and no Dr. has ever relieved

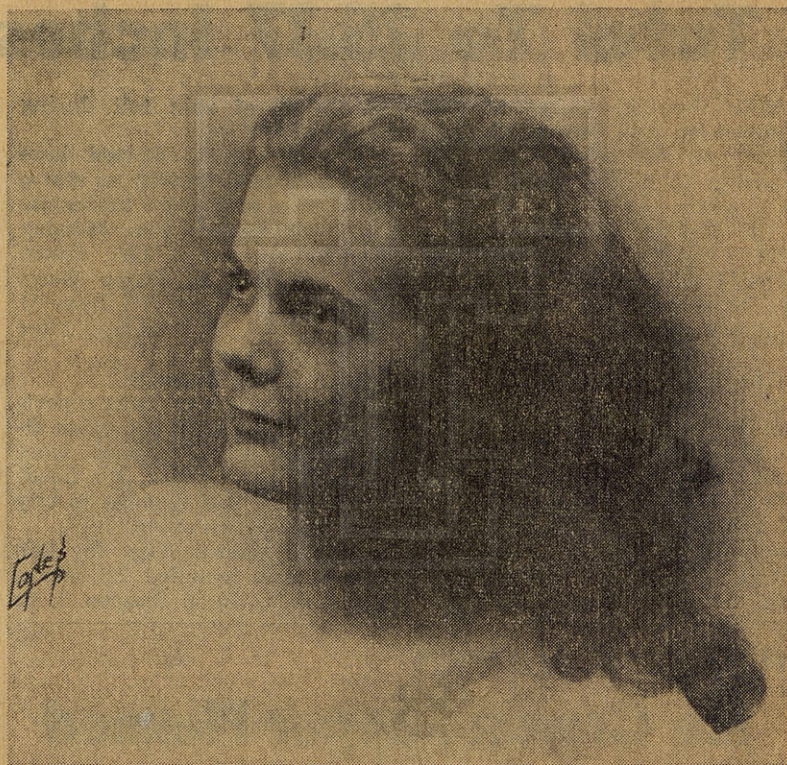


me. some days its so loud I

live with my children.

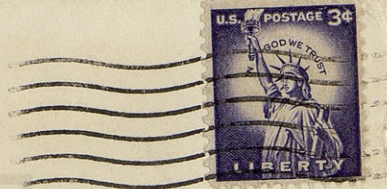
Well, this letter has grown rather
