Enlisted for 12 months. Served under Capt W. H. Price until after the Battle of Shiloh. I then reenlisted and raised a company and reported to Genl R. B. Rodes. W. H. Forest Command. Served in that Command until the Surrender. Was in many skirmishes of which I will name a few that I call to memory. Battle of Athens. Pulaski Cross Bear Creek Ala. Moulton Ala. the same place I enlisted and also the last Battle that was fought by Genl Forest at Selma and through Ala to Montgomery. I was with Fortaine in Tenn attempting to catch a boy train when he was captured and I was captured all the Squad except myself on six men who took the desperate chances and made our escape. I can give no references as to my service in 7th Ala Reg Co I know of no one living.
