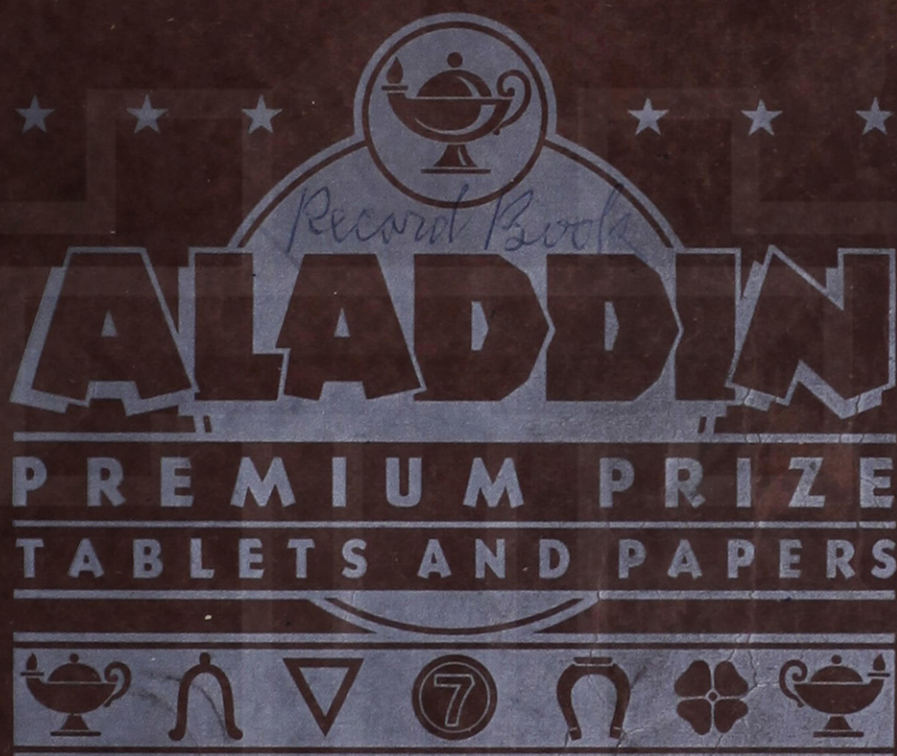
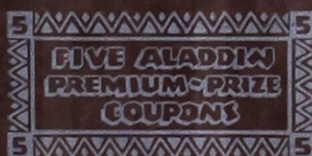

1. Cloudy. Misty. M. 38°. Mama slept well near all night. I got up at near 5 A.M. Lit all fires.

I got up before 6 A.M. Orlean up then cooked breakfast. Lawrence came.

Then Ed. & Vivian. Then Treab came. Brought chicken & dumplings. Mrs. Rudder came.

2. Cloudy. M. 44°. I heard the clock strike 7 O'clock. I got up. Lit the stoves in front room, our bed room and the cook stove. Now 7:40 A.M.

Orlean cooked breakfast. Mama ate a little breakfast. Sat up to do so.

Orlean dressing up. Beal & Freda came near 10 A.M. Then Dr. Smith came. Never changed ^{the} medicine.

Gave no more capsules or tablets.

Sun shining. No wind.

3 Cloudy. M. 21°. Ice ⁱⁿ I lit stoves at 1:30.

Orlean up soon. Orlean cooked breakfast. I set the table.

Orlean took mama's b. to her. She ate.

Sam & Marie came. Later Oscar came. I finished washing the dishes. Mama & I put \$15.00 aside for this month. (\$80.00 + \$11.38 = Total \$410.38.

I put up my tithe (\$3.00) for Jan. 17,

Jan. 24, Jan. 31 & for Sun. Feb. 7.

Mama lay down - then Orlean.

I lay down on lounge. Never napped. Index came near 4 P.M.

9. Cloudy, Foggy. M. 45. Up after 7 A.M. Mama up later - ate some breakfast. Mrs. Whitley came. Orlean fried more peach pies. yum, yum!

Edwin & Joel came after Orlean.

L.A. & Minnie & Mary Alice came.

All left near 2 P.M. Mama to try to sleep. She slept some.

10 Clear M. 70° at 8:40. No wind.

Alice up. Very tottery - but came to the table. Ate very little.

11. Mrs. Rudder came. Emmet & I my brought Agnes to see us.

Came after her later. Rained a tub & full in the early morning. Then again at 9:30. Sun peeping out. Alice set up a little while. Could hardly walk back to the bed. Been asleep for some time. Minnie called. Empty trash cans. Mrs. Rudder came. near 10:15. Alice still asleep. Over

Gave Mama her last dose of medicine.

14. Clear. M. 50°. Mama ate a little breakfast. I burned my rolls! Mrs. Whitley came. Mama sitting up. I taxied to town. Mrs. Whitley stayed with mama. I got back near 10:30 A.M. A norther on hand. Forecast was for 26° to nite. Mama lay down. Slept over an hour & wake at 4 P.M. Beal & Thelma came.

Thelma fixed supper. We all ate supper together. They left at 7 P.M.

15. Clear. M. 36°. I got thru with my breakfast & dish washing & mopping by 9 A.M. Heard part of Thelma's talk.

Alice sat up a while, but would not eat a bite. Alice went to sleep. Mrs. Whitley came. I called Nazareth. Left word for Dr. Smith to call when he comes there (Expected to be there sometime today. (9:30 now.) Alice still asleep.
