**NATIONAL: Mike Scott, Houston (10-5, 2.76 ERA)** — Bats right, throws right. 6-3, 215. Scott throws two pitches and only two pitches, but he throws them exceptionally well. Scott has a rising fastball that routinely hits 90 miles per hour or more. He almost always throws it for strikes. It's complemented perfectly by a split-fingered fastball that plunges at the last minute, often out of the strike zone. As a result Scott has sometimes been accused of doctoring the ball to enhance the break.



**AMERICAN: Bret Saberhagen, Kansas City (15-3, 2.47 ERA)** — Bats right, throws right. 6-1, 165. 1985 Cy Young winner and World Series MVP. Slumped to 7-12 in injury-marred 1986 season. Got serious about his conditioning and weight-training during the winter and reported to spring training with a purpose. Has chance to be first 30-game winner since Detroit's Denny McLain in 1968. One of AL's few overpowering starters, using a live fastball and sharp slider.



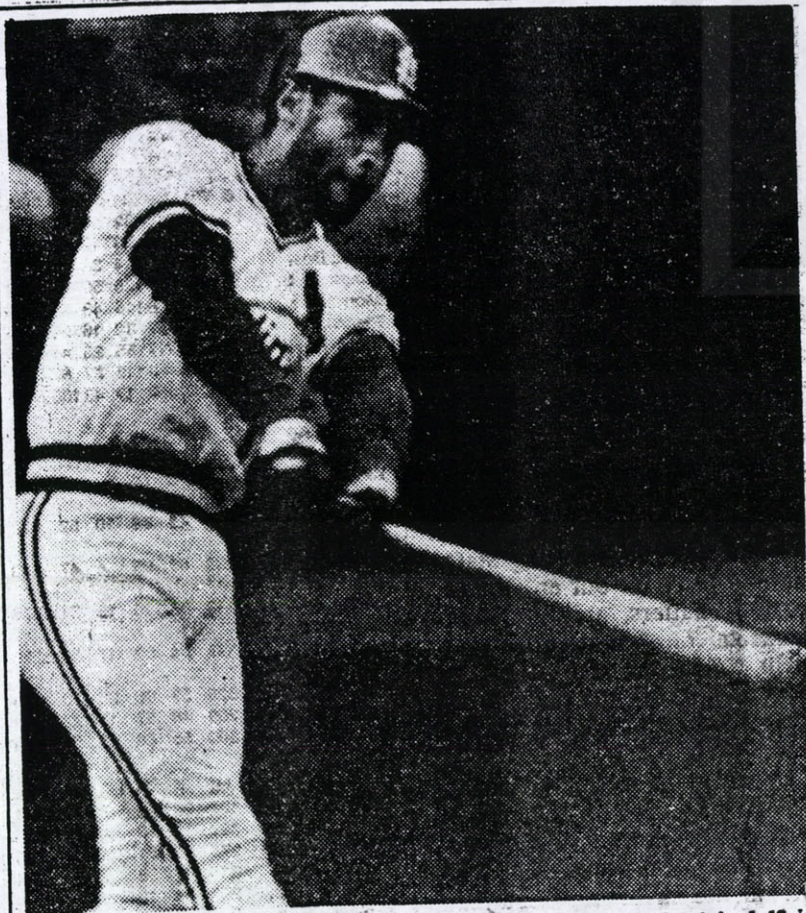
