MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING JULY 25, 1966

1271. The Board of Directors of Texas Technological College met in a special session at the Commodore-Perry Hotel, Austin, Texas, on Monday, July 25, 1966, at 1:30 p.m. The following Directors were present: Chairman McLaughlin, Vice Chairman Allison, Mr. Allen, Mr. Cash, Mr. Furr, Mr. Hinn and Mr. Martin. In addition, President Goodwin, President-elect Murray, Vice President for Academic Affairs Pearce, Vice President for Business Affairs Pennington, Comptroller Price, and Secretary Wells were present.

There were nine other individuals in attendance representing the architectural firm preparing the plans for a new Biology building; two members of the Biology Building Committee; and five other representatives from the College and the news media.

- 1272. Upon motion made by Mr. Cash, seconded by Mr. Martin, the Board by a unanimous vote, approved the Board Minutes of the Special Meeting of June 18, 1966.
- 1272A. Upon motion made by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Allison, the Board by a unanimous vote, approved the Board Minutes of the Special Meeting of June 22, 1966.
- 1273. Upon motion made by Mr. Allison, seconded by Mr. Allen, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the Agenda under the date of July 14, 1966. A copy of the Agenda is attached and made a part of the Minutes. (Items No. 1129 through No. 1270, Attachment No. 1; Items No. 5393 through Item No. 5719, Attachment No. 1A; Items No. 5720 through No. 5814, Attachment No. 1B; Minutes of Special Board Meeting on May 12, 1966, Item No. 5815 through No. 5823, Attachment No. 1C; and Items No. 5824 through No. 5885, Attachment No. 1D.)
- 1274. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Allison, the Board by a unanimous vote approved a request for the separation of the Department of Agronomy and Range Management into two departments as indicated; "The Department of Agronomy" and "The Department of Range Management". A copy of the request which will be presented to The Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 11.
- 1275. Upon motion made by Mr. Allen, seconded by Mr. Hinn, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the Small Class Report for the second term of the 1966 Summer School, and authorized the Chairman to sign for the Board. A copy of the report is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 59.
- 1276. Dr. William M. Pearce, Vice President for Academic Affairs gave a brief report on the course offerings by Texas Technological College. A copy of the report is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 56.
- 1277. Upon motion made by Mr. Allen, seconded by Mr. Furr, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the action of the Campus and Building Committee in awarding a contract to Bob Hunter Construction Company of Lubbock, the low bidder, in the approximate amount of \$11,437.88 for paving the north parking area at Jones Stadium; authorized the Chairman to sign the contract for the Board; and authorized the payment of the paving contract from Athletic Department funds. A copy of the contract is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 55.
- 1278. Mr. George Pierce, Architect, Houston, Texas, presented the preliminary plans for the proposed Biology Building. After a great deal of discussion on the exterior design the Board requested the Campus Planning Committee and the Campus and Building Committee to restudy the project and bring recommendations back to the Board on August 20, 1966.
- 1279. Upon motion made by Mr. Furr, seconded by Mr. Martin, the Board by a unanimous vote authorized the Campus and Building Committee and the Campus Planning Committee to select the site for the Central Heating and Cooling Plant.
- 1280. Upon motion made by Mr. Furr, seconded by Mr. Martin, the Board by a unanimous vote requested the architects and engineers to restudy the proposed site usage for the Central Heating and Cooling Plant and to make every effort to decrease the amount of land required for the project without detriment to the operation.

- 1281. Upon motion made by Mr. Furr, seconded by Mr. Martin, the Board by a unanimous vote, authorized Zumwalt and Vinther, Inc., Engineers, to begin the design phase for the Tunnels and Utilities Extension for the Dossie M. Wiggins Complex.
- 1282. Mr. M. L. Pennington, Vice President for Business Affairs, presented an up-to-date financial report on the present and proposed building program. The Board requested that such a report be presented to the Board at each meeting. A copy is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 37.
- 1283. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Martin, the Board by a unanimous vote fixed the amount of the funds from Constitutional Building Amendment funds for use in replacing the present Museum facilities at exactly \$500,000.00. This is a change in the previous action of the Board to replace the facilities to the extent of 36,000 square feet.
- 1284. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Martin, the Board by a unanimous vote authorized the Campus Planning Committee to proceed with the entry stations on a temporary basis and that the construction of permanent entry stations be deferred to allow the Traffic and Security Committee more time to study some of the problems of moving traffic.
- 1285. The Board approved the review of the Schematic Plans for Architecture and Allied Arts and for the School of Home Economics at the August Board Meeting.
- 1286. The Board approved the review of the schematic plans for the Law School at the August Board Meeting.
- 1287. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Allen, the Board by a unanimous vote awarded a contract in the amount of \$98,000.00 to the Anthony Company, Lubbock, Texas, the low bidder, for the Construction of Tunnels and Utilities Extension for the Foreign Languages-Mathematics Building. A copy of the bid tabulation is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 58. A copy of the contract is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 61.
- 1288. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Allen, the Board by a unanimous vote authorized Zumwalt and Vinther, Inc., Engineers, to begin the construction phase of the Tunnels and Utility Extensions required to service the Foreign Language-Mathematics Building under the terms of their contract dated December 23, 1965.
- 1289. The Board received an informational report on a proposed Institute for Research and Education in Human Resources and Rehabilitation.
- 1290. Upon motion made by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Allen, the Board authorized the Campus and Building Committee of the Board to award a contract for approximately 54,000 square feet of asphalt walks at an estimated cost of \$21,600.00 and approximately 32,000 square feet of concrete walks at an estimated cost of \$11,515.00, the amounts to be paid from appropriated funds, Texas Tech College Bookstore funds and funds for the temporary buildings. The tentative bid opening date is July 29, 1966.
- 1291. The Board voted to consider a request from the Southwestern Public Service Company for permission to route a power cable along Indiana Avenue on College property at the August Board Meeting.
- 1292. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the Campus Planning Committee's recommendation that the project architects for the Dossie M. Wiggins Complex be authorized to supervise the installation of the fixed kitchen equipment for a fee of one and two-tenths per cent (1.2%) of the cost of the total kitchen equipment less the amount of movable equipment and less the amount charged by Mr. Arthur W. Dana, consultant, under the terms of his contract.
- 1292A. The Board delayed any action on the Tunnels and Utilities Extensions required to service the Dossie M. Wiggins Complex pending the final site selection for the Central Heating and Cooling Plant.

- 1293. President Goodwin gave an informational report on recent action of the Coordinating Board on certain requests from Texas Technological College. A copy of a letter from Dr. Lester E. Harrell, Jr., Acting Commissioner of Higher Education to President Goodwin is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 60. (This letter covers the report given by Dr. Goodwin.)
- 1294. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Allison, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the following schedule for regular Board meetings for the period September 1, 1966, through August 31, 1967.

- 1297. Upon motion made by Mr. Allen, seconded by Mr. Furr, the Board authorized the Chairman to sign a permit to construct access driveway facilities on highway right-of-way located on the south side of U. S. Highway 82 (4th Street) and east of Boston Avenue (north end of Jones Stadium). A copy of the permit is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 53.
- 1298. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board by a unanimous vote approved incorporating in the Minutes for record purposes a copy of a letter from Frederick H. C., 20006, notifying the President of the action of the National Architectural Accrediting Board in accrediting the Department of Architecture and Allied Arts at Texas Technological College for the normal five year period. 1130. Appoint Mr. Ronald Nelson Brown as Acting Director of the Data Processing Department at an annual salary of \$7,800.00, effective July 8, 1966, through August 31, 1966, vice Mr. James M. Thomas, resigned. (Budgeted salary \$8,820.00 for 12 months; p. 26; Item No. 1.)

Journalism

1131. Incorporate in the Board Minutes for record purposes a copy of a letter from Mr. John E. Stempel, Secretary-Treasurer, American Council on Education for Journalism, Ernie Pyle Hall, Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana, 47405, notifying President Goodwin of the accreditation of the Texas Technological College Department of Journalism by the American Council on Education for Journalism. Title VI Grant, High Education Act of 1965

1132. Accept a grant in the amount of \$50,000.00 from the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D. C. 20202, for the improvement of undergraduate instruction in the following subjects: Biological, Physical, and Social Sciences; Engineering; English; the Arts; Education; and Campus-wide general use, effective June 17, 1966. This grant was awarded under the provisions of Part A, Title VI, Higher Education Act of 1965. Project No. (NIH-Ol-74840); Tex 6-0642. Texas Opportunity Plan Agreement

1133. Navy Lease NOy(R)-62769
1134. Approve an amendment to Lease NOy(R)-62769 to change the first sentence of 9. General Provisions, m. Additional Provisions, as follows: "It is agreed and understood by and between the parties hereto that this lease is made on the express condition that within three (3) years from the beginning date of this lease, 1 July 1965, the Government shall commence the construction of improvements upon the above described property, suitable for use by the U. S. Naval and Marine Corps Reserve Training Center."

The original terms of Lease NOy(R)-62769 specified that the Navy would begin construction of improvements upon the site within two years of the date of the lease, July 1, 1965. The amendment rewords the one paragraph in the lease to permit the Navy to begin construction of improvements on the site within three years of the date of the lease. The lease covers the property at the Fourth Street site.

Navy Lease NOy(R)-62769 (Continued) 1134. (Continued)

Lease NOy(R)-42272 on the Eighth and College Avenue site was extended to June 30, 1969, by the Board of Directors at the June 18, 1966, meeting because of the war conditions. 1. Texas Technological College Institution

- 2. Brief description of requested change: Change the present Department of Agronomy and Range Management into two departments, namely: The Department of Agronomy and the Department of Range and Wildlife Management. This change has been anticipated and proposed in the 8-year plan of 1964.
- 3. List degree programs and/or field of study affected by this change. Present degree programs will not be affected by this change. The creation of the two departments will require two department heads and separation budget allocations for the work in each department. The Agronomy Department will be administered by the present head of the Department of Agronomy and Range Management and a new Department Head will be appointed for the Department of Range and Wildlife Management.
- 4. Estimate the initial cost and the additional annual cost of this change and explain specific allocation of funds.
 - There will be little additional cost in separating the two departments over the normal increase of cost associated with the growth of the programs. The two areas are now situated in different buildings, and each has its own secretarial help.
 - The initial additional cost should not exceed \$2,000. This amount would be used primarily for office equipment, letterheads, etc. for the new department. The cost of annual maintenance and travel will not increase except as the program grows.
- 5. On an attached sheet, give the justification of the request including the study given the proposal and manner in which the proposed change will make more effective and efficient the operation of the instructional program.
 - Range Management is unique; it is neither a plant science nor an animal science. It is an ecological science, and as such, it has problems in many natural science fields. The unique position of range management as the science of wildland ecology sets it apart from many cultural agricultural fields. It is based on ecology of plants and animals, and any management of the range resource must consider animal yield, both wild and domestic.

No school in the country has exhibited as rapid a growth

in range management as has Texas Tech. The central location of the school in one of the major ranching areas provides ideal conditions for growth in both teaching and research. Likewise, it is the only major range school in the Great Plains proper, and will be expected to contribute, in increasing amounts, to the adapting of ecological principles to the particular plains environment.

The curriculum has grown from an option in Agronomy in 1959-60 with only 69 students in 3 courses to approved B.S. and M.S. programs in range management in 1965-66 with 498 students in 16 courses. A total of 101 students are enrolled in range curricula, making Texas Tech the second largest school in the nation in terms of range management majors.

The growth in the academic program is paralleled with growth in research activities. Prior to 1962, there was no major research effort in the range areas. Today there are projects involving 14 professional staff or research assistants. These projects involve projects at 6 locations from Amarillo to Sinton.

The increased growth of the range programs and the diversity of material now covered in the present department make administration of the combined programs unwieldy. Therefore, it is requested that the Range and Wildlife programs be expanded and administered separately.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

- 5. The Animal Husbandry Department reserves the right to publish the results of the investigations supported by this grant as it may deem desirable in the public interest and as practicable after completion of the research.

TRAFFIC AND PARKING

REGULATIONS

1966-1967

INTRODUCTION

Texas Technological College recognizes the use of a motor vehicle is a convenience and is not obligated to furnish unlimited parking space to accommodate all vehicles. It will, however, attempt to provide a reasonable amount of convenient parking spaces in keeping with resources and available sites. The College must hold students responsible for the proper registration,

The College must hold students responsible for the proper registration, use, and operation of their individual vehicle, as printed in the "Campus Traffic and Parking Regulations" booklet.

Parking and driving on the campus is a privilege, not a right. Violations of the privileges call for appropriate penalties.

1. VEHICLE REGULATIONS

- a. Every student who operates or parks a motor vehicle (automobile, motorcycle, mctorscooter, or motorbike) on the Texas Technological College campus must register his vehicle with the College before he is allowed to park on the campus. This includes students attending night classes. THE CAMPUS IS DEFINED AS THE AREA BEING FROM FOURTH STREET TO 19TH STREET AND FROM COLLEGE AVENUE WEST AS FAR AS THE COLLEGE PROPERTY EXTENDS.
- b. The registrant of the vehicle is held responsible for the safe operation and proper parking of his vehicle, regardless of who may be the driver or operator.
- c. Application for parking privileges may be secured beginning with registration for classes. The parking privilege permits will be attached in the proper place by the Traffic-Security Department. The parking permits should be affixed to the motor vehicle by the first day of classes. THIS IS DONE CONCURRENTLY WITH COLLEGE REGISTRATION.
- d. Students requiring the use of a motor vehicle after registering for any period, however short, must immediately register this motor vehicle before he is allowed to drive or park on the campus. THIS CAN BE DONE BY OBTAINING A SPECIAL TEMPORARY PARKING PERMIT AT THE TRAFFIC-SECURITY DEPARTMENT. SPECIAL PERMITS ARE AVAILABLE THROUGH THE TRAFFIC-SECURITY DEPARTMENT FOR CERTAIN DISABLED STUDENTS.

- e. A registration fee of \$11.00, valid for one year (Freshmen students-see 2g and 3a), is payable at the beginning of the Fall Semester for each vehicle registered and a fee will be charged for each replacement permit issued. Students who do not enroll in the Spring Semester may request a refund of \$5.50 of the original charge by having the permit scraped from the vehicle by the Traffic-Security Department. No refund will be given for the Fall Semester after the first day of classes. No refund will be given for the Spring Semester after two weeks from the first day of the Spring Semester classes. (NO REFUND WILL BE GIVEN IF THE REMNANTS OF THE PERMIT ARE NOT RETURNED.)
- f. A registration fee of \$3.00, valid for one year, for a motorcycle, a motorscooter, and a motorbike is payable at the beginning of the Fall Semester. Refunds will be given on the same basis as the paragraph above. (See map for two-wheel vehicle parking areas.)
- g. Students entering at the beginning of the first or second Summer term will be required to pay a \$2.00 vehicle registration fee for each vehicle registered and no refunds will be made. A fee will be charged for each replacement permit issued.
- h. Students entering at the beginning of the first or second Summer term will be required to pay a \$1.00 vehicle registration fee for each motorcycle, motorscooter, or motorbike registered and no refunds will be made. A fee will be charged for each replacement permit issued.
- (1) A fifty-cent fee will be charged for each replacement permit, when the remnants of the original permit are returned to the Traffic-Security Department.
 - (2) When the remnants of the original permit are not returned, the regular fee will be charged.
- j. Two students will not be permitted to register the same vehicle.
- k. Each registrant must present a valid driver's license at the time the parking privilege decal is issued.
- 1. No student will be allowed to register another student's vehicle under his or her name.

2. WHERE TO PARK

- a. Within the parking areas, a certain portion clearly marked is reserved for faculty, staff, visitors, and physically handicapped people.
- b. Between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. residence hall students' vehicles must remain in assigned areas except for moving off or onto the campus.

- c. Students living in Knapp, Horn, Drane, Doak, and Weeks residence halls must park in one of the following places:
 - (1) The area directly in front of Knapp.
 - (2) The area east of Drane and Horn.
 - (3) The area just west of Doak.
- d. Students living in Bledsoe, Gordon, Sneed, and West residence halls must park only in the large L-shaped areas, extending west of Gordon and Bledsoe residence halls, also, the parking lot east of Men's Gym except for the area designated for faculty and staff. An area west of West hall will be designated for girls living in West hall only.
- e. 1. Men students living in Thompson, Gaston, Carpenter, and Wells residence halls must park in the designated areas adjacent to these residence halls.
 - 2. Men students living in dorm # 10 must park in the area only north of their respective dorm which is designated in purple on the map.
 - 3. Women students living in dorm # 9 will park in the area north of their respective dorm which is designated in grey on the map.
- f. BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. OFF-CAMPUS STUDENTS MUST PARK IN THE AREAS DESIGNATED FOR OFF-CAMPUS USE. (REFER TO RED AREAS ON MAP.)
- g. Off-campus students and faculty and staff members may park on the Stadium-Coliseum-Auditorium parking lot with a valid off-campus parking permit.

 An agreement has been made with the Coliseum-Auditorium Board of the City of Lubbock to use the lot as long as the privilege is not abused and does not interfere with the normal use of the facilities. The first six single rows of parking space nearest to the Auditorium Coliseum (west end of parking lot) must be reserved at all times for the use of patrons who will have need to visit the facilities. On special occasions and upon notification from the manager of the Coliseum-Auditorium, the entire lot must be reserved for the use of patrons of the Coliseum-Auditorium for the time specified.
- h. The vehicle registration fee of \$7.00 for entering off-campus freshmen students is payable at the beginning of the Fall Semester for each vehicle registered and is valid for one year. A fee will be charged for each replacement.

 Off-campus freshmen students may park in the area east or west of Jones Stadium at any time with a valid freshman parking permit.
- i. Any freshman student is defined as any person with less than 32 semester hours of credit.

 The vehicle registration fee of \$11.00 for entering residence hall freshman students is payable at the beginning of the Fall Semester for each vehicle registered, valid for one year, and a fee will be charged for each replacement.
- j. Parking or driving on the turf at any time is prohibited.

- k. The area reserved for the President's Office is for the members' use from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- 1. BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. ANY STUDENT WITH A VALID PARKING PERMIT MAY PARK IN ANY DESIGNATED PARKING AREA ON CAMPUS EXCEPT FOR THE AREA MENTIONED IN THE PRECEDING PARAGRAPH.

3. RESERVED PARKING AREA

- a. Off-campus students who desire a designated reserved parking space may make application with the Traffic-Security Department at the beginning of registration on a first-come, first-served basis. (Residence hall and freshmen students will not be eligible for parking spaces in the reserved lots.)
- b. A \$20.00 charge plus \$11.00 vehicle registration fee for off-campus upper-class students, is payable at the beginning of the Fall Semester for a designated reserved parking space in the parking lot immediately north of the Agricultural Engineering Building, the parking lot south of the Library, the double parking lot west of the Business Administration Building and west of the Electrical Engineering Building, valid for nine months only. Students who do not enroll the Spring Semester may request a refund of one-half of the original charge by having the permit scraped from the vehicle by the Traffic-Security Department. No refund will be given after the first day of classes for the Fall Semester. No refund will be given for the Spring Semester after two weeks from the first day of Spring Semester classes. (No refund will be issued if the remnants of the permit are not returned.)
- c. An \$8.00 charge plus a \$2.00 vehicle registration fee for students, including off-campus freshmen, is payable at the beginning of the Summer Term for a designated reserved parking space in the parking lots immediately north of the Agricultural Engineering Building, the parking lot south of the Library, the double parking lot west of the Business Administration Building and west of the Electrical Engineering Building. Students who do not enroll the second Summer Term may request a refund of one-half of the original charge, of the reserved space only, by having the permit scraped from the vehicle by the Traffic-Security Department. No refund will be given for the first Summer Term after the first day of classes. No refund will be given for the second Summer Term after the fourth day of classes. (No refund will be issued if the remnants of the permit are not returned.)
- d. A charge of \$.75 will be paid to the Traffic-Security Department for a coded card key to operate the electric gates at the entrance and exits of the reserved parking lots. No refund will be made.
- e. Persons purchasing a designated reserved parking space will be restricted to this one parking space between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. weekdays and 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon Saturdays.

- f. Persons purchasing a designated reserved parking space will be guaranteed this space only from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. weekdays and 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon Saturdays. Reserved parking spaces will be open to anyone from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. weekdays and 12:00 noon Saturdays to 7:00 a.m. Mondays.
- Students who purchase designated reserved parking space and find an unauthorized vehicle parking in their designated space will park their vehicle directly behind the unauthorized vehicle and report same to the Traffic-Security Department. This unauthorized vehicle will then be impounded at the owner's expense.

4. GENERAL REGULATIONS

- Every person operating a vehicle on Texas Technological College campus is held responsible for obeying all College Rules and Regulations, City of Lubbock traffic ordinances, and State of Texas laws regulating traffic and parking on the campus.
- Improper mufflers and disturbances from starting and stopping a motor vehicle will constitute a violation for the operator and registrant.
- In all cases in which a car is parked, the position shall be such that the whole of the vehicle is located within the boundaries of the parking space. The fact that other vehicles are parked with impropriety shall not constitute an excuse for parking with any part of the car over the line.
- Violation tickets will be issued for infraction of the following regulations:

PARKING

- (1) Parking in staff areas.
- (2) Parking outside of designated area.
- (3) (4) Parking on turf -- impounding violation.
- Parking on the sidewalk -- impounding violation.
- Parking in any loading zone -- impounding violation.
- Parking in or upon any service drive -- impounding violation.
- (7) Parking in any manner which obstructs traffic -- impounding violation.
- (8) Parking in No Parking Zones -- impounding violation.
- Parking in a fire lane -- impounding violation. (9)
- (10) Parking on the campus and obstructing a trash container -impounding violation.
- Obstruction of any crosswalk -- impounding violation. (11)
- Violation of any posted sign -- impounding violation.

DRIVING

- (1) (2) Disregarding a stop sign.
- Disregarding a red light.
- Making a U-turn in a block between two intersections.
- Making a U-turn at a red light.

- Driving on the campus without a driver's license.
- Driving in an imprudent manner.
- Driving a vehicle into a barricaded area or parking in violation of any barricade or barrier -- impounding violation.
- Backing into an intersection.
- (8) (9) Exceeding the speed limit -- 20 miles per hour on the street and 10 miles per hour in parking lots.
- (10) Refusal to show driver's license upon request of a College Traffic-Security officer.
- Failure to display a proper permit. (11)
- Failure to stop or heed other instructions given by a (12)College Traffic-Security Officer.
- (13)Removing any temporary barricade.
- Violation tickets will be issued for infractions of the City of Lubbock ordinances and the State Uniform Traffic Code.
- A registrant operating more than one vehicle must register each f. vehicle separately.
- Towing and Impounding System: Any student or employee of the g. College violating any rule or regulation concerning parking on the campus will be subject to having his vehicle towed away and impounded. A clearance from the Traffic-Security Department must be secured before the vehicle is returned to the operator or owner.
- h. Any person operating a motor vehicle in a manner which endangers life and/or property on the campus of Texas Technological College will be issued a City citation for reckless driving and must appear at the Corporation Court, City of Lubbock, to take care of this ticket.

NOTICE

1. Any student who receives a parking ticket shall appear at the Traffic-Security Department within 72 hours to pay the reinstatement fee. Failure to appear shall constitute an additional violation and failure to pay any reinstatement fee shall constitute grounds for dismissal.

The schedule for reinstatement fees is as follows:

The seventh ticket shall constitute grounds for dismissal.

2. Any student receiving a ticket and believing this notice is unwarranted may report to the Traffic-Security Department within

- 72 hours and prepare a notice of appeal to be presented to the Appeals Board.
- Any student found guilty of removing a ticket from any vehicle not belonging to him or in his possession will be subject to disciplinary action and could be suspended from the College for his action.

5. REGULATIONS GOVERNING ENTRY STATIONS

- A. Students Allowed to Enter Entry Stations.
 - 1. Handicapped Students.
 - a. Handicapped students who require the use of a wheel chair or any other handicapped student will be required to furnish a letter from a licensed M.D. to the Traffic-Security Department to obtain a special parking permit that will allow them to gain entrance at the entry stations.
- B. Students With Temporary Illnesses.
 - 1. Students with temporary illnesses will be allowed to enter the entry stations for the purpose of going to the Infirmary for a period of two (2) hours only and will receive an Infirmary Pass at the entry station upon entry and will be required to have this pass signed by an M.D. or a registered nurse of the Infirmary and submit this pass to the officer at the entry station if between the hours of 7:15 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. Monday through Friday and 7:15 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. Saturdays. If the student leaves the Infirmary after 5:15 p.m. Monday through Friday or 11:15 a.m. Saturdays the Infirmary Pass will be mailed to the Traffic-Security Department by the Infirmary.
- C. Field Trips.
 - No student will be allowed to enter entry stations for the purpose of bringing his car to the inner part of the campus for field trips.
- D. Projects
 - 1. No student shall enter the inner part of the campus between the hours of 7:15 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. Monday through Friday or 7:15 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. Saturdays for the purpose of picking up or delivering projects to the Home Ec. Dept., Engineering Dept., or Radio Station, etc.
- E. Working Students.
 - No special parking permits will be issued for graduate students or undergraduate students for the inner part of the campus for the reason that he or she is working for any department that is located on the inner part of the campus.
- F. Business Firms and Business Firm Vehicles.
 - 1. No student car will enter the inner part of the campus between the hours of 7:15 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. Monday through Friday or 7:15 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. Saturdays for the purpose of delivering merchandise for a private business or doing any kind of work for a private business.

2. No student will be allowed to enter the inner part of the campus between the hours of 7:15 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. Monday through Friday or 7:15 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. Saturdays in any business vehicle for the purpose of attending classes.

SAFETY SUGGESTIONS

The pedestrian also must obey traffic regulations for his own safety. Half of all persons killed in traffic are pedestrians.

A pedestrian must not cross the street against a red light; nor cross the street in mid-block (jaywalk) within one block of any signal light. Stand on the sidewalk, not in the street when waiting for a signal light to change color.

Don't walk in the street or roadway. Where walking in the roadway is necessary, walk on the left side of the roadway facing oncoming traffic. This permits the pedestrian to see and avoid vehicles.

When walking after dark, wear light-colored apparel, preferably white, or carry some light-colored object.

After leaving a bus, the pedestrian should proceed to the sidewalk area unless the bus is stopped for a red light; then the pedestrian may cautiously proceed to cross with the green light.

HOW YOU MAY LOSE YOUR PRIVILEGE TO DRIVE ON THE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS OF TEXAS

Your license gives you the privilege of driving a motor vehicle on Texas streets and highways only so long as you do safely. If you break the driving laws of the State or Cities, or become incapable of driving, your license may be taken away.

The law requires that your license must be automatically suspended if a court finds you guilty of:

- 1. Killing or injuring anyone while driving.
- 2. Driving while drunk or drugged.
- 3. Any violation of the motor vehicle laws for which you could be sent to prison.
- 4. Hit-and-run driving.

Your license may also be suspended for as long as one year:

- 1. If the Department has reason to believe you have done any of the four things listed above.
- 2. If you cause a serious accident while you are driving, or if you fail to make a report to the Department of the accident.
- 3. If you become incompetent to drive.
- 4. If you are a habitual violator of traffic laws.
- If your driving record shows that you are habitually reckless, careless, or negligent in driving.
- If you let someone else use your license or make a false statement in your application, or violate a restriction placed on your license.

If you drive while your license is suspended, you may upon conviction be placed in jail for as long as six months and be required to pay a fine up to \$500.00. Upon such conviction, the suspension period will be extended for a like period as the original one.

Employee Vacations

The following excerpt is from House Bill No. 12, Fifty-ninth Legislature, Regular Session, 1965, Article V, Section 7:

"Sec. 7. EMPLOYEE VACATION AND LEAVES. a. Annual employees of the State shall, without deduction in salary, be entitled to a vacation that is equivalent to not more than one normal working day for each month of service, not to exceed a total vacation of two normal work weeks in any one fiscal year.

"Annual employees with fifteen (15) or more years of employment with the State shall be entitled to two normal work weeks plus three (3) additional normal working days of vacation in any one fiscal year.

"Total accumulated leave to any employee may never exceed the equivalent of his earned vacation entitlement for the preceding two-year period. No employee shall be allowed any paid vacation entitlement until he has had continuous employment with the State for six (6) months.

"In computing vacation time taken, time during which any employee is excused from work because of holidays, shall not be charged against the employee's vacation.

"If a State employee transfers directly from one State agency to another, he shall be entitled to credit with the newly employing agency for his accumulated but unused vacation entitlement, provided that his employment with the State is uninterrupted. No employee of the State shall be granted terminal annual or vacation leave subsequent to the effective day of the employee's resignation, dismissal, or separation from State employment."

(The Board has approved vacation time for annual employees of Texas Technological College in keeping with House Bill No.12.)

Dear Sir:

The Texas Highway Department hereby authorizes you to (re) construct facilities on the highway right of way for development of access to your property abutting Highway No. US 82 in Lubbock, Lubbock County, located south side of the roadway and east of Boston Avenue, provided you agree to and comply with the following conditions:

- Design of facilities shall be as follows and/or as shown on sketch:
 The barrier curb shown in red shall be installed within one week
 following the removal of existing curb as approved by this permit.
 All construction and materials shall be subject to inspection and
 approval by the State Highway Department.
- 2. Maintenance of facilities constructed hereunder shall be the responsibility of the grantee, and the State Highway Department reserves the right to require any changes, maintenance or repairs as may be necessary to provide protection of life or property on or adjacent to the highway. Changes in design will be made only with approval of the State Highway Department.
- 3. The grantee shall hold harmless the State Highway Commission and its duly appointed agents and employees against any action for personal injury or property damage sustained by reason of the exercise of this permit.
- 4. The grantee shall not erect any sign on or extending over any portion of the highway right of way, and vehicle service fixtures such as service pumps, vendor stands, tanks or water hydrants shall be located at least twelve (12) feet from the right of way line to insure that any vehicles serviced from these fixtures will be off of the highway.

This permit shall be subject to the concurrence of the municipality.

The State Highway Department will assist as follows: The driveway from Fourth Street shall be closed with a chain except immediately prior to and during football games and other special activities using Jones Stadium only.

The driveway from Boston Avenue shall be closed immediately prior to and during football games i.e. this driveway shall be closed when the one-way driveway from Fourth Street is open to traffic and may be open when the driveway from Fourth Street is closed.

If, at any time, this requirement is violated, the Texas Highway Department reserves the right to close the one-way driveway from Fourth Street by replacing the curb.

This permit shall not be valid until grantee signs the statement in which he agrees to comply with the conditions herein. Mr. G. C. Owen, Maint. Const. Foreman III, (Ph SH 4-8411) Box 771, Lubbock, Texas should be contacted at least twenty-four (24) hours before beginning the work authorized by this permit.

ACCESS DRIVEWAY REGULATIONS

The State Highway Commission, in recognition of its responsibility for the safety and utility of public highways under its jurisdiction, has directed the adoption of rules and regulations to accomplish a coordinated development between highways and abutting property. For this purpose, the booklet entitled "Regulations for Access Driveways to State Highways" was published and adopted, setting out Departmental policies to regulate construction and maintenance of access driveway facilities.

WHEREAS, the undersigned TEXAS NATIONAL BANK OF COMMERCE (hereinafter referred to as the Depository Bank), a banking corporation, duly incorporated and authorized by law to do a banking business in the State of Texas and now carrying on such business in said State and having its legal domicile at Houston, Texas, has been designated a depository bank by the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College for funds under the control of said Board of Directors or its successors in office, consisting of the funds of the academic institution, services and agencies now under the control or that may hereafter come under the control of said Board or its successors in office, hereinafter referred to as the College, to serve until this agreement has been cancelled in accordance with its provisions.

AND WHEREAS, all funds on deposit with the above named Depository Bank to the credit of said College shall be secured with bonds or other evidences of indebtedness of the United States of America or bonds of any state, county, city, town, independent school district, common school district, or any state college or university obligations issued under the State Constitutional Tax Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, KNOWN ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That the undersigned TEXAS NATIONAL BANK OF COMMERCE shall transfer and deliver unto the trustee Bank hereinafter provided for, bonds or other evidences of indebtedness of the United States of America or bonds of any state, county, city, town, independent school district, common school district, or any state college or university obligations issued under the State Constitutional Tax Act, sufficient to cover the funds of said College now on deposit or to be deposited with said Depository Bank by and on behalf of said College in an amount, either at par or market value whichever is the lower, equal to the amount of College funds which they secure.

The conditions of the aforesaid transfer are such that if the said Depository Bank shall faithfully discharge its duties and pay over on legal demand all funds deposited with it this date by and on behalf of said College together with the interest on all time deposits at the rate of 5-1/2% annually, payable as funds are withdrawn or at least semi-annually on funds which remain longer than six months, to the proper officer or officers of said College according to law, then the transfer of the securities named above shall be void; otherwise to be in full force and effect. All demand deposits due the College shall be paid by the Depository Bank on demand and all time deposits shall be paid by the Depository Bank upon thirty (30) days written notice.

The securities herein transferred shall be delivered to and held by the MORGAN GUARANTY TRUST COMPANY or any other State or National Bank to be mutually agreed upon, hereinafter referred to as Trustee Bank (or Custodian Bank) as Agent and Trustee for both parties hereto, subject to the joint written order of said Depository Bank and the Vice President for Business Affairs of Texas Technological College and shall be disposed of and delivered by the Trustee Bank holding same as Agent and Trustee only as directed by instrument in writing signed by both said Depository Bank and the Vice President for Business Affairs of Texas Technological College except as otherwise provided in the next paragraph of this Agreement.

In case said Depository Bank shall fail at any time to pay immediately and satisfy upon presentment any check or draft lawfully drawn upon any demand deposit, or shall fail at any time to pay and satisfy, when due, any check or draft lawfully drawn against any time deposit and the interest on such deposit then the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College or its successors in office, or any Officer of said College designated by the said Board of Directors or its successors in office shall have the right and power any time thereafter to sell all of said securities or such portion thereof, as may be necessary to produce the entire amount of money belonging to the College, then on deposit in said Depository Bank, together with all accrued interest. Such sale may be public or private, may be made in the City in which the Trustee Bank holding the securities as Agent or Trustee is located or elsewhere at the discretion of said Board of Directors or its successors in office, or any Officer

of said College designated by the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College or its successors in office and shall convey such securities absolutely to the purchaser thereof. No notice of such sale shall be necessary.

The Trustee Bank holding the securities hereinmentioned as Agent and Trustee is hereby specifically authorized to deliver same to the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College or its successors in office or any Officer of said College designated by said Board of Directors or its successors in office upon proper evidence that the Depository Bank has failed to pay and satisfy, upon presentment, any check or draft lawfully drawn upon any demand deposit or has failed to pay and satisfy, when due, any check or draft lawfully drawn against any time deposit and the interest on such time deposit.

It is distinctly understood that the Trustee Bank holding the securities as Agent and Trustee shall be under no other duty herein save to keep and preserve said securities and to dispose of and deliver same in accordance with the foregoing provisions.

It is understood and agreed that the said Depository Bank shall have the right of substitution of satisfactory securities subject to the approval of the Vice President for Business Affairs of the College.

In case the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College or its successors in office or any Officer of said College designated by said Board of Directors or its successors in office shall elect (as it or he may under this Agreement) to sell less than the entire amount of said securities, and such shall fail to yield sufficient money to pay unto the College the entire amount of money it has on deposit in said Depository Bank and the interest thereon, then the said Board of Directors of said Texas Technological College or its successors in office or Officer of said College may exercise such power of sale as often thereafter as may be necessary to produce sufficient money for such purposes.

It is fully understood that all usual and necessary expenses and commissions may be incurred by said Board of Directors of Texas Technological College or its successors in office or said Officer of the College in connection with such sale or sales. Any funds yielded from such sale or sales in excess of the amount necessary to pay the College the entire amount of money it has on deposit in said Depository Bank with all interest thereon and the expenses of sale or sales, shall be remitted by the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College or its successors in office or the Officer of said College designated by said Board of Directors to the said Depository Bank.

All powers conferred upon the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College or its successors in Office or any Officer of said College designated by said Board of Directors or its successors in office may be exercised by said Board or said Officer in respect to any additional or substituted securities which may be pledged by said Depository Bank to secure the funds of said College in pursuance of the provisions of this Agreement or of the laws of Texas.

It is understood and agreed that if during the term of this Agreement the total amount of all funds on deposit with said Depository Bank, by said College is reduced to below the total amount of the securities held by the College then and in that event the College will, upon written request of said Depository Bank, release an amount of securities equal to the difference between the total amount of funds on deposit and the total value, either par or market whichever is the lower, of the securities held, provided that no release will be executed for differences of less than Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars.

The Depository Bank hereby agrees to handle for collection, free of charge to the College, all cash items offered by the College for deposit except items on which the Depository Bank has to pay collection or exchange charges and agrees to keep for safekeeping without charge securities owned or held by the College and to collect such securities and the interest coupons without charge, when due. The Depository Bank further agrees to defray all charges of the Custodian Bank for accepting and holding the securities pledged to secure the College funds.

Either party of this Agreement shall have the right to terminate same by serving notice of its election so to do upon the other party and thereupon the said Agreement shall be void from and after the expiration of ninety (90) days after the service of such notice provided all provisions of this Agreement have been fulfilled.

THIS AGREEMENT IS TO TAKE EFFECT ON JULY 18, 1966, AND IS TO CONTINUE IN EFFECT UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 1967, OR UNTIL CANCELLED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOREGOING PROVISIONS.

THIS AGREEMENT made the 11 day of July, 1966, by and between the Board of Directors, Texas Technological College, Lubbock, Texas, acting herein by and through J. Edd McLaughlin, Ralls, Crosby County, Texas, Chairman of the Board, hereinafter called the Owner, and Bob R. Hunter Construction Company, Lubbock, Lubbock County, Texas, hereinafter called the Contractor.

WITNESSETH, that the Owner and Contractor for the considerations hereinafter named agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1. SCOPE OF THE WORK - The Contractor shall furnish all labor, superintendence, materials, machinery, equipment and tools and shall perform all the work to construct Parking Lot North of Jones Stadium, as described in the specifications and as shown on the drawings and as noted in the Notice to Bidders form prepared by the Office of the Landscape Architect, Texas Technological College; all in accordance with the contract document.

ARTICLE 2. CONTRACT SUM - The Owner shall pay the Contractor for full performance of the contract the sum per unit of work done:

- 1. Pavement, including subgrading, 6" compact caliche base, including removal of existing surface and application of double asphalt surface, complete in place, per square yard. One dollar and six cents (\$1.06).
- 2. Reinforced concrete curb and gutter, 24" width, complete in place, per lin. ft. Two dollars and eighteen cents (\$2.18).
- Concrete entrance slabs, 6" thick, complete in place, per sq. ft. Fifty-six cents (\$.56).
- 4. Concrete parking slabs, 6" thick, complete in place, per sq. ft. Fifty-six cents (\$.56).
- 5. Removal of concrete pre-stressed parking islands from present location and relocation upon finished asphalt surface, complete in place, per parking island. Three dollars and thirty-eight cents (\$3.38).
- Removal of 8' cyclone fence and gates from present location and relocation upon finished asphalt surface, complete in place, per lin. ft. One dollar and forty-three cents (\$1.43).
- Fence, 8' cyclone, to match existing fence, complete in place, per lin. ft. Three dollars and forty cents (\$3.40).

- 8. Topsoil, good quality, free of caliche, stones, and other debris, complete in place, per truck yard. One dollar and forty-one cents (\$1.41).
- 9. Concrete removal, including removal of existing curb, gutter, and other concrete and hauling from college campus, per lin. ft. One dollar and thirteen cents (\$1.13).

Based on quantities provided in the drawings and specifications, the estimated contract amount is Eleven Thousand Four Hundred Thirty-seven and 88/100 Dollars (\$11,437.88) which sum consists of Four Thousand Eight Hundred Three and 91/100 Dollars (\$4,803.91) for materials and Six Thousand Six Hundred Thirty-three and 97/100 Dollars (\$6,633.97) for labor costs.

ARTICLE 3. COMPLETION OF THE CONTRACT - Work shall begin no sooner than July 25, 1966, but no later than July 29, 1966, weather permitting and will continue uninterrupted as weather and season permit until completion. Completion date to be no later than August 31, 1966.

ARTICLE 4. BOND - The Contractor shall provide to the Owner a performance bond in the amount of One Hundred (100) percent of the contract sum, without recourse, to the State of Texas, covering the faithful performance of the contract and the payment of all obligations arising thereunder.

ARTICLE 5. ACCEPTANCE AND FINAL PAYMENT - The Owner shall, upon completion of the work, make such payment within Thirty (30) days after acceptance by the Owner as will be necessary to complete the total payment of the contract, provided that the contract be then fully performed.

Under the provisions of Section 11, H.B. 1, 59th Legislature, each state-supported institution of higher education is required to submit to the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, an annual report of the courses (with description of content, scope and prerequisites) which that institution will offer in the following academic year. The Coordinating Board may approve, or order the deletion or consolidation of any courses so submitted after giving due notice with reasons therefor and after providing a hearing if one is requested by the governing board involved.

In carrying out the charge given to it by the aforementioned statute, the Coordinating Board requested each institution to file its list of courses on April 1, 1966.

The official list submitted by Texas Technological College contained the following:

THAT THIS LEASE CONTRACT is entered into by and between TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE, an institution of higher learning of the State of Texas,
located at Lubbock in Lubbock County, Texas, hereinafter called LESSOR and
PORT COMPRESS AND WAREHOUSE COMPANY, a Texas corporation, with principal
offices at Brownsville, Cameron County, Texas, hereinafter called LESSEE;

WITNESSETH:

For and in consideration of the following stated rentals, to-wit:

- (1). Two Cents (2¢) per bale per month for cotton or \$5.00 per Igloo per month, whichever is greater, and/or
- Six and No/100 (\$6.00) Dollars per month per Igloo for other commodities;

said rental payable quarterly, on or before the last day of each month following the close of business of each calendar quarter (viz: March 31; June 30; September 30; December 31); LESSOR does hereby LEASE to LESSEE and LESSEE does hereby LEASE from LESSOR up to Ninety-Six (96) IGLOOS as is where is located at TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE RESEARCH FARM, Pantex, Texas, for a term of twelve (12) months from date, further giving and granting to LESSEE an option to renew and extend this lease for one (1) additional term of twelve (12) months beginning at the termination of the primary term hereof for the same consideration and subject to the same terms as herein provided.

LESSEE shall be privileged to make revisions at its own cost and expense; but at the end or termination of this Lease shall be obligated, also at its own cost and expense, to restore to original conditions Igloos that may have been changed or modified, at the option of LESSOR. LESSEE also agrees to make any repairs necessary for its requirements, at its own cost and expense, and to keep and maintain the premises covered hereby in a good state of repair and to take good care thereof and suffer no waste; and at the end or other termination of this Lease, to surrender back to LESSOR, or to whomsoever it may designate, or to LESSOR's assignee, peaceable possession of the leased premises in as good condition as the same are at the time LESSEE takes possession thereof, ordinary wear and tear and damage by fire and/or the elements alone excepted.

There is a large system of roads through LESSOR's property, leading into the plant to the igloos, which roads and the surface thereof are owned by LESSOR. It is agreed that the LESSEE shall have the right to ingress and egress over such roads to and from the igloos that it leases and between such facilities and trackage for loading and unloading purposes. In this connection, it is contemplated that LESSEE may use trucks to haul its material and equipment over said roads. Should there result any damage, beyond ordinary wear and tear, to such roads by reason of LESSEE's hauling its material by trucks, LESSEE shall be responsible for the repair of such roads, so as to restore them to as good condition as they were at the time of the beginning of LESSEE's use, or LESSEE may pay LESSOR the reasonable value of such repairs. Also, in this connection, it is agreed that a representative of LESSOR and a representative of the LESSEE shall inspect all of such roads, as well as all rental facilities, prior to the beginning of LESSEE's use thereof, for the purpose of appraising, determining and agreeing upon their condition at the beginning of such use.

LESSEE agrees to hold LESSOR harmless from loss or damage to property due to LESSEE's occupancy.

It is however, specially understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that LESSOR shall have the right to terminate this lease, without further obligation to LESSEE in the event that LESSEE shall be unable to obtain, for storage, cotton from the COMMODITY CREDIT CORPORATION by November 15, 1966.
