AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 1:30 o'clock p.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 172 Present, 3 Absent-excused, 5 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

The Reverend George K. Beach, Minister, First Unitarian Church of Austin, Texas, offered the invocation as follows:

Please join me in prayer:

Thou in whose infinite life our lives are set, draw us from that slumber which is always insensible to the world and is restless with dreams that revolve forever around "me". Lure us out of our sleeping selves, awaken us to each hard reality, each great fact of life that breaks into our isolation.

Lord, let us be attentive to life, let us learn our limitations, let us feel thy encompassing. May we tend to those things which are most important, may we care for those persons who depend on us, may we take responsibility for the attitude of our own hearts.

Thou in whose infinite life our lives are set, help us find the fulfillment of our intentions, insofar as they are true and worthy of us. Amen.

ARTICLE III ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention as unfinished business Article III.

Question: Shall Article III as amended be adopted?

Delegate Blake explained Section 4 of

Article III.

(Delegate Clayton in Chair)

Delegate Sherman of Tarrant offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 4:

Amend committee report to Proposal 1, Article III, Sec. 4(b), by deleting "of each odd-numbered year" and substituting "following the general election at which elected."

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

(President in Chair)

Delegate Sherman of Tarrant offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 4:

Amend committee report to Proposal 1, Article III, Sec. 4(c), by deleting "of each odd-numbered year," and substituting "following the general election at which elected."

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

LEAVES OF ABSENCE

Delegate Vick was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Lee.

Delegate Waters was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Nichols.

Delegate Wolff was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Presnal.

Delegate Short offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 4:

Amend Section 4, Article III, Legislative Committee Report, by striking Subsections (b) and (c) and substituting the following:

(b) Each senator and representative serves a term of four years beginning on the date provided by law for convening the legislature in regular session of each odd-numbered year. The qualified voters shall elect a new senate after each statewide redistricting of the senate and a new house of representatives after each statewide redistricting of the house of representatives. The members of each house shall decide by lot which members serve four-year terms and which serve two-year terms, so that one-half of the members of each house will be elected every two years thereafter.

(c) Except in the case of an election to fill a vacancy, if a member of the house of representatives becomes a candidate for the state senate and has more than one year remaining in his term, that member's seat in the house of representatives becomes vacant

on the last day of the calendar year in which the senate election is held, and the unexpired term of such house member shall be filled at the general election prior to the occurrence of the vacancy, as provided by law.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Davis moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 69 Yeas, 95 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 14 Not Voting. (Record 2, Appendix)

PAIRED VOTE

Delegate Ragsdale (present), who would vote "Yea", with Delegate Sutton (absent), who would vote "Nay".

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

Delegate Gammage offered the following substitute for the amendment to Article III, Section 4:

Amend the Committee Report Section 4 by deleting Subsections (b) and (c) and substituting therefor the following:

(b) Each senator serves a term of six years beginning on the date provided by law for convening the legislature in regular session following the general election at which elected. The qualified voters shall elect a new senate after each statewide senatorial redistricting. The senators shall decide by lot which serve two-year terms, which serve four-year terms, and which serve six-year terms, so that one-third will be elected every two years thereafter.

(c) Each representative serves a term of four years beginning on the date provided by law for convening the legislature in regular session following the general election at which elected. The qualified voters shall elect a new house of representatives after each statewide representative redistricting. The representatives shall decide by lot which serve four-year terms and which serve two-year terms, so that one-half will be elected every two years thereafter.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

Delegate Blake moved to table the substitute for the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 147 Yeas, 15 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 17 Not Voting. (Record 3, Appendix)

Delegate Washington offered the following substitute for the amendment to Article III, Section 4:

Substitute for Short amendment to Section 4, Article III, Legislative Committee Report, by striking Subsections (b) and (c) and substituting the following:

(b) Each senator and representative serves a term of four years beginning on the date provided by law for convening the legislature in regular session following the general election at which elected. The qualified voters shall elect a new senate after each statewide redistricting of the senate and a new house of representatives after each statewide redistricting of the house of representatives. The members of each house shall decide by lot which members serve four-year terms and which serve two-year terms, so that one-half of the members of each house will be elected every two years thereafter.

(c) Except in the case of an election to fill a vacancy, if a member of the house of representatives becomes a candidate for the state senate and has more than two years remaining in his term, that member's seat in the house of representatives becomes vacant on the last day of the next calendar year after which the senate election is held, and the unexpired term of such house member shall be filled at the general election prior to the occurrence of the vacancy, as provided by law.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Wolff who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

Delegate Tupper moved to table the substitute for the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 127 Yeas, 37 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 15 Not Voting. (Record 4, Appendix)

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Hudson who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Delegate Sherman of Tarrant offered the following amendment to the amendment to Article III, Section 4:

Amend Short amendment by deleting "of each odd-numbered year," in subparagraph (b) and substituting "following the general election at which elected."

The amendment to the amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Miller offered the following amendment to the amendment to Article III, Section 4:

Amend the Short amendment by inserting the words "or her" after the word "his" in Section "c".

Delegate Washington offered the following amendment to the amendment to Article III, Section 4:

Amend Short amendment by striking Subsection (c).

The amendment to the amendment was read.

Delegate Tupper moved to table the amendment to the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 96 Yeas, 69 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 14 Not Voting. (Record 5, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment as amended be adopted?

(Vice-President in Chair)

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate McKinnon who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

(President in Chair)

The amendment by Delegate Short failed of adoption by the following vote: 68 Yeas, 100 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 11 Not Voting. (Record 6, Appendix)

Delegate Head explained Section 5 of Article III.

Delegate Pentony offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 5:

Amend Article III, Section 5(c) by adding the following after the word "districts" at the end of SubSection (c):

"If the excess population is 50%, or more of a district, such excess population shall be in one district."

The amendment was read.

Delegate Sherman of Tarrant moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 71 Yeas, 87 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 21 Not Voting. (Record 7, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

The amendment was then adopted by the following vote: 100 Yeas, 61 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 18 Not Voting. (Record 8, Appendix)

Delegate Mattox offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 5:

Amend the Legislative Committee Report,

Article III, Section 5, Subsection (b) by adding the following:

"In determining the house and senate districts at the time of the redistricting plan no deviation greater than five percent will occur."

The amendment was read.

Delegate Powers moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 126 Yeas, 40 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 13 Not Voting. (Record 9, Appendix)

Delegate Reyes offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 5:

Amend the Legislative Committee Report, Article III, Section 5 by deleting Subsections (c), (d) and (e) and substituting the following:

(c) If the legislature fails to redistrict itself by August 15 following publication of federal census, the State shall be redistricted by the Legislative Redistricting Board of Texas comprised of the Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Attorney General, the Comptroller, and the Commissioner of the General Land Office. The Legislative Redistricting Board shall assemble twenty days after the final adjournment of the first regular session following the publication of each federal census and within (30) thirty days after assembling make and file its redistricting plan with the Secretary of State. A redistricting plan of the Legislative Redistricting Board shall be effective only if signed by at least three of its members.

The amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Reyes and by unanimous consent, the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Hale offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 5:

Amend Article III, Section 5(e), as reported by the Committee on the Legislature, to read as follows:

(e) Whenever, following a finding by a court that a redistricting plan enacted by the legislature is invalid, a court-ordered redistricting plan is to take effect for an election to be held before the legislature will meet in regular session, the legislature shall meet in special session within 14 days after the judgment of invalidity becomes final, to consider enactment of a new redistricting plan; or if it is not a final judgment, the legislature shall meet within 14 days after the latest of the following: the entry of the order, the denial of a motion for new trial, rehearing, or similar action, or the denial of a motion for stay of the order. The secretary of state shall set the date, within the 14-day period, on which the legislature is to convene, and if the secretary of state fails to set a date, the legislature shall convene on the 14th day.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Adams of Jasper moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by a non-record vote.

Delegate Spurlock offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 5:

Amend Article III, Section 5(e) by inserting between the word "If" and the words "the Supreme Court of Texas" the following words "by final decree," and further following the word "invalid," the following phrase "or a court-ordered redistricting plan is to take effect prior to any final decree."

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Question: Shall Article III as amended be adopted?

UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO RECORD VOTE
