

for the saddle is to wash the same carefuly in warm water and scap
and thoroughly clean and then after which I would give the saddle
a light coat of neetsfoot oil, not to much at first but rather a
light coat. Then in two or three weeks I would repeat the dose and
so on until the leather becomes theroughly plyant. You want to use
care in applying the oil as the dry leather at first will have a
tendency to take up to much, if so it would be a continual source of
annoyance in rubbing off on the cloths. After washing the saddle in
warm water let the leather get dry before you apply the oil and
then as stated above give the leather only a light oiling.

This is entirely a new field of work to us, but we are going to the limit to qualify ourselves to do efficient work, and at the same time will turn out attention to the making of Cavalry and Artillery saddles in case we are favored with a contract. We are unable at this time to give you the number of saddles that we will be able to make and the price, but will say that, we will make just as many saddles as our factory is capable of turning out, and will sidetract all other work to this end, and will make the price just as low as is consistant with good work. I will file a bid in the next few days, possible from Rock Island.
