

Resolutions on the death of comrade J G Whiteett

Head Quarters R E Lee Camp Fort Worth Texas January 31 1915:

Thos J. Waben commander:

The undersigned committee come now with
of the death of
the sad intelligence/our late comrade J G Whiteett whose demise
occurred in this city January 21 1915 in the 83 year of his age.
He was born in North Carolina ^{April} in 1832 and soon after he with
the father and family moved to North Georgia when a child.
When the war arose the subject of this sketch early in 1861 enlisted
in in the 5th Georgia infantry C S A at Ederville Ga and was first
assigned to duty at Pensacola Florida and was later transferred to
Gen Jacksons staff of Georgia in which position he served quite a
while later becoming his quarter master general and continued in t
this position to the end of the war.

He was twice married first about the
1850 at Dalton Ga to Miss Sarah E Greene from which union a number
of children were born among whom was the well known citizen of this
city Dr L W Whitsett who was with him in his protracted illness in
his last moments tenderly caring for him. His first wife having died
in 1873 in 1876 he married Mrs Callaway of Cutbert Ga to which
Union was born one child now Mrs H W Thornton of Dallas Texas.

He was a devoted soldier to the South a kind and loving husband
an affectionate
