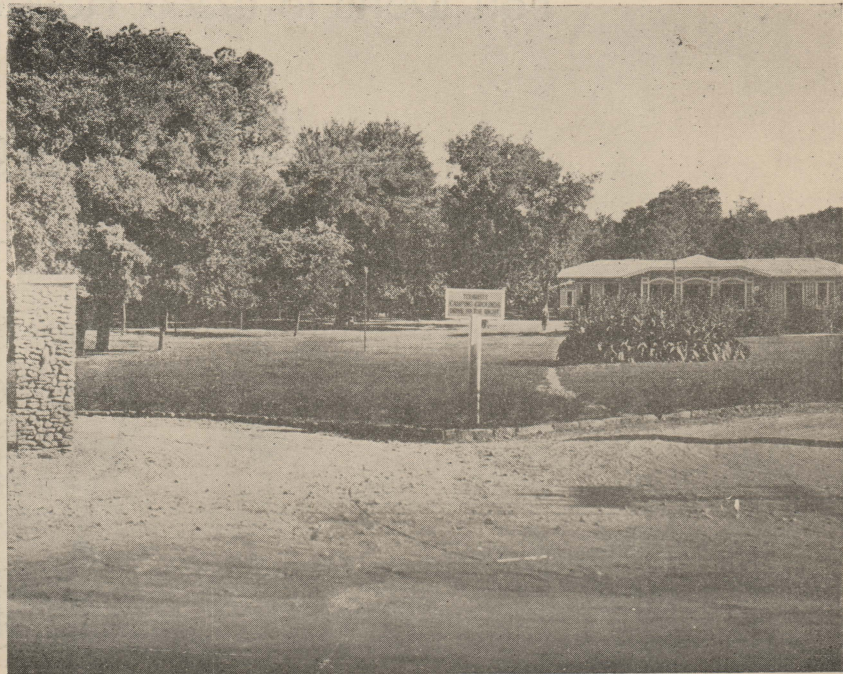
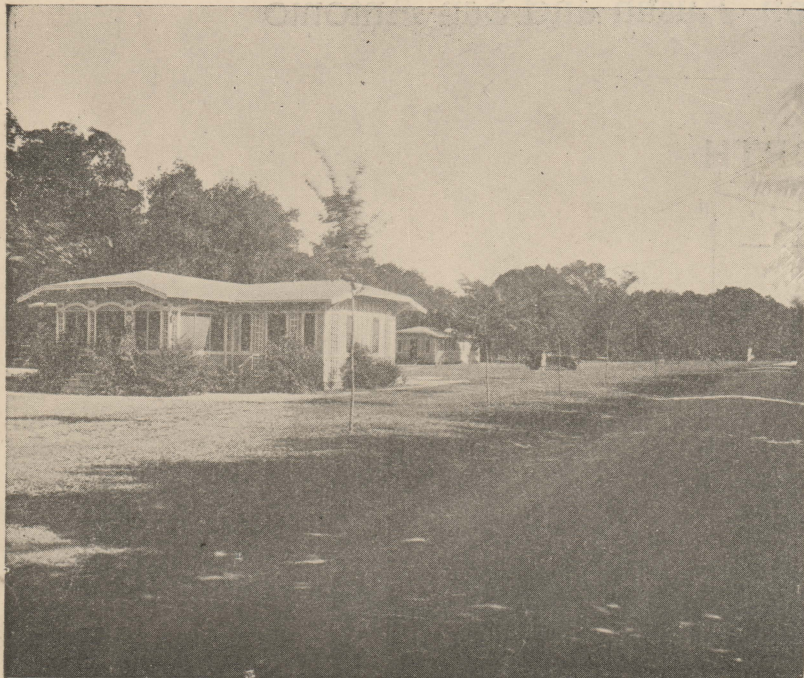


## Brief Facts About Fort Worth

- Altitude 670 feet.
- Area 39.82 square miles.
- Payroll \$2,000,000 per month.
- Nine garment factories.
- Largest furniture factory in the Southwest.
- Four cotton oil mills, with a capacity of 4,000,000 gallons per year.
- Five creameries, capacity 5,000,000 pounds of butter annually.
- Home of 5,700 railroad employees.
- Population (1926) 185,000. Has doubled within seven years.
- Nineteen railroad outlets offering daily package car service.
- More than 50% of all car lot freight entering Texas is consigned to or through Fort Worth.
- Value of manufactured products \$175,000,000 per annum, 424 establishments.
- Largest grain and cattle market in the South.
- Ten flour and feed mills, storage capacity grain 9,000,000 bushels.
- Center richest cotton-producing region in the world.
- Largest inland cotton market in Texas.
- Center of Mid-Continent oil fields, with 8 petroleum refineries.
- Public cold-storage capacity 1,000,000 cubic feet.
- Only iron and steel rolling mill in the Southwest.
- Largest municipally - owned reservoir west of the Mississippi.

## *Fort Worth to Waco Houston, Austin and San Antonio*

¶ To the left will be found several views of Fort Worth's tourist park, one of the best equipped tourist camps in the country. The building shown in the foreground is the shelter house, which is provided with telephone, writing tables, shower baths, toilets, etc.

¶ Ample shade, electric lights and night and day police protection makes camping here comfortable and safe. A number of small one-room houses have been built for those who desire more protection than is afforded by ordinary camping equipment.

### HOW TO GO TO PARK FROM CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

¶ Go west on 7th Street, which is the street in front of the building, one mile. Tourist Park will be found on left or south side of road about 200 yards west of concrete viaduct. There is a car line on 7th Street that passes by the entrance to the park, making it convenient for campers to get to the business section of the city, should they not care to drive.

¶ Visiting motorists may obtain without charge a privilege parking card at this bureau that will permit them to park in the downtown area as long as they may care to.

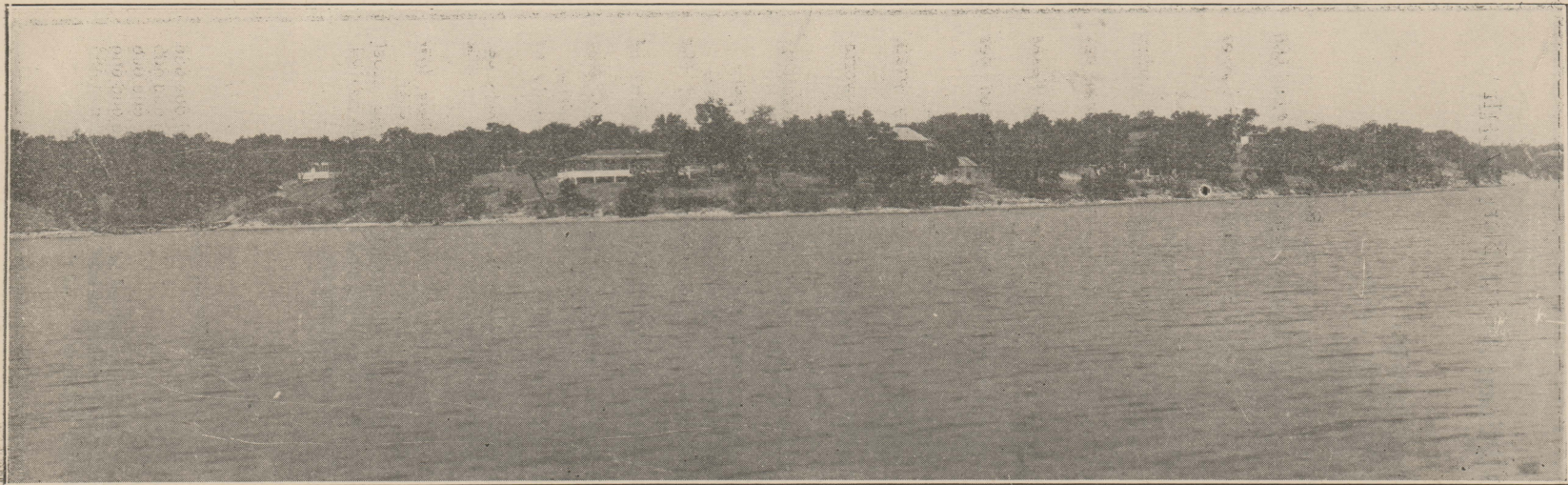
