Was at Battle of Perryville Ky - Shaw Hill Tenn. Black
Hops in Tenn about 15 miles of Murfreesboro, was at
the Murfreesboro fight but was not in it. I was
also in a number of raids. I was in Col.
Scott's Cavalry at Perryville Ky, and afterwards I
was with Genl. John H. Morgan's Command &
in all of the other fights as above stated. In
April 1863 I was sent to ^{Liberty} Ky with dispatches
from Genl. Morgan to several different parties,
which I was instructed to mail at Lebanon. After
mailing these dispatches at Lebanon I was
Captured, and ~~to~~ was taken finally to Camp Chase
where I remained for about 7 months. When I
took the oath of allegiance, I was sick and
would have died in prison, so I took the oath
to save my life. ^{several years} After getting ^{there} & regaining sufficient
strength, I went to Missouri to my mother's this in early
part 1864. From then on I acted on my own volition as a
spy for Price's army, furnishing news of the enemy's

movements, collecting and furnishing
Cattle for his Army, and acted in
that capacity up to the close of
the war in 1865, I now was
paroled. There is much I could
say about my movements in ~~Missouri~~^{Missouri}
after I reach that State, but as it
would fill a book & could not
be more conclusive of my fidelity
to the Confederate Cause, I will
~~not~~ do so.
