ECLIPSES IN 1869.

- There will be four eclipses this year:
- I. A partial eclipse of the Moon, January 27th, in the evening, visible. Beginning at New York at 7.32 P. M.; largest, 8.42 P. M.; end at 9.52 P. M. Size, $\frac{1}{2}$ digit.
 - II. A partial eclipse of the Sun, February 11th, invisible in North America.
 - III. A partial eclipse of the Moon, July 23d, invisible in North America.
 - IV. A total eclipse of the Sun, August 7th, in the afternoon; visible in the Northern States as a *partial* eclipse. It begins in New York City at 5.12 o'clock, and ends at sunset. Size when largest, 10 digits.

VENUS will be Morning Star until May 9th, then Evening Star. MARS will be Evening Star all the year. JUPITER will be Evening Star until April 17th, then Morning Star to August 12th, and evening Star the rest of the year. SATURN will be Morning Star until March 7th, then Evening Star to December 11th.
