The soundtrack album is a mixture of disco pop and country orientated tracks. I suppose the idea is, that, <sup>if</sup> you cater for a number of musical tastes, then you increase the potential audience.

None of the performers on this George Martin produced album are particularly well known, except for Roger Cook whose forte' is really composing. Beverly D'Angelo who plays the town nymphomaniac in the film, sings one track, as does Paul Jabara, who plays one of the citizens.
