



The route crosses and re-crosses the Old Sante Fe Trail and is through the western
section of the State of Arizona. It is a new way to Boulder Dam and Boulder City, 90
miles over a new road, and beautiful mountain scenery. Along the route may be seen
prospectors working the mountainsides for gold. A stop will be made at one of the large
gold mines, permitting everyone of the party to go through the mine. Off to the right of
the road as we more Boulder City may be seen an entire Spanish village abandoned,
Arriving in Boulder City, Nevada, the Government Reservation is visited, after
which, Lake Mead, the huge reservoir 115 miles long, and Boulder Dam will be inspected.

The entire afternoon is spent at Boulder Dam, going through the Government project. You
will have an opportunity to go down the elevators to the base of the dam, over 600 feet,
and view the giant generators, now serving power to Los Angeles, and many other points.

There is over 10 miles of tunnels within the Dam. We return to Kingman in the early
evening, where the special train is boarded.






