyright shall consist either of the word "Copyright" or the abbreviation "Copyright," accompanied by the name of the copyright proprietor, and if the work be a printed literary, musical, or dramatic work, the notice shall include also the year in which the copyright was secured by publication. For example: "Copyright 1949 by John Doe." In the case, however, of copies of works specified in classes F to K, inclusive (see other side for list of classes), the notice may consist of the letter C enclosed within a circle, thus ©, accompanied by the initials, monogram, mark, or symbol of the copyright proprietor, provided that on some accessible portion of such copies or of the margin, back, permanent base, or pedestal, or of the substance on which such copies shall be mounted, his name shall appear.

The notice of copyright shall be applied, in the case of a book or other printed publication, upon its title page or the page immediately following, or if a periodical, either upon the title page, or upon the first page of text of each separate number or under the title heading, or if a musical work either upon its title page or the first page of music.

2. Promptly after publication, send to the Copyright Office two copies of the best edition of the work, with an application and fee for registration. In the case of contributions to periodicals, send one complete copy of the periodical containing the contribution with application and fee.

Note: If the work is one which is first published outside the United States, request special instructions with respect to deposit and registration fee.

FOR WORKS NOT REPRODUCED IN COPIES FOR SALE OR PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION

Copyright also may be had of certain classes of works of which copies are not reproduced for sale or distribution, by depositing in the Copyright Office an application and fee for registration, and:

(1) In the case of lectures or other works prepared for oral delivery, or of dramatic or musical compositions, one complete manuscript or typewritten copy of the work.

- (2) In the case of photographs, one photographic print.
- (3) In the case of works of art (paintings, drawings, sculpture), models or designs for works of art, or drawings or plastic works of a scientific or technical character, one photograph or other identifying reproduction of the work.
- (4) In the case of motion-picture photoplays, a title and description with one print taken from each scene or act.
- (5) In the case of motion pictures other than photoplays, a title and description, with not less than two prints taken from different sections of a complete motion picture.

In case the works are later reproduced in copies for publication, the copyright law expressly requires that upon publication, two complete copies of the best edition shall be deposited. These should be accompanied by an application and fee for registration.

FEES

The statutory fee for registration of any work (except commercial prints or labels) is \$4.00, which includes a certificate of registration under seal. The fee for a commercial print or label is \$6.00. The fee for renewal copyright registrations for all classes of works is \$2.00.

All fees sent to the Copyright Office should be in the form of a money order, postal note, check, or bank draft, payable to the Register of Copyrights.

COPYRIGHT OFFICE APPLICATION FORMS
