As stated was first a member of Co A 2nd La inf -then after after a
 years service in Va enlisted in co C 9th La regt inf - was wounded
 at Hamiltons crossing before Fredericksburg on 13th december '62
 was in battles of Port Republic Cross Keys Cold Harbor and Malvern
 Hill &c various other skirmishes including a battle at culpepper
 court house driving back the advancing federals -while this last
 is put down as a skirmish it was a pretty fair sized battle- was al
 so in the battle of Winchester under Early in 1864- Was made captain
 of ordinance on 4th of March 1865 at Waynesboro Va 12 miles from
 Staunton, I was ordinance sergeant before that under Wm Allan chief
 of ordinance army of Northern Va and as such acted as Captain of or
 dance at Gettysburg before promotion in 1865,
