My eldest brother now living at Waco Tex served in the 3rd S.C.V. as Chaplain. The 2nd eldest was a private in Co C. 9th Ark, was wounded near Vicksburg, came home to S.C. & died in 1864. The other boy was a private in Hampton's Legion & died & now sleeps with our beloved dead in Hollywood Cemetery Richmond Va. My three brothers deserve much credit for what they did - I did but little but it was all I could do. I never failed to respond to a call to duty but I was never in a battle. E. J. M.
