

Monday 4th 5th P.M. April 22nd, 1844

Dearest Muggy,

I received your letter on Friday and forthwith proceeded in making arrangements necessary for your anticipated visit, on Saturday I was kept busy in making inquiries about the state of the weather as regards raining, but as good luck would have it, it was rather pleasant than otherwise. In the afternoon I went with Pop to the stage to meet you imagine my disappointment when I heard that Richard was ill, but I had one consolation that all is for the best as we have had very unpleasant weather particularly yesterday it drizzled all the morning and it would have been no pleasure for you in making so short a visit, however I shall expect you on Saturday and it will probably be much pleasanter the Peach and Cherry trees will be in full bloom you must take good care and nurse Richard well so he will be able to come tell him I think a journey to White Plains will make him feel better and I will do everything

in my power to make it pleasant for him till Pop
and Liz they must certainly come for I want to see
you very much write me and tell me whether to expect
you I will meet you at the village if Richard
cannot make it convenient to come on Saturday
