The records show that $\underline{\text{Alfred}}$ $\underline{\text{H}}_{\bullet}$ Sadler, not found as Albert Hubert Sadler, private, Company D, 26th Regiment Arkansas Infantry, Confederate States Army, enlisted May 12, 1862, at Centreville, Bradley County, Arkansas, for three years or the War. Muster roll for August 12, 1862, shows him promoted to Corporal July 5, 1862. Muster roll for May and June, 1863, shows him present. His name is not borne on the Muster roll for January and February, 1864, only subsequent roll on file.

The records show that D.M. Saddler, also shown as D.M. Sadler, not found as Dupre Sadler, private, Company C, 11th Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army, enlisted February 25, 1862, at Washington County, Arkansas, Muster roll for January and February, 1864, last roll on file, shows him present. No later record found.
