(both of Ft Worth) I was with my command and took part in the battles of Perryville Ky and Murfreesboro Ten as well as many other minor engagements - too numerous to mention

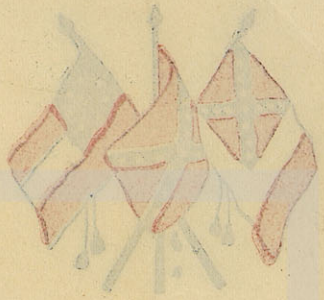
I was with Gen Morgan on his famous Raid through Ky. Ind. & Ohio. Was captured on said raid, about 100 miles above Cincinnati on the Ohio river at a little place known as Cheshire. Almost the entire command surrendering at the same time was imprisoned, first at Camp Chase - soon afterwards removed to Camp Douglas Chicago Ill. From the latter prison I made my escape on the night of Oct 3rd - made my way to Canada reaching the latter country Oct 5th 1863 - Reported to our Confederate Agents.
