

- 1.) It is most important that the promotional copy stipulate that the check is not hidden on private property, and that no power tools are needed to find it. All other stipulations, as mentioned in the attached promos, are flexible. You do not necessarily have to say that is hidden "no higher than six feet off the ground," or "no deeper than three feet underground," or "within a ten mile radius," etc., etc. The numbers that you do choose, however, must be accurate. You may wish to use a 15 or 20 mile radius. Whatever reference is made to the check's location along these lines must be absolutely accurate. If we say that it's within a "ten mile radius", let's make damn sure (by measuring on the map) that it is a ten mile radius.
- 2.) Note that many of the clues are negative clues, others are meaningless, and others are really valid clues which require a great deal of thought and imagination on the part of the treasure hunter (and writer of clues). To make the contest more colorful and interesting, the clues should rime whenever possible. I have written some explanations to some old clues on the attached sheet to give you an idea of the type of clues I've just mentioned.
- 3.) Clues should be read and reviewed constantly.
- 4.) If your deadline for the expiration is midnight on a Saturday night (which would be an excellent time), your disc jockey on Saturday evening should go over all the clues one by one throughout the course of the evening and repeat them over and over again to generate last-minute excitement. I think you will be able to get by with three clues per day-one in the morning, one around noon, and one in the afternoon, but you may add more if you wish. Under no circumstances should your disc jockey say that the next clue "will be coming up at 4:00 o'clock this afternoon." He should say the next clue will be coming up "later" or "soon" or "within a matter of minutes", but by no means should he mention the exact time. The reason for that is obvious-you will invite your listeners to turn you off and return at four o'clock.
- 5.) This promotion should run for about ten days. If you do not have a winner by then, the use of specific clues will result with a winner in a matter of hours.



I have received a letter from the J. D. KILT is currently running a "Turtle Contest". All stations are hereby requested to follow suit running this contest as soon as you are able. It works this way:

1. Put some cute produced promos on the air announcing that your station wants to buy 50 turtles and that you will pay \$1.00 for each medium sized turtle that is brought to the station.

You will get the turtles in short orders since kids will be in every pond and lake catching them to make a few dollars. You then turn the turtles on their backs and put your call letters on their stomachs. Underneath the call letters you put a code number or series of letters to be determined by you which will tell you how much that turtle is worth. Make one turtle worth \$25.00, one \$10.00 and the rest from \$2.00 to \$5.00. You can vary these amounts within your budget.

- 2. In the wee small hours you and one of your assistants, preferably one with real executive know-how, take the turtles and distribute them in unlikely areas around your city....fields, lawns, backyards, front yards, and of course a few placed back in the lakes and ponds. After you have done this very quietly so nobody should know what's happening, you then follow the directions in paragraph 3.....
- 3. Since you have obtained your turtles by this time, you will have the promos taken off the air. Put new promos on the air explaining the "KILT Turtle-Hunt". Go ahead and tell the listeners that those turtles that they heard you talking about have now been released and on their undersides they contain your call letters and a call number.

The message, of course, is that people are urged to pick up every turtle that they see and if it has your call letters that they are to bring it to the station for cash redemption.

Nobody can do the twist forever, so we can expect it to last, at the latest, until the wee hours Sunday morning. We plan to charge fifty cents per couple for entering and ten cents for each spectator seat. We haven't decided on the prize. We'll have our judges on the floor to disqualify any couple which actually ceases doing the twist so we'll be able to have a genuine contest. Since the dance is so strenuous, when you consider the presence of the judges on the floor, the length of the contest becomes fairly predictable. I'd bet against anybody going more than 12 to 14 hours.

The promos can be built around: "1926 was the year when Fred Zilch danced the Charleston for 71 straight hours...and in 1927 Gora Walkins did the Black Bottom for 58 straight hours...now, 1962 is the year of the first twist marathon..."

In December, I put on two contests, one in Louisville and one in Pittsburgh. The one in Louisville drew 11,200 people and the one in Pittsburgh drew 14,000. As you can see, I am putting on a show in Miami Beach, co-sponsored by Station WFUN.

I feel that the Twist is very hot in your city and that one of these contests would draw a minimum of 12,000 people. I work with the stations as follows: The entire cost of this production is underwritten by me and would run approximately \$6,000.
