MINUTES OF

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

FEBRUARY 7, 1967

Lubbock, Texas February 7, 1967

M63. The Board of Directors of Texas Technological College met in a special session in the Colonial Room of The Driskill Hotel, Austin, Texas, on Tuesday, February 7, 1967, at 9:00 a.m. The following Directors were present: Chairman Furr, Vice Chairman Cash, Mr. Allen, Mr. Allison, Mr. Hinn, Mr. Martin, Mr. McLaughlin, Mr. Reistle and Dr. Tannery. In addition, President Murray, Executive Vice President Pearce, Vice President for Business Affairs Pennington, Vice President for Academic Affairs Kennedy, Vice President for Development Parsley, Executive Administrative Assistant to the President Baker, Comptroller Price, Director of Public Information Hamm, Executive Secretary of the Ex-Students Association James, and Secretary Wells were present. This special meeting replaced the regular meeting originally scheduled for Saturday, January 24, 1967.

M64. Chairman Furr presented and welcomed a new member of the Board of Directors Mr. Carl Ernest Reistle, Jr., Houston, Texas, who was appointed by Governor Connally on December 14, 1966, to replace Mr. R. Wright Armstrong whose resignation became effective May 31, 1966.

M65. Upon motion made by Mr. Cash, seconded by Dr. Tannery, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the Minutes of the meeting of December 14, 1966.

M66. Upon motion made by Mr. Allen, seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, the Board by a unanimous vote, ratified administrative action not previously submitted to the Board. (Section A, No. 206 through No. 326; Section B, No. 63 through No. 96; Section C, No. 234 through No. 378; Section D, No. 100 through No. 139; Section E, No. 226 through No. 370; Section F, No. 196 through No. 271; Section G, No. 288 through No. 463; and Section H, No. 120 through No. 248; and Attachments No. 1 through No. 56.)

M67. Upon motion made by Dr. Tannery, seconded by Mr. McIaughlin, the Board by a unanimous vote, approved the tentative small class report and authorized the Chairman to sign the final report and to file it with the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System. A copy of the final report will be incorporated in the Board Minutes of April 8, 1967.

M68. The Board received an informational report on the outside activities of the academic faculty for the 1966 fall semester.

M69. The Campus and Building Committee of the Board met on Monday, February 6, 1967, at 3:00 p.m., in the Colonial Room of The Driskill Hotel, Austin, Texas, to consider recommendations to be made to the Board on February 7, 1967. The next six (6) items (Nos. M70 through M75) record the official action of the Board on the various recommendations.

M70. Upon motion made by Mr. Allen, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board by a unanimous vote approved a contract award to the architectural firm of Page, Southerland and Page, Austin, Texas, for their services in selecting the equipment required to furnish the following areas in the new Business Administration Building and authorized the Chairman of the Board to sign the necessary contract documents.

- 1. <u>Included Areas</u>: Basement workroom; all areas of Dean's Complex and reading room; faculty snack bar and women's lounge, entrance lobby; all areas of Department Head's Complex; and all offices and conference rooms on third through twelfth floor.
- 2. <u>Included Items</u>: All loose furniture; draperies; carpets; desk and room accessories; and file cabinets listed in the program for above spaces.

M71. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Allen, the Board by a unanimous vote awarded contract to the following low bidders for the accessory mechanical and electrical equipment for the Central Heating and Cooling Plant as indicated below and authorized the Vice President for Business Affairs to take the necessary steps to purchase the equipment:

- 1. Central Plant Graphic Panel and Instrumentation, Orifices and Automatic Control Valves to Johnson Service Company, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, in the amount of \$85,578.00.
- 2. Water Treating Equipment to Anthony Company, Lubbock, Texas, in the amount of \$290,000.00.
- 3. Cooling Towers to Ceramic Cooling Tower Company, Fort Worth, Texas, in the amount of \$180,334.00.
- Centrifugal Pumps to Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing Company, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, in the amount of \$87,395.00.
- 5. Electrical Switchgear to Fields and Company, Lubbock, Texas, in the amount of \$87,960.00.
- 6. Desuperheaters to George W. Noyes and Associates, Houston, Texas, in the amount of \$19,160.00.
- 7. Air Compressors and Air Driers to Hatco Engineering, Inc., Dallas, Texas, in the amount of \$32,116.00.
- 8. Feed-Water Heater to Chicago Heater, Hempstead, New York, in the amount of \$24,154.00.
- Cast Steel Valves to Vinson Supply Company, Dallas, Texas, in the amount of \$59,808.13.

The purchase contract for the accessory mechanical and electrical equipment listed above will be assigned to the general contractor. A copy of the bids is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 64.

M72. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Dr. Tannery, the Board by a unanimous vote, designated the successful bidder for the mechanical and electrical work for the Central Heating and Cooling Plant as the prime contractor; authorized the Campus and Building Committee to receive bids for the mechanical and electrical work for the Central Heating and Cooling Plant and to recommend a contract award to the Board; authorized the Vice President for Business Affairs to poll the entire Board by telephone after the bids have been tabulated; and authorized the Chairman to sign the contract and all other documents necessary to complete contract award.

M73. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Dr. Tannery, the Board by a unanimous vote, authorized the Campus Planning Committee and the Campus and Building Committee of the Board to approve the final working drawings for the Central Heating and Cooling Plant, to receive bids for the general construction work and to recommend a contract award to the Board; authorized the Vice President for Business Affairs to poll the entire Board by telephone; and authorized the Chairman to execute the contract and all other documents necessary to complete the contract award.

M74. The Vice President for Business Affairs presented an informational report on the estimated funds available for the present and the projected building program. A copy of the report is on file in the Office of the Secretary of the Board.

M75. Mr. Hinn reported that the architects are not ready to make the requested presentation of the restudied project for the Museum. He emphasized the desirability of programming the entire project before attempting to locate a certain building.

M76. Upon motion made by Mr. Martin, seconded by Dr. Tannery, the Board by a unanimous vote, approved the 1967 Summer School Budget in the amount of \$673,447.00 for Teaching Salaries and the sum of \$68,520.00 for a Summer Institute for Teachers of Biology, workshops and the Geology Field School. Institute for Teachers of Biology, workshops allocated in the 1966-1967 This includes \$622,811.00 for teaching salaries allocated in the 1966-1967 Operating Budget plus an additional appropriation from the unappropriated Delance in the amount of \$50,636.00 for teaching salaries. A copy of the Budget has been mailed to each individual receiving a copy of the Minutes.

M77. Upon motion made by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Hinn, the Board by a unanimous vote accepted the bid of The First Boston Cooperation, New York, New York and Associates, for the purchase of the "Colleges of the State of Texas Constitutional Tax Bonds, Series 1967--Texas Technological College," in the principal amount of \$2,780,000.00 at par or principal amount thereof and accrued interest to the date of delivery plus a premium of \$7,200.20. A copy of the bids is on file in the Office of the Secretary of the Board.

M78. Upon motion made by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Hinn, the Board by a unanimous vote adopted a Resolution AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF ITS COLLEGES OF THE STATE OF TEXAS CONSTITUTIONAL TAX BONDS IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$2,780,000.00, BEARING INTEREST HEREINAFTER SET FORTH AND MATURING AS HEREINAFTER PRESCRIBED, TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING, CON-STRUCTING AND INITIALLY EQUIPPING BUILDINGS AND OTHER PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS AT TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE, PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF THE BONDS, PLEDGING TO THE PAYMENT OF THE INTEREST AND PRINCIPAL THEREOF THAT PART OF THE MONEY ALLOCATED TO SUCH INSTITUTIONS FROM THE CONTINUING TAX LEVIED BY THE CONSTI-TUTION UNDER ARTICLE VII, SECTION 17, AS AMENDED, PROVIDING FOR THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF SAID BONDS AND PRESCRIBING THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS OF SAID BOARD AND OF THE STATE IN REFERENCE THERETO, AND MAKING CERTAIN COVENANTS WITH RESPECT TO SECURING PAYMENT OF SAID BONDS AND INTEREST and authorized the Chairman and Secretary of the Board to sign the Certificate for Bond Resolution and all other papers required to complete the sale and delivery of the bonds. A copy of the Certificate for the Bond Resolution is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 57. A copy of the Bond Resolution is attached and made a part of the Minutes. M79. Upon motion made by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Hinn, the Board by a unanimous vote, authorized the Chairman of the Board, and/or the Secretary of the Board, and/or the Vice President for Business Affairs, and/or the Comptroller of the College, to prepare, execute and deliver any and all resolutions, any and all other documents necessary to complete the sale and to accept the proceeds from the sale of the bonds for and upon behalf of the College; authorized the Vice President for Business Affairs to sign any and all papers necessary to place the proceeds from the sale on deposit with a depository bank; and authorized the Vice President for Business Affairs to sign any and all papers necessary to withdraw or transfer the funds as required for financing the building program.

M80. The following excerpt from the Board Minutes of July 26, 1966, is included in the Minutes of this meeting for record purposes:

"1306. Upon motion made by Mr. Allison, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board by a unanimous vote awarded the American Bank Note Company, Chicago, Illinois, the contract for printing the Constitutional Tax Bonds for Texas Technological College; authorized the Vice President for Business Affairs to approve any and all financial arrangements necessary for the printing and delivery of the Bonds; and selected the Republic National Bank of Dallas, Texas, as the paying agent; the First National City Bank of New York City, New York, and the First National Bank of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois, as copaying agents."

The bonds referred to above cover all of the Constitutional Tax Bonds for Texas Technological College to be issued and referred to as the Series 1966 Bonds, Series 1967 Bonds and Series 1968 Bonds.

M81. Upon motion made by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Allen, the Board by a unanimous vote authorized the Vice President for Business Affairs to take the necessary steps to withdraw the \$13,000.00 placed on deposit by the United States Government for certain property in Lot 12, Block 134 and located at 1218 Avenue H, and authorized the use of the money for Matching Funds required under the provisions of the National Defense Student Loan Fund Agreement. (Re: Item No. 1419, Board Minutes of August 20, 1966.)

M82. Mr. Allison gave a brief report for the Legislative and Public Relations Committee. He reported that several bills had been introduced in this session of the Legislature that were of special interest to Texas Tech.

M83. Mr. Bill J. Parsley, Vice President for Development, gave a brief report on the work of the Office of Development for the fiscal year 1966. A copy of his report is on file in the Office of the Secretary of the Board.

M84. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board by a unanimous vote authorized the Campus and Planning Committee to determine the need for temporary building buildings as soon as possible and make the needs known to the Campus and Building Committee and if necessary poll the Board by telephone in order to push the project.

M85. President Murray reported on several items of interest to the group including (1) the enrollment for the 1967 spring semester; (2) the progress that is being made on the long range plans for the International Center for Arid and Semi-Arid Land Studies; (3) the status of the plans for the expanded museum and fund drive for the museum; (4) the status of certain bills to be introduced during the regular session of the Legislature; and (5) the designation of the following committee to plan and develop a ranch complex (an outside exhibit) for the new museum area. The committee members are: Dr. and Mrs. W. C. Holden, Lubbock; Mr. Howard Hampton, Lubbock; Mr. John F. Lott, Lubbock; and Mr. D. Burns, Lubbock.

M86. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, the Board by a unanimous vote adopted the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Certain State-supported and private institutions of higher education in West Texas are desirous of developing a cooperative system which will promote the education programs of the respective institutions by means of closed circuit television and other electronic communication facilities

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Texas Technological College be a participating institution in the Western Information Network Association.

M87. Upon motion made by Mr. McLaughlin, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the following statement concerning the Western Information Network Association: "That Texas Technological College convey to the state legislative representatives and senators that the bill creating the Western Information Network Association as a state agency of which Texas Technological College will be a participating institution, is one which will promote the educational programs of Texas Technological College and will greatly further enhance the quality of educational excellence that the Texas Technological College Board of Directors feels is the college's stewardship to provide."

M88. Upon motion made by Dr. Tannery, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the salary increases for the Assistant Football Coaches as recommended by the Athletic Council. The appointments and new salaries will be included in the materials for the Board Meeting on April 8, 1967.

M89. Upon motion made by Mr. Allison, seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, the Board by a unanimous vote adopted memorial resolutions in memory of The Honorable R. Wright Armstrong, a former Board Member, and Miss Margaret Watson Weeks, Dean of Home Economics, Emeritus, and adjourned the Board Meeting in their memory. A copy of each resolution is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Dean Weeks, Attachment No. 42; and Mr. Armstrong, Attachment No. 65.

M90. The Board adjourned at 9:30 a.m. until the next regular meeting on Saturday, April 8, 1967, to be held at 9:30 a.m. in the Anniversary Room, Student Union, Texas Technological College, Lubbock, Texas.

In view of the considerations herein contained, the College will receive ninety cents (90ϕ) per case sold, less one and two-thirds cents $(1 \ 2/3\phi)$ for each bottle missing or broken and ten cents (10ϕ) for each shell missing or broken. The Vendor will guarantee \$61,855.20 to the College from the vending machines for the period September 1, 1965, to August 31, 1966, and \$67,844.90 for the period September 1, 1966, to August 31, 1967.

All other paragraphs and provisions of the contract will reamin as originally written.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT at Lubbock, Texas, in triplicate, each of which shall be considered an original by their duly appointed officers, this the 28th day of November, 1966.

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THIS AGREEMENT made the 1st day of November 1966, by and between the Board of Directors of the Texas Technological College, Lubbock, Lubbock County, Texas, acting herein by and through Mr. Roy Furr, Lubbock, Lubbock County, Texas, Chairman of the Board of Directors, hereinafter called the Owner and Evans-Monical, Incorporated, Interior Consultants of Houston, Harris County, Texas, hereinafter called the Consultant.

WITNESSETH, that whereas the Owner intends to purchase and install certain furnishings, draperies, accessories, and other items of similar nature in the Dossie M. Wiggins Complex, Coeducational Dormitory and Dining Complex, Phase I, on the campus of Texas Technological College, Lubbock, Texas

NOW, THEREFORE, the Owner and the Consultant for the consideration hereinafter named agree as follows:

The Consultant agrees to perform for the above-named work professional services as hereinafter set forth.

The Owner agrees to pay to the Consultant, in current funds, for such services a fee of approximately \$10,000.00 based upon seven and one-half per cent $(7\frac{1}{2})$ of the contract price or purchase price of the work. The said percentage being hereinafter referred to as the basic rate.

ARTICLE 1. THE CONSULTANT'S SERVICES.

a. The Consultant's professional services consist of the necessary conferences, preparation of preliminary color schemes and floor plans of all fabrics, furniture and accessories; assistance in selection of all furniture, fabrics, and accessories and purchase of same through retail outlet or outlets; the contacting of wholesale sources and making them available to the Owner; the supervision of the installation of the work by others; assistance in drafting proposals and contracts and the general administration of the work to the completion of: (1) Thirty (30) lounges

(2) Three (3) formal lounges

- (3) One (1) snack bar
- (4) One (1) game room
- (5) Six (6) apartments

- b. The Consultant's professional services shall also include assistance in the selection of material or materials for and the installation of draperies in the Dining Hall.
- c. Additional general consultation relative to decoration of other spaces based upon a fee of \$15.00 per hour for senior designers' time, \$10.00 per hour for assistant designers' and draftsmen's time, and \$6.00 per hour for typing and installation time to be paid by the Owner from the before mentioned fee of approximately \$10,000.00, shall be a part of the Consultant's services under this contract.

ARTICLE 2. TRAVEL EXPENSES. All travel expenses incurred shall be paid by the Owner from the before mentioned fee of approximately \$10,000.00, provided that prior authorization for such expense shall be secured by the Consultant.

ARTICLE 3. PAYMENTS. Payment to the Consultant on account of the fee shall be made as follows:

- a. Upon submission of a preliminary layout of all items for installation in the spaces designated by Owner and approval of same by Owner, a payment on account of the fee equal to thirty-three and one-third per cent (33 1/3%) of the rate or rates of commission arising from this Agreement, based upon a reasonable estimated cost of the work to be installed.
- b. Upon completion of the selection of all items for installation in the spaces designated by Owner and approval of same by Owner, an additional payment on account of the fee equal to thirty-three and one-third per cent (33 1/3%) of the rate or rates of commission arising from this Agreement, based upon a reasonable estimated cost of the work to be installed.
- c. Upon final installation of all the work and acceptance of same by the Owner, a sum sufficient to complete payment of the total fee based on the actual invoice cost of all items purchased and installed for which services were hereinbefore specified.

ARTICLE 4. OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITY. The Owner shall provide for the Consultant all necessary basic floor plans and elevations of rooms included in the scope of the work together with such general or specific information relative to the structure as may be needed for the performance of service by

the Consultant.

ARTICLE 5. PRELIMINARY ESTIMATES. The Consultant shall, when requested to do so, furnish preliminary estimates of the cost of the work but the Consultant does not guarantee the accuracy of such estimates. The Owner shall provide a budgeted cost for guidance of the Consultant.

ARTICLE 6. SUPERVISION OF THE WORK. The Consultant shall supervise the execution of the work to guard the Owner against defects and deficiencies in the work of the contractors but the Consultant does not guarantee the performance of the contracts.

ARTICLE 7. MODIFICATION OF THE CONTRACT. This contract may be modified in scope, abandoned or suspended indefinitely upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Consultant. In the event of such notice to the Consultant, the fee shall be payable on the completed portion only calculated at the basic rate hereinabove specified.

ARTICLE 8. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNMENTS. The Owner and the Consultant bind themselves, their partners, successors, executors, administrators, and assigns to the other party to this Agreement and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators, and assigns of such other party in respect to all covenants of this Agreement. Except as above, neither the Owner nor the Consultant shall assign, sublet, or transfer his interest in this Agreement without the written consent of the other.

FULL PERFORMANCE: The Owner and the Consultant hereby agree to the full performance of the covenants contained herein.

- 4. The TSWCR reserves the right to review the results of the investigation supported by this grant at anytime it deems desirable prior

to publication of the results.

Approval recommended:

- 5. The Department of Animal Husbandry reserves the right to publish the results, upon review by TSWCR, of the investigations supported by this grant as it may deem desirable in the public interest and as soon as practical after completion of the study.
- 6. Any advertising referring to the results of these investigations shall be so worded as not to imply the endorsement of any product or producer by the Texas Technological College.
- 7. This agreement will be effective during the period of January 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968. Should it appear that additional funds are needed for further study, this agreement may be renewed upon the written consent of both parties. It is understood that final acceptance of this grant is subject to the approval of the Administration and board of Directors of Texas Technological College.

By Item No. 897 and Attachment No. 6 of the Minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting on January 26, 1957, and Item No. 1122 of April 13, 1957, the Board of Directors of Texas Tech approved the publication by the West Texas Museum Association of a multivolume set of books entitled "Builders of the Southwest" which would contain biographical and historical sketches of persons and businesses to be financed by contributions of \$500 for each sketch for the benefit of the Southwest Collection.

The funds were to be deposited in a special account under the jurisdiction of a Special Finance Committee. The methods for investing funds and the financial plans were stipulated in the approval.

RESOLUTION

BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF ITS COLLEGES OF THE STATE OF TEXAS CONSTITUTIONAL TAX BONDS IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$2,780,000, BEARING INTEREST HEREINAFTER SET FORTH AND MATURING AS HEREINAFTER PRESCRIBED, TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING AND INITIALLY EQUIPPING BUILDINGS AND OTHER PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS AT TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE, PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF THE BONDS, PLEDGING TO THE PAYMENT OF THE INTEREST AND PRINCIPAL THEREOF THAT PART OF THE MONEY ALLOCATED TO SUCH INSTITUTION FROM THE CONTINUING TAX LEVIED BY THE CONSTITUTION UNDER ARTICLE VII, SECTION 17, AS AMENDED, PROVIDING FOR THE EXECUTING AND DELIVERY OF SAID BONDS AND PRESCRIBING THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS OF SAID BOARD AND OF THE STATE IN REFERENCE THERETO, AND MAKING CERTAIN COVENANTS WITH RESPECT TO SECURING PAYMENT OF SAID BONDS AND INTEREST.

WHEREAS, Section 17 of Article VII of the Constitution of Texas adopted on the 23rd day of August, 1947, in addition to all other taxes permitted by the Constitution of Texas, levied a continuing ad valorem tax on all of the taxable property in the State at the rate of Five (5ϕ) Cents on the \$100.00 valuation to create a special fund for the purpose of acquiring, constructing and intitially equipping buildings or other permanent improvements at the institutions of higher learning designated therein; and

WHEREAS, such provision of the Constitution authorized the governing boards of the institutions therein designated to issue bonds and notes payable from such fund therein created, and pursuant to such authorization the governing boards of such institutions issued and sold bonds and notes; and

WHEREAS, all such bonds and notes have been paid in full and are no longer outstanding; and

WHEREAS, Section 17 of Article VII of the Constitution of Texas was amended as a whole by an amendment thereto adopted at the general election on November 6, 1956, which became operative and effective January 1, 1958; and

WHEREAS, Section 17 of Article VII of the Constitution, as amended, in 1956 ("the 1956 Amendment"), levied and thus renewed a continuing ad valorem tax on all of the taxable property in the State at the rate of Five (5ϕ) Cents on the \$100.00 valuation for the purpose of creating a special

fund for acquiring, constructing and initially equipping buildings or other permanent improvements at the institutions of higher learning designated in the said amendment; and

WHEREAS, such amended provision of the Constitution again authorized the governing boards of the institutions therein designated to issue bonds and notes payable from such fund therein created, and pursuant to such authorization the designated governing board issued and sold bonds and notes; and

WHEREAS, there remain outstanding bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$8,920,000 payable from the respective allocated shares of the tax, and notes in the aggregate principal amount of \$7,382,500 payable from such respective allocated shares of said tax after the bonds issued by each said governing boards have been fully paid or full provision shall have been made by accumulating in the appropriate Interest and Sinking Fund established for bonds of each said board, sufficient money to pay all of said bonds, together with the interest payable on such bonds to ultimate maturity; and

WHEREAS, there will be sufficient monies available in accordance with the tax levied by the 1956 Amendment and as allocated to pay the principal of and interest on said outstanding bonds and notes in accordance with their terms; and

WHEREAS, by adoption at the general election held in the State of Texas on November 2, 1965, Section 17 of Article VII of the Constitution of Texas was again amended as a whole (hereinafter sometimes called the "Constitutional Provision"); and

WHEREAS, the Constitutional Provision is self-enacting and has continued an ad valorem tax on all of the taxable property in the State of Texas at an increased rate of Ten (10ϕ) Cents on the \$100.00 valuation, and authorizes the proceeds of the tax to be pledged to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds issued pursuant thereto; and

WHEREAS, such tax levy became effective as of January 1, 1966, and will remain effective for taxes which will become due and payable in each year for a twelve year period beginning January 1, 1966, and for each successive ten year period thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the Constitutional Provision provides for an allocation of proceeds of such tax for the twelve year period commencing January 1, 1966, among the seventeen designated state supported institutions of higher learning (hereinafter sometimes called "Eligible Institutions") and has authorized the governing board of each of the Eligible Institutions to pledge any part of the fund allocated to it to pay the principal of and interest on bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Constitutional Provision requires the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas to make the allocation of the funds to the Eligible Institutions to be raised by such tax for the twelve year period beginning January 1, 1966, 85% of such funds to be allocated on June 1, 1966; and 15% to be allocated on June 1, 1972; and

WHEREAS, the Constitutional Provision requires that the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas make the June 1, 1966 allocation (85%) based on the following determinations:

"(1) Ninety per cent (90%) of the funds allocated on June 1, 1966, shall be allocated to state institutions based on projected enrollment increases published by the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System for fall 1966 to fall 1978;

"(2) Ten per cent (10%) of the funds allocated on June 1, 1966 shall be allocated to certain of the eligible state institutions based on the number of additional square feet needed in education and general facilities by such eligible state institution to meet the average square feet per full time equivalent student of all state senior institutions (currently numbering twenty-two);"

and

WHEREAS, such determinations have been made by the Coordinating Board; and

WHEREAS, the Comptroller has made the June 1, 1966 allocation as required by the Constitutional Provision; and

WHEREAS, of the total funds thus allocated on June 1, 1966, for the twelve year period, Texas Technological College is to receive 13.41922%; and

WHEREAS, the assessed valuation of property in the State of Texas (less homestead exemptions) subject to such levy in accordance with the approved tax rolls of 1965 was \$15,483,656,424, which valuation, together with the Comptroller's official estimates of valuations for each year of the twelve year period beginning January 1, 1966, and the figures representing the June 1, 1966 allocation among the Eligible Institutions afford a basis for estimating the amount of money to be received by Texas Technological College under such tax levy for each of the years of the said twelve year period; and it has been officially estimated that Texas Technological College will receive therefrom a total of \$16,483,381, during such period; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College authorized the issuance and sold its Colleges of the State of Texas Constitutional Tax Bonds, Series 1966 - Texas Technological College, dated September 1, 1966, in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,500,000 (hereinafter called the Series 1966 Bonds), and being numbered and maturing as follows:

WHEREAS, the interest on and the principal of the Series 1966 Bonds and the Series 1966-A Bonds are payable from the funds allocated to Texas Technological College as aforesaid; and

WHEREAS, in the resolution authorizing the Series 1966 Bonds and the Series 1966-A Bonds, the Board of Directors, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in such resolutions, reserve the right and power to issue in one or more series pursuant to the Constitutional Provision additional bonds on a parity with the Series 1966 Bonds and the Series 1966-A Bonds, secured by and payable from the same allocated funds; and

WHEREAS, it has been and is hereby determined to be to the best interest of Texas Technological College that \$2,780,000 in aggregate principal amount of bonds payable from its allocated fund be issued at this time and that action necessary for the issuance thereof be taken by this Board;

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE:

1. <u>The Bonds</u>. That in order to provide funds for the purpose of acquiring, constructing and initially equipping buildings and other permanent improvements at Texas Technological College, bonds are hereby authorized to be issued known as "Colleges of the State of Texas Constitutional Tax Bonds, Series 1967 - Texas Technological College," in the aggregate principal amount of Two Million Seven Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$2,780,000), in the denomination of \$5,000 each and numbered from One (1) to Five Hundred Fifty Six (556), both inclusive, (hereinafter referred to as the "Bonds"). The Bonds are issued as Additional Bonds as permitted in the resolution authorizing the Series 1966 Bonds and the Series 1966-A Bonds and shall be in all respects on a parity with the said Series 1966 Bonds and the Series 1966-A Bonds.

2. <u>Bonds of Issue on Parity</u>. That no one of said Bonds shall be entitled to priority over any other Bond of this issue in the application of the money in the allocated fund which has been pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, irrespective of the fact that some of the Bonds may be delivered prior to the delivery of other Bonds, it being the intent of this Resolution that all Bonds of this issue shall rank equally.

3. <u>Date of Bonds; Maturity Schedule</u>. That the Bonds shall be dated March 1, 1967, and shall become due and payable on September 1 in each of the years and in the amounts as follows:

4. That as to said Bonds scheduled to mature on or after September 1, 1973, the Board of Regents reserves the right and option to redeem such Bonds prior to their scheduled maturities, in whole or in part, on September 1, 1972, or on any interest payment date thereafter at par and accrued interest to date fixed for redemption, plus a premium of 2% of the principal amount so called for redemption. Notice of redemption is to be published in a financial publication published in the English language in the City of New York, New York, at least once, not less than thirty (30) days before the date fixed for such payment, and thirty (30) days' notice in writing is to be given to the Banks of Payment before the date so fixed for such redemption. Prior to the date fixed for redemption, funds shall be placed in the Banks of Payment sufficient to pay the Bonds called, the accrued interest and the premium thereon. Upon the happening of the above conditions said Bonds thus called shall not thereafter bear interest.

5. <u>Interest Rates</u>. That the Bonds shall bear interest at the rate of 3.20% per annum, payable September 1, 1967, and semi-annually thereafter on each March 1 and September 1.

6. <u>Banks of Payment</u>. That the principal of and the interest on the Bonds shall be payable, without exchange or collection charges to the owner or holder thereof, at Republic National Bank of Dallas, Dallas, Texas, (hereinafter called "Principal Bank of Payment"), or, at the option of the holder, at First National City Bank, New York, New York, or, The First National Bank of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois, (herein collectively called "Banks of Payment") in lawful money of the United States of America upon

surrender of proper Bond or doupon.

7. Execution of Bonds and Coupons. That each of said Bonds and interest coupons shall be signed by the imprinted or lithographed facsimile signature of the Chairman of the Board of Directors and countersigned by the imprinted or lithographed facsimile signature of the Secretary of the Board of Directors, and the official seal of said Board shall be impressed, printed, or lithographed on each of said Bonds.

8. <u>Negotiability</u>. That nothing contained in the Bonds or in this Resolution shall affect or impair the negotiability of the Bonds or the coupons thereto appertaining, and said Bonds and coupons shall constitute negotiable instruments within the meaning of the Negotiable Instruments Acts of the State of Texas.

This Bond is one of a series of Bonds (hereinafter sometimes called the "Bonds") of like tenor and effect except as to number, maturity and right of redemption, numbered from One (1) to Five Hundred Fifty Six (556), both inclusive, aggregating Two Million Seven Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$2,780,000), issued for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, and initially equipping buildings or other permanent improvements at Texas Technological College, Lubbock, Texas, in accordance with the provisions of Section 17 of Article VII, as amended, of the Constitution of Texas, and pursuant to the Resolution authorizing the issuance of the series of Bonds of which this is one, adopted by the Board of Directors of Texas Technologi cal College, duly of record in the minutes of said Board (herein called the "Resolution").

The date of this Bond in conformity with the Resolution is March 1, 1967.

The Bonds of which this is one are secured by a pledge of that part allocated to Texas Technological College of the proceeds of a continuing tax on all of the taxable property in the State levied by Section 17 of Article VII of the Constitution, as amended on November 2, 1965, accumulated and held in the State Treasury to be used solely to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds, other parity bonds heretofore issued and additional parity bonds herein mentioned. The levy of such tax supporting the Bonds and the pledge thereof will remain effective so long as any of the Bonds is outstanding and unpaid.

The Board shall have the option of calling bonds maturing serially on or after September 1, 1973, for redemption prior to maturity, in whole or in part, on September 1, 1972, or any interest payment date thereafter, at par and accrued interest to date of redemption plus a premium of 2% of the principal amount so called for redemption. Notice of redemption is to be published in a financial publication published in the English language in the City of New York, New York, at least once, not less than thirty (30) days before the date fixed for such payment, and thirty (30) days notice in writing is to be given to the Banks of Payment before the date so fixed for such redemption. Prior to the date fixed for redemption, funds shall be placed in the Banks of Payment sufficient to pay the bonds called, the

accrued interest and the premium thereon. Upon the happening of the above conditions said bonds thus called shall not thereafter bear interest.

The Board reserves the right to issue additional parity bonds under the terms and conditions stated in the Resolution authorizing this Bond and the series of which it is a part, and said bonds may be made payable from the same source, secured in the same manner and placed on a parity with this Bond and the series of which it is a part.

Each successive holder of this Bond, and each successive holder of each of the coupons hereto attached, is conclusively presumed to forego and renounce his equities, in favor of subsequent holders for value without notice, and to agree that this Bond and each of the coupons hereto attached, may be negotiated by delivery by any person having possession thereof, howsoever such possession may have been acquired, and that any holder who shall have taken this Bond or any of the coupons from any person for value without notice, thereby has acquired absolute title thereto, free from any defenses enforceable against any prior holder and free from all equities and claims of ownership of any such prior holder. 12. <u>Definitions</u>. That throughout this Resolution, in the bond form prescribed herein and in the bonds authorized hereby, the following terms and expressions as used herein shall have the meanings set forth, to-wit:

The term "Additional Bonds" shall refer to the additional parity bonds that are permitted to be issued by Section 13;

The term "Board" shall refer to the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College;

The term "Bonds" shall refer to the bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this resolution;

The term "Comptroller" shall refer to the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas;

The term "Constitutional Provision" shall mean Article VII, Section 17 of the Constitution of Texas as amended November 2, 1965;

The term "Eligible Institutions" shall mean the seventeen state supported institutions of higher learning designated as those institutions to receive allocated proceeds from the tax levied by the Constitutional Provision;

The term "1956 Amendment" shall mean Article VII, Section 17 of the Constitution as amended November 6, 1956;

The term "Institution" shall refer to Texas Technological College;

The term "Presiding Officer" shall mean the officer designated by law to preside over the Board;

The term "Resolution" shall mean the resolution authorizing the Bonds.

The term "Series 1966 Bonds" shall refer to Colleges of the State of Texas Constitutional Tax Bonds, Series 1966 - Texas Technological College in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,500,000;

The term "Series 1966-A Bonds" shall refer to Colleges of the State of Texas Constitutional Tax Bonds, Series 1966-A - Texas Technological College in the aggregate principal amount of \$3,500,000.

13. Findings, Pledge of Payment, Additional Bonds. That official recognition is hereby given to these facts:

(a) That the tax authorized by the 1956 Amendment and allocated in accordance therewith to certain institutions designated therein was thereafter pledged to the payment of bonds and notes issued under the authority of the 1956 Amendment; that such bonds and notes are to be paid in accordance with such allocation and pledge; and that no attempt is made herein to pledge such tax thus allocated to said designated institutions and subsequently pledged to the payment of bonds and notes issued pursuant to such authority.

(b) That Section 17 of Article VII of the Constitution, as amended in 1965 (the "Constitutional Provision") has levied a continuing ad valorem tax on all taxable property in the State of Texas, at the increased rate of Ten (10ϕ) Cents on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of valuation;

(c) That such tax has been effective since January 1, 1966 and will remain effective so long as any of the Bonds is outstanding and unpaid;

(d) That as and when the proceeds from such tax levy are received by the Comptroller the net amounts realized therefrom (including the portion thereof allocated to the Institution) are deposited in the State Treasury to be held for the purposes set forth in the Constitutional Provision;

(e) That the Comptroller on June 1, 1966 allocated among the Eligible Institutions 85% of the said tax to be received for the twelve year period beginning January 1, 1966; and will on June 1, 1972

allocate among the Eligible Institutions the remaining 15% of the said tax for the said twelve year period, all in accordance with the Constitutional Provision.

(f) That it is the duty of the Comptroller to draw all necessary and proper warrants upon the State Treasury to effectuate the pledge of such money made in this Resolution and to facilitate payment of the Series 1966 Bonds, the Series 1966-A Bonds, the Bonds, the Additional Bonds and interest thereon; and

(g) That while such tax will remain effective so long as any of the Series 1966 Bonds, the Series 1966-A Bonds, the Bonds, or the Additional Bonds is outstanding and unpaid, the Board must arrange the installment maturities of the Bonds and the Additional Bonds and make its pledge of the taxes allocated to the Institution so that the Series 1966 Bonds, the Series 1966-A Bonds, the Bonds, and Additional Bonds will be actually retired out of taxes collected during the twelve year period beginning January 1, 1966.

Accordingly, the Board irrevocably pledges to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Series 1966 Bonds, the Series 1966-A Bonds, and the Bonds the following:

(1) All of the money, in the State Treasury to the credit of the Institution, realized from the collection of such continuing tax levied for the year 1966, exclusive of that part of the tax allocated and pledged pursuant to the 1956 Amendment to the payment of outstanding bonds and notes issued prior to the adoption of the Constitutional Provision;

(2) All of the proceeds from such continuing tax to which it is entitled levied for each of the years 1966 to 1977, both inclusive, and allocated June 1, 1966 by the Comptroller, which tax according to law becomes due on October 1 of each of said years, exclusive of that part of the tax allocated and pledged pursuant to the 1956 Amendment to the payment of outstanding bonds and notes prior to the adoption of the Constitutional Provision;

(3) In the event that any of the Bonds or any interest thereon remains outstanding and unpaid on the date the last of the Bonds is

scheduled to mature, and in the event the Interest and Sinking Fund, created by Section 14 hereof shall then contain sufficient money to pay all of such principal and interest and the expense incidental to the making of such payments, to the extent of such deficiency, the proceeds from such continuing tax to which the Institution may be entitled under the allocation made by the Comptroller on June 1, 1966 or additional allocations of reallocation arrangements then in effect are pledged and such pledge shall remain effective until the Bonds shall have been paid in full with interest thereon; but when full provision shall have been made for the final payment of the Bonds by depositing money sufficient for the purpose in the Interest and Sinking Fund, the obligation under this sub-section (3) will have been fully satisfied and the pledge will have been released; and

(4) The modey pladged to the payment of the Series 1966 Bonds, the Series 1966-A Bonds and the Böhds shall be used solely to pay the principal of and interest on the Series 1966 Bonds, the Series 1966-A Bonds and the Bonds and to defray the expense incident to such payments so long as any of such bonds or interest thereon is outstanding and unpaid. After full provision shall have been made by accumulating in the Interest and Sinking Fund sufficient money available for the purpose, which can be used for no other purpose, to pay all of such bonds and interest calculated thereon to maturity, the Board reserves the right to use money in excess thereof for such purposes as may be permitted under the Constitutional Provision.

Provided, however, the Board reserves and shall have the right and power to issue pursuant to the Constitutional Provision additional parity bonds in one or more series, (herein defined as "Additional Bonds") which Additional Bonds, when issued, shall be secured by and payable from the Ten (10ϕ) Cent tax levied by the Constitutional Provision for the twelve year period beginning January 1, 1966, and allocated to the Institution, in the same manner and to the same extent as the Series 1966 Bonds, the Series 1966-A Bonds, and the Bonds, and the Additional Bonds permitted by this Section 13, when issued, shall be in all respects of equal dignity and on a parity with the Series 1966 Bonds, the Series 1966-A Bonds and the Bonds whether payable

in whole or in part from the allocation made by the Comptroller on June 1, 1966, or to be made by the Comptroller of June 1, 1972. Provided, further, that Additional Bonds will not be issued in an aggregate principal amount that will cause the total amount required for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Series 1966 Bonds, the Series 1966-A Bonds, the Bonds and the Additional Bonds in any year to be more than 85% of the amount of such taxes allocated to the Institution and officially estimated by the Comptroller of Public Accounts to be collected in such year for the credit of the Interest and Sinking Fund.

14. <u>Interest and Sinking Fund</u>. That (a) the Treasurer of the State of Texas pursuant to the provisions of the resolution authorizing the Series 1966 Bonds established in the State Treasury a fund known as Texas Technological College Constitutional Tax Bond Interest and Sinking Fund (herein called "Interest and Sinking Fund");

(b) As received into the State Treasury the said allocated money of the Institution shall be credited to the Interest and Sinking Fund in the manner and to be held in accordance with the pledge contained in Section 13 hereof.

15. Procedure for Remitting to Banks of Payment.

That

(a) In accordance with the requirements of the Constitutional Provision that "The State Comptroller of Public Accounts shall draw all necessary and proper warrants upon the State Treasury, in order to carry out the purpose of this amendment," to the end that money will be available at the Banks of Payment in ample time to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds, as such principal and interest, respectively, matures, the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas, on or before August 15, 1967, and on or before February 15 and August 15 of each year while any of the Bonds is outstanding and unpaid, shall draw a warrant against the Interest and Sinking Fund in the amount of the interest or interest and principal (when both are scheduled to mature) which will become due on the September 1 or March 1 next following. The amount of each such warrant shall be increased by the amount of the charges of the Banks of Payment for making payment of the Bonds or coupons or both Bonds and coupons scheduled to

mature in each such instance. Within the discretion of the Comptroller of Public Accounts he may draw a separate warrant for the payment of such charges.

(b) Each such warrant shall be made payable to the order of the Principal Bank of Payment specified in Section 6 above, and the Comptroller of Public Accounts shall deliver such warrant to the payee Bank;

(c) The Principal Bank of Payment designated in Section 6 hereof, shall out of moneys remitted to it under the provisions of this Section 15, and not otherwise, make available at the other Banks of Payment specified in Section 6 hereof funds sufficient to pay such of the Bonds, and such of the coupons as are presented for payment at such banks and the Principal Bank of Payment. The Principal Bank of Payment by accepting designation as such Principal Bank of Payment agrees and is obligated to perform such service.

16. Enforcement of Rights of Bondholders. That all rights available to the holders of the Bonds under the Constitution and laws of the State, by suit for mandamus or otherwise, to compel the performance of their official duties by the Board, its officers, the officers of counties, or the officers of the State to the end that the principal of and interest on the Bonds may be paid promptly, are hereby recognized and reserved to and for the holders of the Bonds and of the appurtenant coupons.

17. <u>Confirmation of Sale of Bonds</u>. That the sale of the Bonds to The First Boston Corporation and Associates, Chicago, Illinois, at a price of par and accrued interest to date of delivery, plus a premium of \$7,200.20 be and the same is hereby confirmed.

18. <u>Custody and Delivery of Bonds</u>. That after said Bonds shall have been executed it shall be the duty of the Presiding Officer of the Board or some officer of the Board acting under authority from him, to deliver said Bonds to the Attorney General of Texas for examination and approval and after said Bonds shall have been approved by the Attorney General they shall be delivered to the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas for registration. The Bonds thus registered shall remain in the custody of the Presiding Officer of the Board subject to his order, until the delivery thereof to the purchaser.
