Washington County

Arkansas, USA Dec. 27, 1902

Wheeler County Texas, USA

William J. was born in Arkansas and moved with his family to Texas when he was 6 yo. They settled eventually in Burnet where many relatives and friends were living. He married an older woman, Dollie Vandeveer, and they moved to McCulloch Co. where they ranched and farmed. He was in a famous fight with Comanche Indians on the San Saba River in 1868 and barely survived, taking two years to mend. The Millers took their cattle to NM and sold them, then moved to Colorado. They then moved to Kansas, and finally to Wheeler County where he ranched until he passed away. He died from one of the arrowheads in

his lung from the 1868 fight. He was a lover of fine racing quarter horses and loved to go visit his son, Zack, who was Sheriff of Roger Mills Co., I.T. Oklahoma and other family members that were there.







Texas, USA

Dollie came to Texas as a child with her family and many other family and friends. They moved near her cousin, Logan Vandeveer, in Burnet Co. She married a younger man, William J. Miller, and moved to McCulloch Co. abt. 1859, where her first child was born. They raised cattle and farmed. W.J. was in a horrendous Indian fight on the San Saba River, which he barely survived, taking 2 years to recover but an arrowhead in his lung would eventually kill him. They took their cattle to N.M. and sold them, then moved to Colorado. They then moved to Dodge City. Later they moved to Wheeler Co., Texas, where their son, Zack, and daughter Lulu Miller Frye and her husband had been buying land and cattle - in business with Dollie and W.J. They raised the finest racing QH's, had a large cattle ranch in the panhandle. She outlived her husband by 16 years.


