²<u>Temel</u> is the most popular male name among Lazes in folktales and, to a somewhat lesser degree, in real life. For many Turks the word <u>Temel</u> is almost synonymous with the word <u>Laz</u>. The name is also occasionally used elsewhere in Turkey. Story
