Dear Son

We are all about as you left us but your mother she is in a good deal of pain with her legs and feet and I am fearful she will have a bad time with them. She is not able to sit up all the time but I hope by ~~Thursday~~ she will be better. We will please for you as well as we can it is quite wet here at this time so wet I cannot do any thing on the farm. I will go to Mayville to day. I have nothing to write but wish you to know how your mother was.

Say to Robert Robb if he does not come down with you to send me one of Reading's Sermons if he has it as a gift. I have heard well that Stetson will give one or that Reading will be able to procure any such thing on Garland and I have hoped that it could be done and would be done. So if it can be I would like to see it but Garland has said only I will do it. I have nothing more to say Give my respects to your family on Tuesday at 4 P.M. in the Evening

Dear Sam

I recd yours of the 7<sup>th</sup> you say

I may come up on Monday for Mr. Elder. I am glad to hear we can get her. I will see on Monday if it does not rain before we leave and that time. Co. I will be very busy in case we get a good rain but if it would make any difference with her I will come on Monday.

I read Mr. Robt's letter in time. I will do all I can to reconcile the Whigs as it regards his position about a convention but I do not know I can satisfy Mr. Norwood nor James but I will do what I can. I will let you know by Monday mail if you do not come down as we will have our meeting on Friday and I explain to all his position as far as I can. If I was not so busy I would go to Fallsburg a Saturday. You see how true feeling is there. I have my doubts that the Whigs will not all vote for him. Norwood says he can prove by Cal Walker that Robt did say what he says he did but I have no doubt but Norwood is mistaken. Robt had better come down as soon as he can and try to satisfy all on the subject. I will do all I can but must in such a way as not to make Norwood mad. I have been over to West Union saw Mr. Callings and talked for the peasant and I will

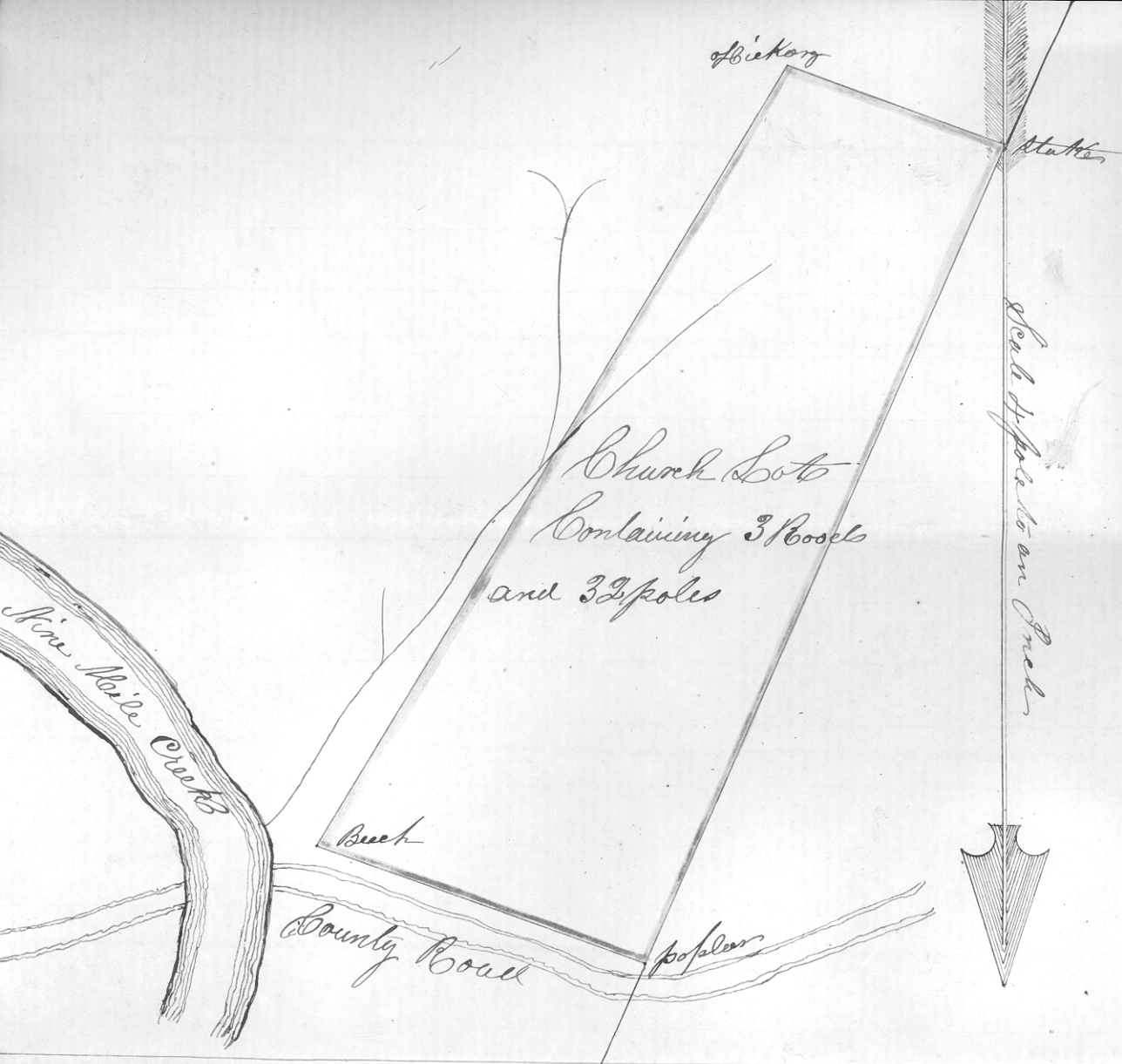

Sir. I presume it is known to you that I am a Candidate to represent this County in the next Legislature of Ky. and as I have been informed that my position in relation to the question of a convention to amend our state constitution has been variously and perhaps at some times incorrectly stated. I have deemed it prudent to state to you & through you to those of your neighbours who may feel themselves interested what my position is & also what it has heretofore been upon the subject. I was in Virginia when the question was first agitated upon my return and upon being spoken to upon the subject I stated that I should not vote for the Convention at the Election then ensuing but if at that Election there should be a majority of the people in favor of a convention I would then go for it also. I have upon all occasions when questioned as to how I would vote at the coming Election said that I would vote for calling a convention which position I assumed last fall. I will say in conclusion that I hope my position may be satisfactory to my friends but if any portion of the whigs of the County desire that I should not run and so express themselves I shall feel it my duty to decline notwithstanding I am now a candidate at the urgent request of many friends. but above all desire unanimity in the party and will always strive to secure it foregoing all personal considerations to obtain that object. I start in the morning to the upper end of the County and will be gone several days and perhaps will be in your next week or

the last of this. If I am to run the race  
I do not intend to spare any time

Memorandum of an agreement made this day between  
Saml D Ireland Hanse Ireland & William Parker  
witnesseth that they have agreed to form a firm or  
Copartnership under the name of Saml D Ireland & Co  
for the Transaction of Business and that the said  
Saml D Ireland and Hanse Ireland is to have the one  
half of said concern and Wm Parker the other half  
and that they are to be Equal partners in profit & loss  
in proportion to their Respective Interest in said firm  
and the said firm is to take what goods the said  
Parker may have as stock in trade at prime or neat  
cost and to pay William Parker at the Rate of two  
Hundred Dollars per Annum for the Rent of the  
Large Room now used as a store Room on front street  
and a 12 or 16 foot Room at the back end of the warehouse  
on the lower floor adjoining the store and to the first  
Summer or Length of Lince on the second story on front  
street from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March 1838 and the firm  
is to continue for the term of five years and if either  
of the partners should become Dissatisfied and wish  
to withdraw from the firm he is to give the other  
partner or partners of the firm the Refusal of his  
interest and that they are all to be Equal interest  
in the Expence of the said firm in proportion to  
their interest in it
