

PEARCY · ROYAL STREET

sually, an album that's been in works for a few years has a sort of patchwork quilt effect, you can pretty much hear the seams between the tracks, but while she's been working on her second album since 2010, Pearcy has a fully realized album, in the truest sense of the word. Rather oddly, the Austin-based singer-songwriter went to Franklin and Nashville TN to record it, but, after a turbulent period of unemployment and couchsurfing, had to turn to Kickstarter to finance the mixing, mastering and production. If, like Ray Wylie Hubbard, you believe that the essence of songwriting is to tear strips off your soul, then Pearcy is your girl. Or, rather, your woman because I can't help feeling that she must be somewhat older than she looks, though a life of hard knocks, including being a young widow with a small child and a second marriage to an ex-con junkie may have fast tracked the maturity that underpins Royal Street. Her twelve songs, plus Jagger/Richards' No Expectations, are extraordinarily well crafted, each one, though they vary in tempo and style, is given its own individual setting and atmosphere, Pearcy modulating her expressive vocals to maximize the effect of her poetic lyrics and evocative melodies. There's a lot of sadness and loss in Pearcy's songs, but no lachrymose self-pity, rather a search for clarity and growth. You can play this over and over and still not plumb its depths.

STILL FIGHTING THE WAR

(Music Road ※※※※)

or the first few of the 13 tracks, you'll feel that Cleaves is in 'Very Serious' mode, opening with the title track, about an Iraq war veteran, then mourning a lost love (Without Her) and a devastated home town (Rust Belt Field, written with Rod Picott), followed by dashed dreams (Hometown USA), another lost love (Gone), another look at a lost America (Welding Burns, also cowritten with Picott) and a still raw breakup (I Bet She Does). However, he lightens up a bit with Whim Of Iron and then very much so with a potential crowdpleaser hit, at least locally hit, Texas Love Song ("For you I'd trade my truck in for a Lexus... I love you even more than I love Texas"). That anthem's closing yodel leads to a hommage to Don Walser, God's Own Yodeller, while Go For The Gold is a superb Louvin Brothers style country gospel pastiche, though Cleaves does close the album with intimations of mortality (Voices Of Midnight). The credits are a bit complicated, but the album features Scrappy Jud Newcomb, also the main producer, Jimmy LaFave, Lloyd Maines, Richard Bowden and Eliza Gilkyson. Guy Clark supposedly said that rather than writing twelve songs because it was time to make an album, he figured that when he'd written twelve songs, it was time to make an album, and this is fairly obviously Cleaves' philosophy, spacing his albums of original material out at four or five year intervals. I'm not sure when it happened, but it occurs to me that I no longer have to position Slaid Cleaves ("Austin singer-songwriter originally from Maine"), I can assume you all know who he is, and know that he makes albums that are worth your attention.

MELISSA GREENER · Transistor Corazon

(Anima ※※※※)

nless you were already aware of Melissa Greener as a singer-songwriter, were I to show you a picture of her, you would immediately peg her as Someone, even if you had no earthly idea in what field she might be a Someone. Her striking, if very unconventional, looks suggest a rising star in almost anything from Haute Couture to High Finance. Whether, with "no record label, no manager, no booking agent, no publicist," but a van load of gigs, she'd regard herself as a rising star in folk music, Greener is the epitome of the kind of artist people like me hear about from other musicians and, in particular, club bookers, rather than the media. For whatever it's worth, Greener has buzz, generated by a marvelous voice, exceptional lyrics, a subtle way of owning covers (Jonathan Byrd has surrendered his It Gets Harder To Leave Texas Every Time to her) and sensational flat-picking. Her third album is something of a departure from Dwelling (Anima, 2010), produced by John Jennings, the man behind Mary Chapin Carpenter's best albums, who was one of only three supporting musicians. This time the producer is Brad Jones, and there are 11 backing musicians. The title track was cowritten with David Rodriguez, whose Ballad Of The Snow Leopard & The Tanqueray Cowboy Greener covered on Dwelling, another cowrite was with BettySoo and there are covers of Jesse Winchester's That's What Makes You Strong and Lennon/McCartney's vacuous If I Fell, a showcase for Greener's guitar playing. I have to admit that I prefer the aesthetic of Dwelling, but then I'm the worst possible judge of these things, so this may well be Greener's breakout album.

YVETTE LANDRY · No Man's Land

(Soko ※※※※)

o, our Cajun Goddess, who wowed NotSXSW a couple of years ago, FAR reporter Obie Obermark (Texas Renegade Radio, KNON, Dallas) remarking "Yvette Landry is the most charismatic performer I've seen not named Willie Nelson," but couldn't make it for 2012, was supposed to be back with us this year. However she ran afoul of possibly the only bride in the entire US of A who only needed six weeks to plan a wedding that would tie up two members of her band for March 16th. However, I can console myself with her second album. Landry's stunning debut, Should Have Known (Soko, 2010), had a certain shock value as she was known as a sidewoman, playing bass with Bonsoir Catin, Lafayette Rhythm Devils, Balfa Toujours and other Cajun groups, rather than a country singer-songwriter, and anyway, who expects a killer honky tonk album to come out of Breaux Bridge, LA? No Man's Land, of course, can't be another came-outta-nowhere bombshell, but it'll still blow your doors off again, no second album slump here on 13 tracks that feature steel guitarist Richard Comeaux and Dirk Powell piano, with appearances by Cindy Cashdollar, Bill Kirchen, Joel Savoy, Lil Buck Sinegal, Betse Ellis, Geno Delafose and Tony Daigle among others. Ms Landry is, well I was going to tactfully say une femme d'un certain age, but as she fronted up the details for my B&D column, I assume she doesn't mind you knowing she'll turn 50 later this year. Maturity may be a career-killing liability in Nashville, but it's a valued asset, almost a requirement, here at 3CM Towers, and if she came to songwriting later than most, the payoff is that she's writing songs for and about grown ups, the way country used to be. On top of that, there's her seductive delivery, as Bill Bentley put it, "Yvette Landry has the kind of voice that can get grown men into trouble."

MITCH WEBB & THE SWINDLES Live At Roadhouse Rags

(Supreme Music Co *****)

or some reason, San Antonio and Austin might as well be in different states for all the interaction between them but The Control of the contr interaction between them, but The Swindles, which leader Mitch Webb describes as "slightly more progressive than garage rock," came to Roadhouse Rags a couple of years ago to play in its back yard. However, there's something in its back room that's rather unusual for a vintage clothes store,—a professional recording deck. After running the tapes through San Antonio's Studio M, Webb pronounced this his favorite of the five albums the band's released since 1997 and second live one. Actually, there's a certain amount of crossover with Last Band At Taco Land: Recorded Live At The House Of Ram (2008), as both of them include versions of Swindles' standards Ivory Joe Hunter & Clyde Otis' Ain't That Lovin' You, Bobby Fuller's Let Her Dance, Jim Stafford's Spiders & Snakes, Doug Sahm's Nuevo Laredo and guitarist Dave Wasson's Big Dave Shuffle, but the Roadhouse Rags set offers another 13 tracks on top of these, including Camper Van Beethoven's Good Guys & Bad Guys, Elvis' A Big Hunk Of Love, Freddy Fender's Before The Next Teardrop Falls, Buddy Holly's Not Fade Away, fellow San Antonio band Los #3 Dinners' Can't Stop Gotta Rock and Don Santiago Jimenez' Viva Seguin. This is a set list you won't find anywhere outside San Antonio, where loyalty to Doug Sahm's musical vision still runs strong, and nowhere stronger than wherever The Swindles are playing their asses off. Even if they didn't feature Webb's Sahm-esque originals and just played covers, any band that has such stellar players as Joe Reyes on guitar and Michael Guerra on accordion is well worth the price of admission.

AMELIA WHITE · Beautiful And Wild

(White Wolf ※※※)

Nashville singer-songwriter White has a thanks for "Gorgeous album art created by Kylie Harris," but it's exactly the kind of artwork that I, for one, look at and just don't want to have anything to do with it. Weirdly, this is not uncommon, which goes to show that even talented musicians can have fucking horrible taste in visuals. Once you get past the packaging, White's fifth album, the title track dedicated to her friend the late Duane Jarvis, reveals much better taste in music, with a rather trippy version of Brian Ferry's More Than This among ten originals, pared down from forty. Apparently the backing is by Nashville hotshots, whose names mean nothing to me apart from Tim Carroll, who have regular gigs with people like John Hiatt, Dylan, Lucinda Williams, Norah Jones and Patty Griffin, but drummer/producer Marco Giovino has a tendency to let them crowd White's thoughtful, complex lyrics (she gives special thanks to the ghosts that haunt her), which, though less weird, is also not uncommon. The one sheet expresses the hope that this "is sure to be declared one of the finest albums of 2012," but between Harris and Giovino, White's entry was severely handicapped.

CARRIE RODRIGUEZ · Give Me All You Got

(Ninth Street Opus ※※※※)

our albums and a compilation with Chip Taylor, an album of country duets with Ben Kyle and (now) five solo albums. Is that a discography, not even counting myriad studio credits, I might have guessed at 20 years ago when I saw a 12-year old playing fiddle at her father's Chicago House gigs? Of course not, you think I'm psychic? When Carrie Luz Rodriguez headed off to Oberlin Conservatory of Music, then Berklee College of Music, I think anyone would have assumed she'd have a career in classical music, but instead she wound up playing country fiddle, was 'discovered' by Taylor in 2001, started singing, first harmonies, then leads and, finally, began writing and co-writing songs. What might have become of her had Taylor not dropped by Cheapo Discs when Rodriguez was in a pick-up band playing an in-store we will, of course, never know, but 12 years later it seems they're still joined at the hip (as, come to think, I've been with the Rodriguez family for the last 20 years), at any rate, of the 10 songs (one track is an instrumental reprise), two were written by Chip and two by Chip & Carrie. Of the balance, two are by Carrie, one by Kyle and three by Carrie and her guitarist Luke Jacobs (I'm not sure why, but rhyming 'tragic' and 'magic' always annoys me like crazy), one of which they sing as a duet. What has changed most since Chip & Carrie's Let's Leave This Town (Texas Music Group, 2001) is Rodriguez's poise and self-assurance, her maturity as a songwriter and her confidence as a singer, Up to now, I would have recommended Live In Louisville (Luz, 2009), which captured her intense, passionate live show, but now she's shown that she can deliver at the same level in the studio. Incidentally, the Baltimore Lady referred to in Devil In Mind is a cocktail made JC of brandy, anisette and egg white.

SUZI RAGSDALE · Best Regards/Less Of The Same

(Stark Raven 2 CDs ※※※.5)

agsdale is one of many, many singer-songwriters of whom I'm marginally aware but offhand know next to thing about them or their music. However, Amanda Shires tells me she's "wonderful," and, friends, that's good enough for me and should be good enough for you too. So I don't really need to belatedly review her 2010 album, but what the hell, I have it right here, so let's take it for a spin. First off, I love her solution to a dilemma that's plagued musicians since CDs arrived, usually 'solved' by simply calling the first 20 minutes Side A, the next 20 Side B. Instead, she has two CDs, each with six tracks, because she and producer Tim Lauer decided the songs she wanted to cut fell into two categories, the first six (Best Regards) being a little more quirky and having full, lush string arrangements "that give them a kind of circus quality." The second half (Less Of The Same) leans more to rock & roll or pop with a full band in the studio and is about 50% rerecordings of earlier songs. Lauer, who also plays drums, percussion, bass and synth bass, electric guitar, Wurlitzer, Fender Rhodes piano, Hammond, pipe and combo organs, accordion and mellotron, also arranging the strings, winds and brass, has credits out the wazoo, some for albums by Nashville stars I won't embarrass him by mentioning, but this seems to be the first time anybody's given him the keys to the control room, and he provides Ragsdale with some striking arrangements, featuring Darrell Scott fretless banjo, mandolin and gut string guitar (Scott's Full Light is the only cover), Amanda Shires violin and Rodney Crowell "special guest vocalist," without ever distracting from her silky vocals. Ragsdale, incidentally, is Ray Stevens' daughter. JC

THE MERCY BROTHERS · Holy Ghost Power!

(Sockmo ※※※※)

ay Wylie Hubbard, who thought he'd come up with a winning combo, says of When She Sang Amazing Grace, "I came to find there wasn't much call for honky tonk gospel music." Perhaps he needed to come from Louisiana, where Kevin Sekhani vocals, Mark Meaux, a founding member of The Bluerunners, guitar (stunning) and Garland Theriot saloon piano are "tapping into the tradition of the struggle for the spirit that produced Jerry Lee Lewis and Jimmy Swaggart." In fact an alternative name for The Mercy Brothers might be Jerry Lee Swaggart, because they play gospel music you can dance to in a nightclub on a Saturday night or be saved by in a revival tent on Sunday morning. The Mercy Brothers are not about Born Again proselytizing Christian Music, well obviously not, or you wouldn't be reading about them in 3CM, but equally they're not at all ironic about gospel music, a fine line to be sure, but by getting it right, they've been tearing up Lafayette and New Orleans clubs and Festival Acadiens. The minimalist packaging doesn't tell you much about the musicians, like who plays the kazoo on the title track, but all 11 tracks are originals, almost all by Sekhani & Meaux. How much their concept has in the way of legs remains to be seen, but their debut will sit happily next to Fern Jones' The Glory Road (Dot, 1959/Numero Uno, 2005) or The Louvin Brothers' Satan Is Real (Capitol, 1959).



PHIL LEE · The Fall & Further Decline Of The Mighty King Of Love

(Palookaville ※※※※)

iven the task of casting the role of a singer-songwriter in a movie, I'd probably go Grown the task of casting the total of the same and the same as th I'd be torn between the gravitas of David Olnev and the surreal mojo of Phil Lee, "knifethrower, raconteur, rapscallion and bon vivant." Oddly, I wrote that before I noticed that Olney has a cameo as a "concerned funeral attendee" on Cold Ground. To paraphrase Kiss' Gene Simmons, the difference between Lee and most singer-songwriters is that the latter generally give you something that sort of sounds like the last album, but Lee gives you a show. A downside, in theory, is that his studio albums can come across as twodimensional, and a 'bonus track,' İt Can't Hurt, recorded live at New Orleans' The Red Dragon, rather highlights that live is very much Lee's home ground. However, he's such a remarkable songwriter that even in two-dimensions, this is still way better than most singer-songwriter projects. Of these 12 tracks plus a reprise, all produced by Lee's "friend, crony and enabler," the great Richard Bennett, who's produced a few albums in his time, including Lee's previous four, and seems to have a pretty good handle on the job, two are rare cowrites, the Soul style opening I Hated To See You Go, written with Barry Goldberg, the other, All You Need, with the late Duane Jarvis. With a songwriting palette that ranges from the beautifully simple love song I Like Everything to the intricate word play of the anti-love song Every Time ("Every time I see you nude, I want to give your number to another dude"), Phil Lee's fifth will, like his other albums, keep you entertained until his touring schedule brings him back to a venue near you.

GURF MORLIX Finds The Present Tense

(Rootball ※※※※)

orderline Personality Disorders are somewhat of a given in the music business, but, in my experience, sidemen tend to be relatively (and I stress relatively) normal, whereas singer-songwriters range from mildly eccentric to batshit crazy. Over the years, I've seen many, many sidemen try to make the transition to singer-songwriter, but they're almost always tapped out after one album because they don't have the gift that comes with an edge of dementia, they're not obsessed. Now I'm not saying Gurf Morlix is nuts, far from it, in his own way he's one of the sanest people I know, but even when he was simply a sideman, most notably for Blaze Foley and Lucinda Williams, the idiosyncratic name he's been going by since 1977 more than hints at a certain quirkiness. At any rate, after first establishing himself as an outstanding record producer, Morlix rather unexpectedly turned singer-songwriter with Toad of Titicaca (Catamount, 2000), but rather than flaming out, he's followed it up with five more, not counting an instrumental album and one of Foley songs, each one of them a tour de force, so much so that many admirers of his work may not even know or remember that he was once a hired gun. However, there is one abiding legacy of his sideman days, the fact he can play just about any stringed instrument, so his album credits tend to be rather terser than most, this time only featuring Ian McLagan, Nick Connolly or Patterson Barrett on B3, Gene Elders violin, Ray Bonneville harmonica, Eliza Gilkyson harmony vocals and 'the incomparable' Rick Richards drums. Unusually, the ten tracks include Morlix's first (recorded) cowrite, but his cohort is fellow Americana Gothic songwriter Grant Peeples. As I told the Austin Songwriters Group at their January symposium, someone like Gurf Morlix goes to the top of the pile because I do dearly love are the easiest guys to work with, which one do you think I'm going to book?" This has having a sure thing before I start kissing the frogs.

BETH LEE & THE BREAKUPS · One More Time Again (self 紫紫紫紫)

You can't, as the great poet Willie Dixon told us, judge a book by its cover, but I can't help feeling that Beth Lee was born to front a country rock band, she just looks the part. Of course, it really helps that she can actually deliver, as a singer and songwriter, A musician's daughter, Lee was raised in Houston's dive bars and honky-tonks, and her Austin-based band is mainly Houston transplants, including rockabilly guitarist Adam Burchfield, bassplayer Jessica Will and drummer Joel Duhon, and while they seem to play around town pretty good, they should have made more of a name for themselves because, thanks to Lee's ability to sing tender and vulnerable on one song, be country heartbroken on another and rock out on a third, they can come across like Wanda Jackson & The Party Timers or early Lucinda Williams on 13 songs, 12 by Lee, one by her father, Jimmy Dundon, all about relationships gone wrong. I never heard Lee's first album, Cassette Tapes And Cash Money (2008), which seems to have sunk without trace, but this, produced by Ron Flynt, who also plays B3, Wurlitzer and acoustic piano and sing harmonies on various

tracks, deserves a far better fate.

TOWNES VAN ZANDT · Sunshine Boy The Unheard Studio Sessions & Demos 1971-1972

(Omnivore double CD ※※※※)

onceivably, a day will come when Townesologists will announce to Zandtanistas world wide, "That's it. There's absolutely nothing left to be released, though we would like to depose Kevin and Harold Eggers' grandchildren under oath." That day is not today, it probably won't be tomorrow. At the time of his death, I had every album Van Zandt recorded in his lifetime, on LP or CD or both, but have made little effort to keep up with the posthumous releases, of which there are now at least 35, not including a few of very dubious provenance, As Van Zandt had, at the very most, no more than ten albums worth of original material, perhaps another four of songs he covered, almost everything that's appeared under his name since 1997 is entirely redundant, at best offering alternative, often rather dodgy, live versions. On Live At Union Chapel (Tomato, 2005), for instance, despite a great set list and better than usual sound, Van Zandt is quite clearly far from his best, you can hear for yourself what a toll exhaustion and alcoholism had taken on him by 1994. However, the fulfillment of a 17-year labor of love, a story I still hope to get from her, Omnivore's Cheryl Pawelski presents a mother lode of recordings from the early 70s, two hours worth, more than half produced by Cowboy Jack Clement at his Nashville studio, plus five studio tracks recorded in LA with no producer credit, eight solo demos recorded in NYC, again with no producer credit, which, thanks to Poppy Records' short but legally complex existence, have been "unheard since the engineer peeled off a little splicing tape to seal the box 40 years ago." The 28 tracks are an odd mixture of songs Van Zandt had already recorded on 60s Poppy LPs, such as Don't Take It Too Bad, Lungs. Where I Lead Me and Tower Song, alternative takes and solo demos of songs that would appear on later albums and some rather scrappy covers, of Jimmie Rodgers' T For Texas, Bo Diddley's Who Do You Love, the trail drive song Old Paint and two versions of Jagger/Richards' Dead Flowers. I have to admire Omnivore's tough mindedness in giving Colin Escott license to pointedly criticize Clement's misguided production values in the liner notes, "Clement seemed to think that Townes Van Zandt should be filed under baroque rock." Indeed Pawelski seems to endorse this view by noting in the track listing that Pancho & Lefty is "Alternate 1972 mix without strings and horns." While Clement's prettification makes Disc One (Studio Sessions) interesting rather than crucial, though it does include the title track, previously only released as the B-side of a 1972 Poppy single, Disc Two (Demos) is Townes Van Zandt solo and acoustic at the height of his powers, as a songwriter in his most prolific period, as a singer and as a guitar player, recorded while he was refining the songs on the classic albums High, Low And In Between (Poppy, 1971) and The Late Great Townes Van Zandt (Poppy, 1972) and honing the performing skills that would be so brilliantly displayed on Live At The Old Quarter. Houston (Tomato, 1977). Mickey Newbury said he brought Van Zandt to Clement, Clement claims he discovered Van Zandt himself in Houston, either way, this is a missing chapter in the bildungsroman of Van Zandt's career.

VA · The Bridge

(Welding Rod ※※※※)

efore I ever got myself into NotSXSW, a venue booker said to me, "You know, John, I don't understand musicians. If one band is a pain in the ass and another just as good been my touchstone for lo these many years—you give me attitude and I give you the elbow. However, even among the many artists who've been a pleasure to work with, Rod cott is outstanding and I can't help feeling that being such a great guy plays into the trength of the benefit CD he organized for Bridge Over Troubled Waters, the only shelter n Boston that serves troubled teens. I'm pretty sure Sam Baker, Slaid Cleaves, Amanda hires, Mary Gauthier, Greg Trooper, Stephen Simmons, Gurf Morlix, Antje Duvecot, Meg Iutchinson and Bob Delevante have more calls on their generosity than they can handle, out they all came through for Picott to create one of the best Various Artists albums I've eard in years. Though some of the song titles, such as Baker's Snow, may be familiar, all the racks are either alternative takes, live or unreleased, none are available elsewhere in these rersions. Thus Shires's What Happened Last Night and Morlix's Coming Back To Haunt Me re (somewaht inexplicably) outtakes, Cleaves' You're Not Missing Anything, cowritten with cott, is live from a KUT session, Picott's own Bluebonnet may or may not show up on is next album, Trooper's Land Of No Forgiveness was recorded for this project, Delevante's ome On Oscar is unreleased, Simmons' Emily's Eyes is an alternative take of a song that'll e on his next album, and so on. Brother Henry's Dig It strikes the only false note, but the other eleven tracks are primo.

JOHN THE REVEALATOR

Tet another clarification from Hank Alrich, this time about the use of songs in film and TV. "Yes, every use of audio synchronized to picture, and every use of the actual hit recording of a piece is subject to negotiation, and the pricing can be startlingly high. There is nothing in place that corresponds to the Compulsory License for Mechanical Reproduction."

Thinking about the coming "monogenre" (see editorial), it occurred to me that Waterloo Records has been ahead of the game on this one for many years. The record store has always shelved albums in a single A-Z, by

artist name, never by genre.

Came across a great quote while poking around savingcountrymusic.com, by the site's Webmaster, Dave Hampton. In a discussion of Sugarland's The Incredible Machine, which, rather embarrassingly for ink-stained wretches everywhere, went to #1 without getting a single positive review, Hampton remarked, "When a culture's music is lifeless, dull, pathetic crap, that culture is bound for more trouble than just having nothing decent to listen to on the radio."

I've mentioned before that of my Internet favorites, Juanita Jean, Steve Kornacki and Charles P Pierce, the latter is the only one who makes music references, such as quoting the lyrics of an obscure Little Feat album from 1972, and having Neil Young's Out On The Weekend as his Friday sign-off. Recently, Pierce has been running 'Your Daily Pope' features, of which one mentioned that Benedict XVI would be known as 'Roman pontifex emeritus,' to which Pierce responded, "I believe that was the track listing on Side Two of an album by Emerson, Lake & Palmer."

Not exactly sure who he had in mind, but Phil Lee, reminiscing about his days as a truck driver, told me "One difference is, after I had a publicity shot taken climbing into my rig, I drove 500 miles to deliver the load on the trailer."

Pretty amazing lineup for the Cowboy lack Clement **Tribute** at Nashville's War Memorial Auditorium on January 30th. Featured performers included Bobby Bare, Rodney Crowell, Emmylou Harris, John Prine, Mary Gauthier, Kris Kistofferson and John Hiatt among many others at a benefit for Music Health Alliance, launching the Cowboy Jack Clement Fund to help curb the cost of medical bills incurred by musicians not covered by insurance (Clement himself, now 81, is suffering from liver cancer). However, there were some slight oddities. I have no real problem with Connie Britton reading a letter of appreciation from Michelle Obama (an odd combo, but two women I admire), but video tributes from Bono, Bill Clinton, Taylor Swift and others? WTF? I have to wonder who got the job of explaining the significance of Cowboy Jack to Swift. Rolling Stone called her a "fan," which I find hard to believe.

apparently Sam Phillips was way ahead of me. According to Colin Escott, discussing Cowboy Jack Clement's tendency to prettify music, in the liner notes to Sunshine Boy (see reviews), when Phillips heard Clement's production of Johnny Cash's Ballad Of A Teenage Queen, his reaction was to shake his head and say, "Dear God, tell me it hasn't come

Last year, Tucson singer/songwriter Linda Chorney got a fair ration of shit for "gaming" the Grammy

nominations, not least from my esteemed colleague . William Michael Smith of the Houston Post. However, she did have a supporter in Louis Mayers, Director of the Folk Alliance, who told me "Linda did not deserve the harsh treatment she experienced from Americana." In an Internet posting about watching this year's Grammys on TV rather than being there in person as a nominee as she was last year, Chorney quoted this chilling missive from Mayers: "Hi Linda, don't know if you heard that they changed the rules on the Roots Category this year, but have not told anyone yet. This year, the first round voters will not determine the final five in each category. They will determine the top 15 and a committee will determine which records make it to the final five. I had lunch with a National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences director and he told me the story like everyone knew. He appeared quite surprised once he realized that they have never informed the Grammy members of this major change. So, the voting process now has zero integrity and all the praise the Neil (Portnow, Academy president) gave your efforts was complete BS. He made sure that you and every other regular hard-working artist will never have a chance to get in the final five again. Thought you should know. Best, Louis."

Chorney notes "I said to Louis that I was borderline paranoid that a force was out to get me. He actually told me that my hunch was right on. He told me when he announced support for my album last year, someone very high up in the Americana Music Association, on the committee, lobbied to dissuade him. Louis was removed from the committee this year. He told me he would not have gone along with putting the special committee in place for Roots.

Great comment about the Grammy's hugely OTT Levon Helm tribute. On Salon.com, Daniel D'Addario noted that Elton John, Mavis Staples and Mumford & Sons performed verse after verse of The Weight and asked "can they possible have added more verses?" One item on my overlong To Do list is to check out Alabama Shakes, but Brittany Howard's contribution to The Weight rather sapped

the urgency, such as it was.

If you're a Townes Van Zandt fan, you'll likely have seen both Heartworn Highways, directed by Jim Szalapski, and Be Here To Love Me, directed by Margaret Brown. If so, you will doubtless have noticed that an awful lot of footage from the former shows up in the latter. This, I imagine, we all attributed to the fact that Szalapski had something of an advantage over Brown in that he made his film in 1975/76, with Townes' active participation, whereas Brown made her documentary in 2004, long after Townes' death. However, I was rather shocked to learn from Heartworn Highways' producer Graham Leader, in a recent Q&A session on the internet, that the footage I thought I was kind of hard on record producers, but Brown used "far exceeded and abused the understanding we had with her. To add insult to injury, neither Jim nor Heartworn Highways were properly credited."

My interest in Stone Temple Pilots approaches zero, but I was sufficiently intrigued by the notion of a band firing its lead singer without telling him to link to an Internet feature, which contained one of the saddest lines I've ever read: "Weiland said he's focusing on his solo tour, which kicks off Friday in Flint, Mich." Does anything say 'loser' or 'has been' like "kicks off in Flint, Mich"?

I have to admire the restraint of whoever designed an Internet ad for "the original cast recording" of Les Miserables, "Featuring Patti Lupone & Colm Wilkinson." Maybe the reason I don't work in PR or advertising is that I would have added "You know, people who can actually fucking sing."

Though there's no byline, a cover story in The Onion, "Bob Dylan Lays Off 2,000 Workers From Songwriting Factory," was clearly written by someone who knows their Dylanology. In among the many song factory quips, my favorite bits were "the majority of workforce cuts were made in the vocals and timbre divisions which [a Watchtower spokesperson | claimed had been unprofitable for decades," and "the most drastic changes to the company's production model since it shuttered its underperforming Christian and gospel foundry in the mid-1980."


I missed out on the Amanda Fucking Palmer story-she raised \$1.2 million on Kickstarter, then advertised for musicians to play for free on her promotional tour for the album, but I love this wonderfully deadpan comment, by Joshua Clover on a New Yorker blog: "[Palmer] promised instead to 'feed you beer, hug/high-five you up and down, give you merch and thank you mightily.' This is a compensation package which, honestly, might be worse

than nothing. Depends on the beer."

+ REG PRESLEY

onsidering how untalented The Troggs were—even by British Invasion band standards, which is really saying something-Reg Presley, born Reginald Maurice Ball, June 12th, 1941, Andover, UK, managed to get his name into at least three rock history footnotes. One was as the lead singer on The Troggs' cover of Jordan Christopher & The Wild Ones' original version of Chip Taylor's Wild Thing, which reached #1 on the Billboard chart in 1966. Another was as writer of Love Is All Around, which did fairly well in 1967 but was a huge hit for Wet Wet Wet in 1994 (Presley used his royalties from that cover to fund his research into alien spacecraft, lost civilizations, alchemy, and crop circles and publish Wild Things They Don't Tell Us). However, he is perhaps most famous, if that's the word I want, for The Troggs Tapes, 12 minutes of the band arguing in the studio as they tried to articulate concepts that were far beyond their technical vocabulary or musical skills—"You gotta put a little bit of fucking fairy dust over the bastard." The tapes circulated widely on cassette among the British music community in the 70s, were included on The Rhino Brothers Present The World's Worst Records (Rhino, 1983), inspired a Saturday Night Live sketch, with "flogging" substituting for the dozens of uses of "fucking," inspired a scene in This Is Spinal Tap, and, of course, today can be freely heard on the Internet. There's a story about Bob Dylan, who'd heard the tapes, finding out that Presley was in an adjacent studio, so he and Ronnie Wood went next door where Presley was fumbling with a bass guitar. Dylan said, "Hey, I didn't know you played bass, man. How long you been playing bass?" Presley looked up and with a deep sigh said, "All fuckin' afternoon, mate, all fuckin' afternoon."

In Presley's honor, I will ask Chip Taylor to sprinkle a little bit of fucking fairy dust over his annual rendition of Wild Thing (G&S Lounge, Thursday 16th, 11.330-1pm).

MONOGENRE & MICROGENRE

ack in December, in a piece about *Billboard*'s new formulae, I enviously—"Damn, wish I'd thought of that one"—quoted Kyle Coroneos of *SavingCountryMusic.com*, "I have a theory all the genres of music are coagulating into one big monogenre." A couple of years ago, Coroneos expanded on that theory by offsetting the coming monogenre with the infinite number of "microgenres," true sonic variations on the twelve traditional musical divisions, most of which are in a death spiral.

You will surf in vain for a definition of microgenre but I take it to mean a conscious departure from an established genre by an artist or act pursuing a musical vision rather than sticking to a path that might lead to stardom. Which is not to say that microgenre acts can't generate viable audiences and be financially successful, but, major labels being pretty simple-minded, they're more likely to become cult figures than pop-culture famous.

While it's a new word in my vocabulary, 3CM's coverage is all about 'microgenres'. Except for historic reissues, I hardly ever review anything that could be simply described as country or rockabilly or anything else without serious qualifiers. This equally applies to the lineup for 3CM Presents at NotSXSW, in fact I can't imagine any of those acts would accept being labelled in traditional terms. The appeal of 'Americana' or 'Alt.country' is that nobody's ever known what they mean, which gives them a major advantage over musical labels that have devolved so much that their meaning largely depends on context. Two teenagers, one of whom is a 'country' fan, have more in common than two 'country' fans, one of whom is a teenager.

The problem with microgenres is calibration. I have a minor advantage in that almost everything I cover, singer-songwriters included, somehow relates to country, or, rather, 'Real Country,' a 3CM/FAR concept that we use to link contemporary stuff we like with the classic tradition, eliding the past few decades of Nashville crapola. As a result, I don't have to lash out too much with hyphens, or indulge in those horrible and worthless 'If Johnny Cash and Patti Smith had a baby' formulations. As I see it, my task, dubious as it may be, is to give some sense of what an artist or act brings to the table without getting bogged down inventing brand new, possibly misleading, pigeonholes.

The quintessential microgenre joke is "I've played before tens of people," and, while on one level I'm thinking "from your lips to God's ear," I feel Coroneos was being wildly optimistic when he said, "fans of the micro-genres will be less in numbers, but will continue to increase as popular music offers less variety." I'm also dubious about his contention that "Eventually recorded music will be seen as a promotional tool instead of a revenue generator, and will be completely free," I think it'll be longer than eventually before microgenre acts can write off the cost of making an album, or give up that often crucial revenue stream.

However the only way I disagree with "The microgenres will foster innovation and creative freedom, but will struggle for attention and resources" is the use of the future tense. This has been true at least as long as I've been writing about music, the interesting stuff has always been on the periphery, never in the mainstream. This is why I've never bothered getting on to any major label's mailing list, the chances I'll get anything worthwhile are so minimal, I'm willing to sacrifice selling all those promos. Actually, that's kind of dumb when I think about it, but then 3CM is sort of a microgenre itself.

NO STINKING BADGES RANDOM THOUGHTS ON NOTSXSW

ver since Baskery confirmed that they'd be coming to Austin this month and were up for playing 3CM Presents, I thought the March cover story was a lock. However, as is so often the way with recording projects, their new album hasn't been mixed yet and the release has been postponed. So, the new plan is for us to get together while they're in town and I'll run a cover story with an actual story attached as and when the album becomes available. But go see them any chance you get, they're still my 2013 stars.

Which leaves me with a hole where the cover story ought to be, so I'm going to ramble on a bit about NotSXSW, a term I use interchangeably for 3CM Presents and anything else going on to which I can more or less relate. One aspect that I rather half-heartedly started to research (a rather fancy word for going through old issues of Music City Texas), is the Origin Story. The earliest unofficial event I could trace was Jimmy Dale Gilmore's first all-star Saint Patrick's Day show in 1988, the year after SXSW was launched, and an early unsanctioned hotbed was Butch Hancock's Lubbock Or Leave It. However, a defining moment, as far as I'm concerned, was a long ago sign on the door of The Black Cat Lounge. Ricky Broussard & Two Hoots & A Holler were on that night and Paul Sessums had a \$3 cover—"\$6 with Conference pass," and if you don't think he enforced it on those too slow to hide their laminates, then you didn't know Paul Sessums.

Sessums was, rather flamboyantly, expressing a common cause for discontent among Austin venues. In its formative years, SXSW relied almost exclusively on Austin acts, but when it started to take off, local and house favorites, like Two Hoots & A Holler and Don Walser's Pure Texas Band, suddenly found themselves being rejected in favor of just about anybody whose area code wasn't 512. This is a true story: an Austin artist was turned down for an official SXSW showcase under his own name, but was accepted under a pseudonym with the exact same materials forwarded by friends in Lithuania.

However, it hasn't been just local acts given the cold shoulder. I wish I'd kept a running list of SXSW rejectees, but Fred Eaglesmith and Mary Gauthier may give you some idea of the kind of talent available to enterprising pirate operators. In fact, Gauthier ended up playing one of my shows, which illustrates the way NotSXSW has become a corrective balance to SXSW's flawed selection process, always notoriously weak in certain areas, such as real country and singer-songwriters, exacerbated by scheduling which one musician described to me as "your showcase is always wrong place, wrong time, wrong context."

Increasingly, over the years, it became apparent to many nationally known musicians that even if they had been given an official showcase, they might still be welcome at unofficial venues (and thus able to play more than once). That's if they even bothered applying for a showcase. SXSW's relationship with the fringe has had its ups and downs. Some years there was some heavy handed policing, which divided musicians into two camps, those who lived in fear of breaking SXSW's rules and those who didn't give a flying fuck about them. However, perhaps because of the festival's sheer size, in recent years the exclusion policy seems to be limited to 'you can't play anywhere unofficial after 7pm.' The only time, as far as I know, that there was a conflict between SXSW and 3CM Presents was when Dayna Kurtz was told she couldn't do both, but she decided she'd rather play my deal and told SXSW to stuff her official showcase (in the end, they let her do both).

Which segues neatly into the moveable feast—from Jovita's, Threadgill's World Headquarters and Opal Divine's Penn Field to The G&S Lounge—that is 3CM Presents. Let me make no bones about this, wherever I plant my flag, I drive there, park and most everybody I want to see comes to me. It's a beautiful thing. I'm not saying that publishing a music magazine for 24 years is the only way to make this happen, but it sure works for me.

Not having to run around Austin, even just South Austin, pays off more each year. The plain fact is that Austin is broken, a great place to live or visit as long as you don't have to go anywhere. According to Texas A&M's 2011 *Urban Mobility Report*, Austin is #3, behind LA and DC, for Worst Traffic in America, and that's normal—throw in an extra 250,000 people in town for SXSW and, well, good luck parking your rental. A few things for visitors to bear in mind: signs for Loop 1 and Loop 360 are utterly bogus, Austin has no loop roads; the rush hours are 6am-10am and 3pm-7pm, except that the Friday afternoon rush hour starts Thursday morning; Bergstom Airport is *not* on Airport Boulevard; any trip across town takes a minimum of two hours. Personally, I never cross the Colorado River if I can possibly avoid it, in fact if wasn't for Threadgill's, I'd never go north of Oltorf (which is kind of weird because in 1989 I had no reason whatsoever to go south of Oltorf).

This kind of a roundabout way of saying find a program you like and stick with it. Of course, I'm hoping it'll be 3CM Presents (you can walk from G&S to Amelia's).


