

Natural Heritage of Texas Map

The Natural Heritage of Texas Map, produced in 1986 by the General Land Office, celebrates the natural diversity that makes Texas unique. This beautiful $54'' \times 55''$ map illustrates rare and unusual plants and animals, river systems and noteworthy ecological characteristics of Texas.


This map is a pictorial representation of the Texas Natural Heritage Program, which was designed to encourage preservation of native flora and fauna, and represents the combined talents of cartographers, artists and scientists. The program was founded by the Texas General Land Office, in conjunction with the Nature Conservancy and the Texas Department of Parks and Wildlife. It provides a centralized computer database for information on these rare and unusual species, which serves a valuable economic purpose. By calling the information number, 512-389-4505, project planners can save time and money by planning around the habitats of these precious species of life.

The Natural Heritage map is a gift to the people of Texas from the General Land Office as part of this agency's historic responsibility to commission and maintain Texas maps for use by the public. The goal of the map program is to ensure that every Texan understands what is truly unique about the ecology of our state. To that end, the map will be placed in each public high school in Texas during the coming year, where it will serve as a valuable educational tool.

Randy Graham is a partner in a local advertising firm and has been a commercial artist for eleven years. He has studied art under Paul Wyler and Paul Milosevich.







STAINED-GLASS COOKIES

1 cup sugar

3/4 cup margarine or butter, softened

2 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla or

1/2 teaspoon lemon extract

2 1/2 cups flour

1 teaspoon baking

powder

1 teaspoon salt

About 5 rolls

ring-shaped, fruit-

flavored hard candy

(about 3/4 ounce each)

Mix sugar, butter, eggs and flavor extract. Stir in flour, baking powder and salt. Cover and refrigerate at least 1 hour.

Heat oven to 350°. Roll dough 1/8 inch thick on lightly floured cloth-covered board. Cut into desired shapes with cookie cutters. Place cookies on aluminum foil-covered cookie sheet. Cut out designs from center of cookies using smaller cutters or your own patterns. Place whole or partially crushed candy in cutouts, depending on size and shape of design. (To crush candy, place between paper towels and tap lightly. As candy melts easily, leave pieces as large as possible.)

Bake until cookies are very light brown and candy is melted, 7 to 9 minutes. If cookies are to be hung, remove tray from oven halfway through baking time and make a hole in each cookie 1/4 inch from top with end of plastic straw. Place tray back in oven and bake for remainder of time. If candy has not filled out the cutout design at the end of baking time, immediately spread with metal spatula. Cool completely on cookie sheet. Gently remove cookies. Makes about 6 dozen 3-inch cookies.

Comes after the storm and gloom.




