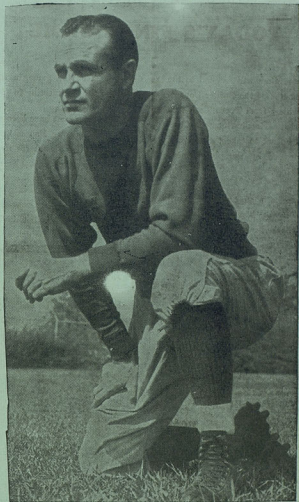

## COWBOY ATHLETIC DIRECTOR AND HEAD COACH



WARREN B. WOODSON

The 1946 football season marks the third for Warren B. Woodson as head coach and athletic director at Hardin-Simmons University, whose Purple and Gold clad Cowboys are defending Border Conference titlists as they return to the gridiron following a three-year layoff.

Woodson came to Hardin-Simmons in 1941, succeeding Frank Kimbrough at helm of the Cowboy coaching staff. The 43-year-old mentor, a Baylor graduate of 1924, came from Arkansas State College where his football teams won four state conference titles in five years, his basketball teams five loop crowns; and two titles went to his track teams.

Phenomenal success has marked Woodson's two-year tenure at Hardin-Simmons, his Cowboys being Border Conference co-champions in 1941 and champs in 1942, when they finished as one of the nation's few unbeaten elevens.



## TODAY'S FINAL GAME

The turf of Fair Park stadium will resound to the battle between the two behemoths of the Border Conference as the invading Red Raiders from Texas Tech seek to mar the perfect record of the Hardin-Simmons Cowboys. That each team will be out to take the scalp of the other can best be expressed by the play-by-play account of the game in progress.

Texas Tech comes here with an enviable record having trounced S. M. U., Baylor, Texas A&M, Oklahoma A&M, Denver, West Texas, New Mexico and Arizona. Only setbacks on their 1946 record were to the University of Tulsa and Rice Institute's Owls. The latter is better forgotten as the Owls soundly trounced the Raiders down in Houston.

On the other hand the high riding Cowboys have a record that indicates the kind of football the boys enjoy playing—namely win 'em all. The Ranchers of Head Coach Warren Woodson boast wins over McMurry, Kansas State's Wildcats, San Jose State, host team in New Year's day Raisin Bowl at Fresno, California, New Mexico University, Arizona State (Tempe), U. of Arizona, West Texas State, Texas Mines and Howard Payne. The Cowhands have racked up a total of 288 points to their opponents 42 points.

Common enemies of the Red Raiders and the Cowboys this season were: West Texas, New Mexico U. and Arizona University. The Cowboys trimmed West Texas 28 to 7. Tech trimmed them 26 to 14, the Cowboys took New Mexico into camp 49 to 0, Tech won over them 27 to 0, Hardin-Simmons trimmed Arizona 19 to 8, Tech took them 16 to 0.

Today's game marks the thirteenth encounter between these arch rivals with the Cowboys on the better end of the scoring with 79 points to 70 for Texas Tech. However, the Raiders have the edge in games won having won 6, Hardin-Simmons taking 4 and two ending in

0-0 ties. The first game, in 1926, ended in a scoreless tie as did the last meeting in 1942.

Only two teams have been able to out-first-down the Ranchers, they were Kansas State and San Jose's Spartans. Total first downs for the Cowboys are 110 to 63 for their eight opponents. (No statistics are available on the New Mexico game).

Quite a lot in the way of post-season bowl bids hinges on the outcome of today's game. Bowl game feelers have been coming thick and fast only to receive a "wait until after the Tech game" answer.

Little "Doc" Mobley did his best ground gaining against the heaviest opponents on the 1942 Cowboy schedule, the S. M. U. and Baylor tussles. Leading the nation in this department in 1942, he is currently doing the same this season with a total of 1204 yards.

With today's game goes the championship of the Border Conference and a chance to receive a bowl bid for January 1.

## The President's Message

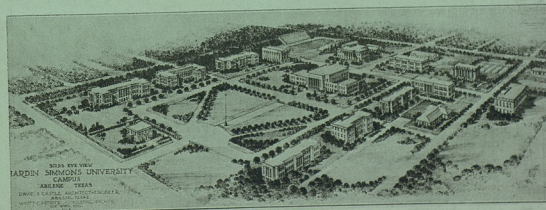

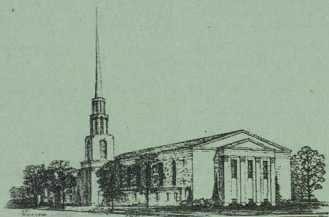

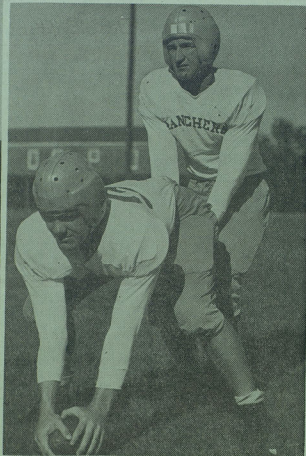
