Mrs McDougal is about the same. I hope you appreciate how I feel, I would do anything for you, would risk my life to see you any time but I believe you will understand that with so much sickness and some of it so serious, that a doctor sometimes has to "stay on the job." Do you understand, sweetheart?

Can't you come home Saturday or Sunday for a day or two so I can get to see you again soon? We had some rain last night but not very much and prospects are good for more.

Ella spent the night with Mrs Jarrold. Mrs Jarrold went to Ft Worth to see one of the boys before he left for New York. Mrs J said she & Ruth were going back to Ft by the first of the month. She asked about you and me but Ella did not tell her anything.
