## Distinctive Characters of this Species,

The familit has neither cheek-ponches use callofisies on the buttecks. The partition of his nofirit is thick, and their apertures are placed at a fide, not under the nofe. He may be faild to have no forchead. His hair is of a brilliant yellow colour; and he has two fleshcoloured rings round his eyes. His nofe is devated at the bole, and flattened at the point. The mouth is famil, the face is flat and naked, and the ears are granified with hair, and a link pointed. The tail is half prehending, and longer than the body. From the point of the muzzle to the origin of the tail, he exceed not ten or eleven inches in length. He flands with rade on his two hind legs; but he commonly walks on four.
