Big Brass Bed - Bio

In terms of that post nineteen-sixties science *Dylanology* and the tandem lyrical cult *Zimmerism*, the three words *Big Brass Bed* are derived from the opening line of the Bob Dylan composition "Lay Lady Lay" which appeared on this son of Minnesota's April 9th 1969 released *comeback* album "Nashville Skyline."

In terms of a aggregation of musicians, Big Brass Bed, is a Florida based quintet, and the original line-up featured James London [guitar, vocals], Tom D'Angelo [bass], Mike Kerrigan [keyboards], Bill Meredith [drums] and founder Rod MacDonald guitar, harmonica, vocals]. MacDonald is a onetime NYC based solo singer/songwriter and his Biography can be found elsewhere on the Folkwax site. D'Angelo played on the band's album, but subsequently relocated to New York and then Nashville, and these days Mike Kerrigan fills the bass slot.

The band was formed by MacDonald during January 2002 and has only, to date, performed in Florida, mainly in and around Palm Beach County. The band made its debut at the Bamboo Room in Lake Worth, Florida during March 2002. Their eleven-track debut recording "**A Few Dylan Songs**" was released on the Soltice Record label in 1st September 2003.
