PROFILE



Marie Osmond A Household Word

"...(she is) a true communicator - an artist whose style and magic casts a spell upon her audience. She is truly a seasoned performer whose career began early only to transcend all showbusiness fad to bear the test of time."

So wrote a national columnist after viewing Miss Osmond in concert. And bear the test of time she has.

Her first walk-on television appearance occurred at the age of three when, on **The Andy Williams Show**, she sat on Andy's lap. Surrounded by her brothers, that brief video encounter spread into millions of American homes, and there she has remained.

At the age of thirteen, her first single, "Paper Roses," turned gold within a few short weeks after its release to establish Marie as a new recording star. One year later her birthday present was a nomination by the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences for "Best Female Country Vocal Performance" of the year, and a second nomination by the Academy as "Best Artist of 1973." Just barely into her 16th year, Marie found herself the youngest co-host of a national ABC Television prime-time comedy/variety series - **Donny & Marie**. After four very successful seasons with the show and a roster of awards, she joined the rest of her family members for another half season of **The Osmond Family Show**.

Marie's talent took on a myriad of variations and her career skyrocketed. In 1976 she was voted by the public as one of the "Top Three Favorite Female Musical Performers of the Year" before going on to capture the People's Choice Award two years in a row in the category of "Best TV Variety Show."

In 1978 she, with her brother Donny, starred in their first theatrical motion picture **Goin' Coconuts**, a comedy spoof staged in the Hawaiian Islands. A whole new world of dramatic acting was introduced to Marie at this time and the following

Christmas she appeared with Timothy Bottoms in the lead role of **The Gift Of Love** - now a seasonal classic portraying the deep love between a young man and woman whose commitment to each other prevails above the depths of their poverty.

Her name alone has long been a household word. Young women throughout the world have looked to her as a trendsetter and in one way or another have sought to associate themselves with her flair for style and fashion, her famous "Marie Cut" (which won her the "Best Coiffeured Woman in the United States" award five years in a row) or her philosophy and personal views on family and life. Deeply devoted to both, Marie places her priorities in three categories: family, religion and career. She feels if the first two are properly cared for, the third will fall into place. It has indeed.

Once asked what the greatest challenge had been in her professional/private life, Marie responded it was when she was asked to play the role of her mother in the television movie **Side By Side** - the story of the Osmond family. Here, she was expected to do a first-rate acting job with a character who had played the biggest role, and influenced her the most throughout her life. The result was a masterpiece in every way and without doubt, one of the greatest challenges she has encountered. The uncanny resemblance created by Marie and her co-star, Joseph Bottoms (who portrayed George Osmond) to that of George and Olive Osmond as a newly-married couple created further discussions of a possible sequel in which the Osmond story would be carried up to the present time.

Immediately following the production of **Side By Side**, Marie starred with Bruce Boxleitner in **I Married Wyatt Earp**, a two-hour true-life story of the famous western lawman and his wife Josephine Marcus.

Just prior to her most recent dramatic appearance on a two-hour **Love Boat** special, Marie studied in New York for two months with the late Lee Strasberg to sharpen her sense of timing and associated acting skills.

While nothing seems to be lacking with her ever-moving career, Marie's commitment to womanhood is likewise unquestionable. In 1980 she authored a book titled "Marie Osmond's Guide To Beauty, Health and Style" (Simon & Schuster) which provided readers her personal insight to these three elements she believes to be the success of any woman.

This project, and the many that have followed (including an exercise video tape for expectant mothers distributed by MGM/UA Home Entertainment and two exercise books) have sharpened her business skills and provided her with yet another vent for her high energy.

Still making exclusive guest appearances on television specials each year and traveling the concert circuit nationally and internationally six months out of the year, Marie finds time for her first love - wife and mother.

It is evident, in all that she does, at home or before the public eye, that as her star continues to rise and make its presence even more known, so will the artist behind it who displays so much of all the natural values, grace and style that add so beautifully to the powers of her talent.

The Judds

A Family Working Together

The Judds' star just keeps getting bigger and brighter. The mother and daughter duet was an immediate success - both a critic's favorite and a commercial sensation - as soon as their first "mini-LP" hit the street in '84. A platinum album and a slew of richly deserved awards followed the year after, and things have gotten even more spectacular ever since.

The year 1986 awarded them their second Grammy, CMA Award for Vocal Group of the Year, and **Billboard** ranked their **Rockin' With The Rhythm** LP as the year's Number One Country Album. In the International Country Music Awards for that same year, they were voted Most Popular International Duo and Most Promising International Act, and they received the Reader's Choice Award; at home, the Academy of Country Music chose them as its' Top Vocal Duet.

Behind all this praise was an astonishing career track record: two certified platinum albums, **Why Not Me** and **Rockin' With The Rhythm**, plus a "mini-LP", **The Judds-Wynonna And Naomi**, and eight Number One country singles. Not bad for an act which began singing professionally only three years ago.

Nineteen eighty-seven brings **Heartland**, The Judds' fourth RCA album. Once again, the project is overseen by Brent Maher who has produced all of The Judds' previous releases. The album covers a wide musical range from the Elvis classic, "Don't Be Cruel", to selections by such top Nashville writers as Don Schlitz, Troy Seals and Don Potter, as well as standards such as, "The Sweetest Gifts" and "Cow Cow Boogie".

Heartland continues the winning tradition that The Judds have established in three short years in the music business; it is a product of the same musical ideals which gained them immediate attention and respect in '84.

Naomi and Wynonna Judd burst upon the country music scene with some uniquely powerful assets. Their value was obvious - a beautiful mother and daughter act; but behind it was the kind of "bloody harmony" vocal quality which has always risen to the fore in country and pop music. The carter Family had it, as did the Louvin Brothers, the Delmores, the Stanleys, the Monroes and the Allmans; as do the Beach Boys and the Everly Brothers. It makes for a harmonic weave of intense power.

The music was, and is, unique. Though fully contemporary in material and technology, it has strong acoustic/traditional feel. That is no accident. Producer Brent Maher, bandleader/arranger Don Potter, and The Judds themselves

strive for, and achieve, a naturally rooted studio sound unblemished by pop-style excess. Nobody else sounds quite like The Judds.

Then there are the individual talents of Naomi and Wynonna. At the age of 19, daughter Wynonna's depth and control was astonishing when she first appeared in 1984; she was already sounding like a combination of the most soulful country-pop-blues singers you could care to mention (the critics chose Bonnie Raitt and the legendary Patsy Cline as the front runners). Now, with three years of top-flight stage and studio experience on top of that basic talent, her singing is even more powerful. **Country Music Magazine** calls it, "full, subtle, soulful....gorgeously worldly."

Wynonna functions as the "lead singer" of The Judds. Her mother Naomi sings high harmony in the weave and does it so well that her work has been compared favorably to that of Emmylou Harris, the acknowledged genius of country harmony vocals. Naomi is also a fully mature songwriter, though The Judds draw freely from Nashville's bottomless pool of songwriting talent.

Like her deeply gifted daughter, Naomi is a fascinating woman. Raised in Ashland, Kentucky, she has lived anything but the easy Southern-belle like her looks suggest. She married young, became a mother shortly thereafter, and then (like many others in the turbulent seventies) became a single mother all too soon. That is, a working single mother; Naomi supported Wynonna and her younger daughter, Ashley, through secretarial work and modeling in Los Angeles, then earned a Registered Nurse certificate and put it to good use in a succession of hospitals around the country before settling in Nashville. When her daughter finally talked her into helping her achieve a career in music (always Wynonna's burning ambition), she was, as usual, working two jobs to make ends meet.

Naomi confesses to a restless, daredevil streak ("Just you dare me to walk out on that ledge - then stand back!"), but also to a very strong, protective, mothering instinct. As one might expect, her position as 50/50 partner in the most successful family duet in recent musical history goes a long way towards satisfying both aspects of her personality. And this year she gets a bonus; her younger daughter, Ashley, ("who", says Naomi, "can't carry a tune in a bucket") will join her and Wynonna in an NBC-TV sitcom pilot that The Judds are to film in Los Angeles. The whole family will be working together.

Secrets, Fountains And Mountains

The other night, Eddie Beethoven and I were driving back from viewing the "concrete guitar" on North Quaker. We noticed the glow of the loop lights was strange and decided to **check it out**. As we got closer to town, the view seemed to be highlighting a couple of mountains. I thought out loud, "Hey, Lubbock is flat!" Eddie said, "It is, but Lubbock's got mountains too. That one to the southwest is called the 'Mountain of Complacency' - **the snow capped range of the unconcerned**. The one that's black on top is called the 'Mountain of Creative Legacy', **a volcano that erupts on weekends**."

We scaled the black-top one and decided to **shout** to see if we could make an echo. We could see skiers, but got no response. It appeared they'd forgotten Lubbock's other mountain was there; even though its shadow cooled the snowy slopes.

We came down from the black mountain bearing gifts and news: **the high plains is a meeting ground, not a battlefield**. Not so much a fantasy, these mountains are right here on the High Plains.

There have been many explanations as to the reason why Lubbock is a perennial **"Fountain of Creativity."** Some say it's the ancient water locked in limestone caverns near Muleshoe, infused with remnants of pleistocene mineral deposits and most probably the hair of the sabre-toothed cat. Others say UFO's visited us causing the **Lubbock Lights** in '51, possibly putting that "buzz" in those wondering Legends' shoes.

Stumbling seems to be my forte these days, and I again believe I've stumbled - onto the **secret of the "fountain."** You know - the water and lights are a myth, as is the idea "the poets of America died in the gutter in '68."

The reason Lubbock is the **cradle of self-expression** is because of the tattered, but incredibly durable, fabric of Lubbock people working together and helping each other up the mountains. A value-for-value relationship, once dormant, seems to show signs of erupting. Lay your ears to the ground, and you'll hear the rumble of musicians, sculptors, artists, writers, dancers, street poets, hot rod mechanics, horsemen and bikers. So that's why there's a fountain near Buddy Holly's statue; **the Secret to the Fountain is the Mountain**.

Look for my next issue. You're probably wondering about the "concrete guitar."
