CONFEDERATE TEXAS TROOPS

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16th Regiment, Texas Cavalry (Fitzhugh's)

16th Cavalry Regiment, about 1,000 strong, was organized during the spring of 1862 with men from Gainesville, Brenham, Farmersville, and McKinney. It was later dismounted and assigned to Flournoy's, Waterhouse's, and Scurry's Brigade, Trans-Mississippi Department, and was active in Louisiana and Arkansas. In the attack at **Milliken's Bend** in June, 1863, the unit lost 19 killed, 47 wounded, and 1 missing but casualties at **Jenkins' Ferry** were not reported. In March, 1865, it was sent to Hempstead, Texas, and here disbanded in May. The field officers were Colonels William Fitzhugh and Edward P. Gregg, and Lieutenant Colonel William W. Diamond.

Widow's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Gray

I, Mrs. S. J. Chambers, do hereby make application to the Comptroller of Public Accounts for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A.D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of Joseph Henry Chambers, deceased, who departed this life on the 19 day of Jan, A.D. 1922, in the county of Gray in the State of Texas.

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband,* and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 16 day of July, A.D. 1868, in the county of Collin in the State of Texas.

My husband, the said Joseph Henry Chambers, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States and he did not desert the Confederate service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A.D. 1910, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value above the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$2000; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State of the United States, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age, and date of birth? 82, born Sept. 19-1846
2. Where were you born? Sabine Co. Tex.
3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? 62 years
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? 26-
5. What is your postoffice address? McLean Texas
6. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate pension law and been rejected? No.

If rejected, state when and where.

7. Did your husband draw a pension? No. If so, give his file number.
8. What is your husband's full name? Joseph Henry Chambers

9. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? 16 Reg. Texas

10. How long did your husband serve? From enlistment to end of the war If known to you, give date of enlistment and discharge No record of Discharge.

11. What was the name or letter of the company, or number of the regiment in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service. (If applicant's husband was a pensioner give his file number, which is evidence sufficient for proof of service.) Co. K. 16th Reg.

12. Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery, or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service. Texas Cavalry.

13. Do you own any property other than that rendered for taxes in your county? If so, state value of same and county where located. Just my home stead. Gray Co.

14. Have you transferred to another any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? No.

Wherefore your petitioner prays that her application for a pension may be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as required by law.

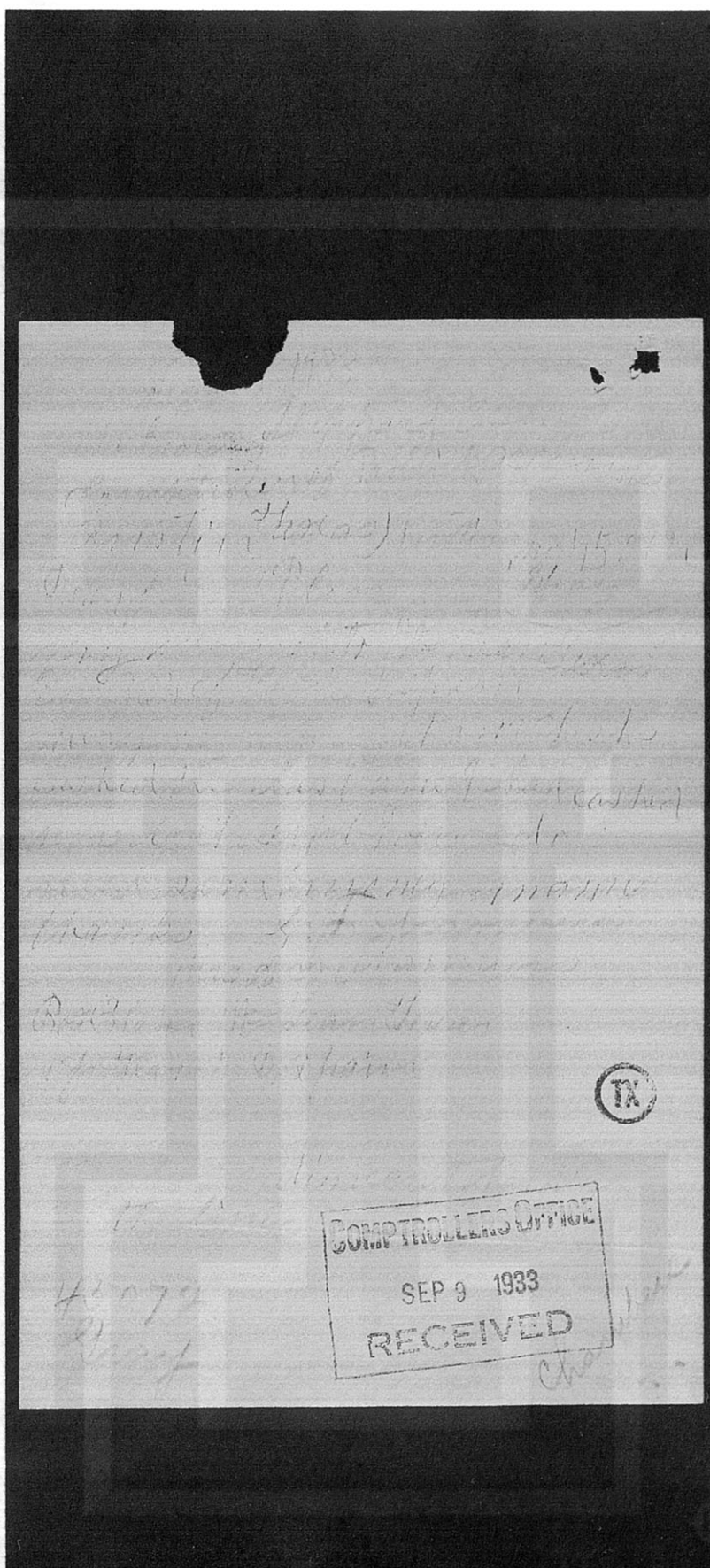

Muster Roll for Jan. & Feb., 1864 (latest on file) shows him present. Capture, parole or later record not found. Name not found as Joseph Henry Chambers.

Neither the name Joseph Henry Chambers or J. H. Chambers has been found on the muster rolls of the 6th Regiment Texas Cavalry, 9th Texas Infantry or Martin's Regiment Texas Cavalry (also known as 5th Regiment Texas Partisan Rangers), Confederate States Army, nor has any record been found of his capture or parole as of any one of these organizations.

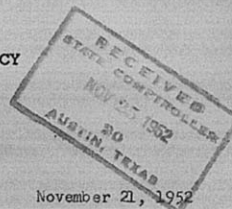

The records of this office show Mrs. S. F. Chambers of Gray County, McLean, Texas, filed application for Confederate Pension in the State of Texas on the military service record of her deceased husband, Joseph Henry Chambers in December, 1928. Mrs. Chambers application was approved and she drew a pension until her death in 1937.

Mrs. Chambers stated she was born in the State of Missouri in September, 1846 but had resided in Texas for 62 years. She was married to Joseph Henry Chambers in Collin County, Texas in July, 1868 and his death occurred on Jan. 9, 1922.

Joseph Henry Chambers, also borne as J. H. Chambers, claimed to have been a member of Company K, 16th Regiment of Texas Cavalry. The application for pension of Mrs. Chambers was approved on the following report furnished this office by the Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C., and on the affidavits of witnesses.

"The records show one J. H. Chambers, Private, Co. K, 16th Regiment Texas Cavalry, (Fitzhugh's Regiment-3rd Regt. Johnson's Brigade), Confederate States Army, enlisted Feb. 18, 1864 at Camp Glenwood, La. Master roll for Jan. & Feb. 1864 (latest on file) shows him present. Capture, parole or later record not found. Name not found as Joseph Henry Chambers. Neither the name Joseph Henry Chambers or J. H. Chambers has been found on the muster rolls of the 6th Regt., Texas Cavalry, 9th Texas Infantry or Martin's Regiment Texas Cavalry (also known as 5th Regt. of Texas Partisan Rangers), C. S. A. nor any record found of his capture or parole as of any of these organizations."

The application for pension of Mrs. Chambers was approved on the first part ~~part~~ of the above report on J. H. Chambers and also on affidavits.
