To Note Holders Under Second Mortgage Deed of Trust of Motor Fuels Corporation

Gentlemen:

Pursuant to our request of last November, you have agreed to defer the payment of interest due last November 20th until May 20, 1941, so that now twelve months' interest will be due May 20, 1941. The purpose of this letter is to request you to consent to a further extension of all such interest until the next payment date, to-wit, November 20, 1941. We would not make this request if we did not believe that it is absolutely necessary in order to permit the continued operation of the company.

For the past ten months, the company has operated at a loss due to the fact we were unable to secure for the finished products a sufficient amount to cover costs of raw materials and manufacturing costs. This operation naturally decreased working capital, to such an extent that during March of this year it was necessary to borrow additional money on inventories in order to keep the plant in operation. However, during the past ten months, the management of the company has been able to maintain the plant in first class condition and we are now pleased to advise that increased price on petroleum products are such that we can now see our way clear to make a fairly definite statement that we are in a position to make some profit, and we anticipate further increases in price of petroleum products, therefore, we are quite encouraged as to the future possibilities.

We have sufficient working capital on hand to keep the plant in operation provided we can secure the cooperation of the mortgage note holders as herein requested. The first mortgage class "A" and class "B" note holders have agreed to defer all payments of interest for a period of six months from May 20th, 1941, provided a similar agreement is had from the second mortgage holders. In the meantime it is hoped that conditions will continue to improve, thereby giving the company an opportunity to pay its interest obligations coming due November 20th, 1941.

It is requested that you consent to an extension of the date of payment of all interest due May 20th, 1941, until the next payment date November 20th, 1941, or sooner should the management determine it would not be adverse to the best interest of the company and the note holders. As previously stated, the first mortgage note holders have consented and it is felt you will not withhold your consent after giving due consideration of the many difficuties that have confronted the management in the operation of this refinery, and the progress they have made towards placing the company in a position to take advantage of the future possibilities of increased earnings, which we believe to be very bright, thus insuring all noteholders of the ultimate realization on their notes.

Enclosed herewith is an extension agreement and should appreciate your signing same and returning at the earliest possible date in the stamped addressed envelope enclosed.




