- Mon 10 I think it rained near all 'nite. How ever it rained, so my thinking the hardest of the season. I helped Jon. Webb put up a wind mill or change his mill in A.M. We lay around house in P.M.
- Tue 11 To wt to work in field. Bud broke sod afternoon.
- Wed 12 Bud broke sod. I fixed up some fence in for noon. I helped Jeff Webb on his house. Bud hauled gravel from town. Made two loads.
- Thur 13 I worked all day on Webb house and hauled gravel till noon. He finished the sod in P.M. sure was hot, that is what we need now. Some hot weather. I think I will send Bud to Mr. Remey for H. & S. and wife and kids. He wants to come back out here.
- Fri 14 I worked all day at Webb's. Bud plowed out middles in cotton. we have quite a crowd here to-nite: Mr & Mrs Newton Mrs Jimmie Drake Della & F.A. her kids. One of Sallies Uncles a Mr A. J. Jackson from Skerres. Tex. Sam Osborne & one of his nephews. We did not know they were coming out any of them.
- Sat 15 we went up town in fore noon. That is a part of us. in for noon. Back home had dinner. we all went up to Mule-shor in P.M. Back home about dark the old lady Newton was mad and slinging that same old dope.

Sunday Aug 16 1925

Sun 16 Osborne, Jackson, Newton & I went to Bulak, Pep, Swelland, Littlefield and back home. Was a long tired drive.

Mon 17 The Thompsons boys came by and we all went out to look at some more land. We got back home about 12. We had Bill Thompson with us for dinner today.

In afternoon, Thompson, Jackson, Osborne, Newton, Mrs Drake and I went down to the White face land back home just about 5:30.

Tues 18 Newton & wife, Jackson and I went up town to get our inter tube.

Newton made a deal to fence the labors of land north of me. We went up in P.M. & he bought the post & wire. will run the line of fence soon. on the west side that will give me a nice bunch of grass. He (Newton) furnishes the fence, and I look after it. we split 50.50. Osborne & Luther left this AM.

Wed 19 We were up by 4 A.M. The folks left about 6.30 A.M. It was a little lonesome. we all had a sleep after they left. We picked a bunch of snap beans. would not mind seeing a shower to wet the top of ground. The Bulak post Master brought out my mail for the first time today.

Thurs 20 We did not do any work today. would like to see a nice little rain. would help things some.

Friday August 21, 1925.

Fri 21 about the same as yesterday, came up a cloud but did not rain any. Fell a good rain east of here. We decided to go down to see mother and Dad. I fenced the land north of me. we put up a little more than 1/2 mile of fence by noon. Mr Newton did not get enough part. I had to send Buf for some more part. Tightened up the fence on north side of field.

Sat 22. We started for Scurry Co about 8 A.M. I stopped at Littlefield had to get some money. We made the run to Dad's arriving there about 5 P.M. Things are sure dry down there. They were not looking for us. Mother was out gathering peas. Dad was reading on the front porch.

They both look well.

Sun 23 Tom Martin and Octave came over we went down to see oil well on one Henry Newman's place. The girls and Billie went home with them.

Mon 24. We all went over to Tom's place for the day. Came a rain between Tom's and Dad's. We had a few watermelons.

Tues 25 We were up and made ready to start home early. Mother gave us 6 pullets and a rooster. Rhode I Reds. They are fine chicks. We got home before 'nite had one blow out as we left the highway near Anheast. Found Buf O.K. he had patched while we were gone.

Wednesday Aug 26 1925

Wed 26 Thick cloudy. Rained some at different times to-day. The early maize is needing rain. The cotton looks good. I had to punish Dorothy & Bill for going up to Morgan's. They did not think I would whip them. I sure did hate too. I do not like to have to whip children. I do not believe in the whip. But it seems like they would not mind at all. Hope I will never have to repeat it. It makes me feel bad. A little cool to 'nite' and damp. It has not rained much yet. But think will rain before morning.

Thurs 27 Still cloudy, but does not rain. would like to see a good rain. We have nothing to do now, but set, about the house, we have lots of garden truck. I have picked a few black eyed peas. will have lots of them soon.

Fri 28 About the same thing as yesterday. Mr Walker came down to see about pasturing 4 head of mules. They sent them down in for noon. My early feed is needing rain. Seems like the rain some two weeks ago, did not do much good. Cotton is doing fine, and late feed.

Sat. 29 We went up town in for noon. But 29 we took some turnip greens & peas. Left them at Broyles & Reynolds. Came back home and went back to town in P.M. Came a little rain.

Sun 30 I went out to see some land out on the Haddaway Ranch. I think I will buy a tract of it. \$30.00 per A. Sallie, Billie and I went down to Mr Wilsons in P.M.

Monday Aug. 31, 1925.

Mon 31 Bud and I went up town, made trade for 177 $\frac{1}{2}$ a. of the Haddaway land, at \$30⁰⁰ per a. Bud and I went out to give it the once over. I think it is awful good dirt. Looks good to me. Fuel stuff is doing well would like to see a rain, I think would help feed.

Tuesday September 1, 1925.

Tues 1 we stayed at home till after noon. Bud & I went up town, I closed up the trade for the land. I got some hauling to do from Plainview. Can pay my gro. bill that way. I saw Mr Webb about a place he has.

Wed 2 Bud, Billy and I started for Plainview about 7 AM. We were in P. V. by 11:30. Did not get loaded and started till 2:30 P.M. We back home by 7. Made about \$12⁰⁰ out-trip.

Thurs 3 we took some tomatoes up town. Called Katsell put 10#. Got my abstract to land & barge from the Haddaway ranch. I believe I could sell that land now for a \$5⁰⁰. But I want to keep it. Had to go over to Shugarts for my Nancy mule. Cant keep her in P. No rain yet. would like to see a good rain.

Fri 4 we did not do any thing. Only started cellar. I wrote to Mr Newton about getting lumber to fix up some corals and sheds and I will get lumber for the cellar while I am at it.

Sat 5 we worked on cellar in p.m. Sallie went to town in p.m. for some school supplies.

Sunday Sept. 6, 1925.

Sun 6 was about noon in for noon, we all went out to see the place I bought they seem to like it fine.

I think the sandy land is the choice land here, as in other parts of the State. Came a shower while we were gone. Not enough to do any good. Had letter from D.L.S. He is sure wanting to come home. I would send for him if I had the money.

Mon 7. We took some tomatoes my town and some okra, sold near all the tomatoes. School started to day. The kids started. I did not want to buy them out a single day. Hope they do well in their school work.

Tues 8. we worked on cellar. Bud took some tomatoes to town, Mr Walker came down just at dark, told me the mules were out. Bud and I went to Mr Fords he had them in his lot. could not get them home, so we left them there.

wed 9 we went over and rescued my four together and two of walhers mules and I finally got them home.

Bud went on to Littlefield for a mixer for John Webb. getting back about noon.

Mr Newton, Bob Drake and Lee and each from Oklahoma arrived just at dark. They had a car wreck just before they got to Swarrugen near Paducah in Cattle county

Glen Watson at Olton or near Olton.
He was the worst hurt.
Too much corn.

Thur 10 We all went up to my place in
for noon. Came by Ludaw, on home
had dinner, then we went to
Littlefield in p.m. came a good
rain down there, but did not
rain much at home. Came a
north wind that was real cool.

Fri 11 They started home. Newton and
Drake did not want to go today.
But Ad each was on nettles to
be on his way. Bud went to
huff with on some cement work
will get some lumber for a shed
and crib. The little rain will
not do feed much good. Altho we
did not need it on cotton.

Sat 12 I took some tomatoes, Turnip greens,
okra up town sold out at one place
took back lumber for cellar, cut
and put top on. Bud hauled out
two loads lumber for sheds.

Harold came in just at 'nite',
was not expecting him. Looks rainey.

Sun 13 Sure did rain during 'nite'. The field
is wet. all of the opinion will not
do cotton any good. Has rained of and
on all day. Has fell at least 1.5"
rain since last p.m. was over in
Mr Wingo's cotton. he has some fine
cotton if the bale worms do not eat
it up. Quite a few in it. Had
will have to go and see if I have
any. The boys put the starter on the truck

Monday Sept. 14, 1925.

- Mon. 14. Rained near all nite. We walked over the field. The corn and maize is all down. The water covered the whole field.
- Tues. 15. It came another hard rain last nite. started the shed and crib. We worked all day on it. The roads are all in a bad shape.
- wed. 16. Bud went to Webbs to help him on his concrete work. Harold & I worked on the shed. Had to go to town for some more nails. Lallie picked some beans on the east side of field. They made good. Will not get as many as we thought we would. Mr Ford came over to see if I would take a few melons on the 50, 50 plan. I do not think I could make any thing out of them. So many melons in the country.
- Thur 17. I pulled a few pea vines. Beans & picked some beans. The boys went up to Mr Fords loaded up 79 melons. we went up to town to the show. they had a good play on.
- Fri 18. we went to Plainview sold the melons for \$11.05 I saw the dentist made date with him for next Tuesday. Dad, Mother and Tom Martins family came up. we got back home about sun set. Lightning in the west now 12:03 A.M. Bud & I papered one room for Webb.
- Sat 19. Was cloudy when we got up. Tom decided they had better go home while the ground was dry. Was afraid would rain. We finished Webbs dinner. (Papering) We thrashed beans. Rainy, baking.

Sunday Sept. 20, 1925
 Sun 20 was rainy looking all day. We went up to Sudan to an all time singing. Started a little rain before we came home. The daddy rain started falling about 10 P.M. and believe me it sure did "Pour it on"

Mon 21 we took down the fence, that I put up on the vacant labor. I could not use it to much risk to take, started on stack lot. another hard rain.

Tues 22 We finished the stack lot. came up a cool spell. Sallie put up the heater. Killed Jimmie's little chicken by killing a stove pipe fall. Started raining again by late bed time.

Wed 23 I think it rained near all night and fell an awful hard rain about 9³⁰ A.M. We have been by the stove all day. wet & cool. would hate to see a freeze. would fix things up in bad shape.

Thur 24 We finished wagon bed & sled. cut some feed to take to Sudan to fair.

Fri. 25 Harold took some cotton & Hygiene Sallie took some pepper shirt and some sheets, put them on display at the Lamb county fair. They came back at noon. We all went up in the afternoon. They sure did have a fine collection of exhibits. I guess that is the way to sell it.

Sat 26 I shelled and picked peas in for noon the folks went up to the fair. We all went in P.M. stayed till after nite.

Sunday, Sept 27 1925

Sun 27. We walked over cotton to see if we had a bale opened. Did not think so. Mrs Webb called on Lallie in p.m. The boys & I went up to the new place. Had a few watermelons. Nice clear and cool.

Mon 28 Was cloudy and sprinkling rain all for noon. We cut 3 loads maize to day. Some of it is a little green, and damp. would heat if it was baled up. will have to stock Newtons rent in stock lot. Sent Walker word to come for his mules. His month is out today.

Tues 29 Walker came down for his mules. We cut feed till noon. Sent Bud for some pick sacks. He got the ready made sacks 76 duck. We picked cotton in p.m. Not much opened.

Wed 30 We cut feed in for noon. Picked cotton in p.m. The dew is just like a rain.

Thursday October 1 1925

Thur 1 We cut feed all day.

Fri 2

Sat 3

Harold took a load of maize to town sold it for \$14.00 per ton. He took a load for Bud that sold for \$16.50 Not so bad for green maize. Harold sent money to McKinney for Billie to start for Sweetwater Sunday. He and Bud will meet her. Jones started cutting my cane. Not doing much of a job. Came to sappy and tangled so bad.

- Sunday Oct. 4. 1925
- Sun 4 H.S. & Bud started for Sweetwater to meet Billie. I fixed some hinges on my barn door. Came up a cool snap. Temp. fell 10°
My teeth are hurting me tonight. I pulled a jaw tooth last night. Was out in my young feed this P.M. sure is fine. Hope dose not freeze.
- Mon 5. was a stew rain falling this A.M. I shocked up some cane, that was cut down Sat. P.M. the boys came in about 6 P.M. Billie and Jr. and the little Grand Son.
- Tues 6 We cut maize all day.
- Wed 7 " " " " " "
- Thur 8 Was rainy all day. Cold we covered the maize pile with cane. Finished the cow shed. Cold.
- Fri 9 Bad day. Cold and rainy. Had to take kids to school was up to late for truck. We finished pulling the pear got wagon load and shed full. sent plan to town to have goat fixed. Will show some soon. shocked up Bab. cane. Was wet.
- Sat 10 Cold and misty all day. We moved Harold home up to my place, (or Mr Newton's place) so he would be near the water. was no job much.
- Sun 11 Cold. But not so bad as yesterday. I made stide to cut feed with.
- Mon 12 We cut some feed. picked some cotton. Harold took a load of maize to town. Bought some Gro. and other things. They moved to them selves to day.

Tuesday Oct 13. 1925.

- Tues 13 we cut feed in forenoon, Picked cotton in P.M. Finished bale, cloudy & raining.
- Wed 14 Buf took cotton to gin, 1350 seed cotton Made 525# bale, 808# seed, Money over ginning & rapping \$2.75 Did not sell cotton. My & I cut feed we all picked cotton in P.M. cloudy.
- Thurs 15 cut feed. Picked some cotton and shocked up one piece of bigonia. Raining tonight
- Fri 16 Came rain some time in night, sent load maize to town. They would not hardly buy it only \$14.00 per ton. we picked cotton this P.M. a little coal. Don't think will frost, would like to see a frost, would help cotton to open up. Lady seems to be a little indispayed.
- Sat 17 Well Lady cow found heifer calf last nite. ~~cal~~ We finished bale cotton. The boys took it to gin, 1350# seed cotton. Bale weight 480# seed 720# sold @ \$28.00 per ton, ginning \$5.00 wrapping \$1.75. Cash \$3.35 was offered 2175.00 for both bales, did not sell. We started for town. To get some coal. Got flat, came back, boys changed tires and went to town. cold tonight
- Sun 18 cold all day. we did not have much coal. But made out ok. We picked the green tomatoes. thought would freeze.
- Mon 19 Did not freeze. was awful cold. Harold took load maize to town 2050# @ \$14.00 per ton. Buf & I cut maize. My, did in P.M. was chilly all day. Frost
- Tues 20 Frost this A.M. Not a heavy one, just enough to bite the cotton leaves. we cut maize all day. sold maize at Anshunt

Sat 24 We cut feed till noon. I & I shackled
some cane in afternoon. Bud went to
town call as the D.

Sun 25 Mr & Mrs Wilson stayed for dinner.
we spent a pleasant afternoon. Nat so called.

Mon 26 We cut some young maize in sent
side field. Harold took load maize to
Ludau sold for \$17.00 per ton.

Tues October 27
A HARD FROST
10-27-1925

They are determined to get this feed
crop for nothing. cotton fell 7.50 per bale.
That is the devil on a man that is
trying to pay out a place.
I guess I will have to sell my truck
rather to sell it, than lose it outright.

Tues 27 We cut Harry Mc Newtons cut. cut some
maize just at night. A North E. gale struck
here about 8.30 P.M. and was freezing by
10 o'clock mid night. Every thing froze that was green.

Wed 28 Boy hauled two loads in afternoon. One
in for noon. Bought some building paper
and tacked on walls of dining room.
Cold all day. Was late of ice. Things
were froze up. I payed Jones's boy 3.00
for cutting cane. I still owe him in
the near sum of \$1.50. will stop the pump
and see just how much it is.

Thurs 29 Harold hauled maize to town in for noon.
Took a load in wagon. Sold cotton
2 Bales for 19.50. Cold all day.

Friday Oct. 30, 1925.

Fri. 30 Rained sometime during night. The rain froze as it fell. We shocked *Stagia* in for noon. picked cotton in afternoon. Harold took load maize to town. Hag did not want it at \$17.00. He was offered \$14.00. He brought it back.

Sat 31 We took balance of cane and picked cotton. Like a little over 200# having three bales out. Bud and Pids have gone to town to the show.

Sunday November 1, 1925

We went up to Sudan, to see some figs. Matterson wants \$10.00 per head. That is awful high. But one cant get them any cheaper. Harold, Bud and I went over to Amhurst in P.M.

Mon 2 Foggy we cut some *Stagia* stalks. that I cut the root heads off. was wet till noon. we finished the third bale of cotton. I took it to gin. 1225# Bale weight 474# sold for 19¢. Payed \$200.00 on Bank Note. \$203.60 on land Note. Bought 4 shates from Dick Matterson \$10.00 each. Payed \$15.00 down. Bal. \$25.00. I caught the seed out of this bale of cotton.

Tues 3 I picked some cotton cut maize heads.

Wed 4 we started in the young maize cut all day.

Thur 5 The same as yesterday. a little cold all day.

Fri 6 Raining when I woke up. The maize all wet. Boys went up town. got two of the Pigs @ \$10.00 each.

Saturday Nov. 7. 1925.

Sat 7 Things were all wrt sent two loads
maize to town. Payed Haldens Morganco.
\$14.75 Broyles & R. \$25.00 was call all day.
The freeze sure did play the devil with
the late cotton. The low price and the
freeze put crimp in the men
that has a land note to make.

Sun 8 was up town this A.M. Bought a Nursing
bottle for Senoaf. He dose not seem
to be doing as well as he aught too.
The hard wind put the frozen maize
down on the ground. would damage
if was to get in raining.

Mon 9 Bud hauled 4 loads average 1.5 tons per
load. \$103.70 less weighing 40%. Harold & I cut
heads. I payed Haldens Morgan up in full.
Also Broyles & Reynolds. \$18.40. I had to
put some new runners on my sled.
The old ones wore out to the ground.

Tues 10 Hauled 4 loads of rut. we cut heads.
I made a pig trough. my Charley dog.
is "joy riding" Senoaf. Glenn. is a
little under the grade. Think he will
be O.K. soon.

Wed 11 Sent two loads maize to town. The last
for a few days. Am filling barn now
for my own use. We cut heads today.

Thur 12 we cut maize heads all day.

Fri 13

Sat 14 I did intend to go to Littlefield
to have a load of feed crushed.
just as I was ready to start Mrs
Morgan sent for me to go for the Dr.
she was confined, we went up to
Lavelan, saw the Dr. By that time
was snowing some.



- Sunday Nov. 15, 1925.
 Sun 15 was cold all day, the boys went duck hunting & killed two. The Morgan kids were down here in P.M. They have a new boy Mr Morgan came in this A.M. was gone when the "dance" came off. Guess will start picking cotton in the morning.
- Mon 16 I went up town to see Mr Haddaway about my land note. He agreed to cancel my contract and refund my note due Nov. 15. for the \$200⁰⁰ I payed on Nov. 1 1925. That means I lose the \$200. But it had better be that than for me to lose \$400⁰⁰. For I can't make the grade for the balance of \$485⁰⁰ due Dec. 1-1925. I went to Littlefield this P.M. could not do any good down there.
- Tues. 17 I went back to town to see what I could do. I had to dig up \$400⁰⁰ more to finish out the Cokerham con. Bought the lumber at New drug store for \$300. Brought it out. Picked cotton in P.M. Let the place go back with a loss of \$240⁰⁰ Morgans come for Sallie to come. The baby is worse.
- Wed 18 Sallie was at Morgans all night the baby died about 7.30 A.M. we dug the grave and buried the child about 5 P.M. cold all day.
- Thur 19 Picked cotton all day. H's, had sore throat could not pick.

Friday November 20 1925.

Fri 20. We picked cotton all day. Bowden came to see us about 5 P.M.

Fixed up the truck sent boys to town for some gas & oil.

Sat 21. I took load cotton to gin. Only had 1130#. Made a 32# bale. was offered 19¢. Did not sell. Curtie & Frank came in about dark. A North west wind blew up. call for a while. Moderated some about dark. This is one work we did not do much.

Sun 22. Frank & Curtie left for home before noon. Was not so cold. Bowden went back with Frank.

Mon 23. I cut maize all day. Boys picking bales. Slow work cutting. Maize when it is all on the ground.

Tues, 24. Took load bales to gin. They fell short of field weight nearly 200#. Saw us they made good lent turn out, 475. 1640. sold them for 13⁰⁰ per cent. Sold the picked bale & took to town Sat. for 17⁰⁰ & Paid C paper 20⁰⁰ on a/c't. Boys cut maize heads. I went to see Hornes cans. I do not like them. The hifers are to little. The old cans are too all.

Bull calf → My red cow had bull calf to-day. I did hope would be a heifer calf.

Wed 25. I cut maize heads. It is a slow go, alone. The boys went to pick or pull cotton for Mr Horn.

Thur 26. The same as yesterday.

Fri 27. I cut some maize. The folks went to help Walker pull cotton.

Sat 28. We hauled out and stacked cane. sure is fine feed. a little cold. The folks have gone to town this P.M.

Sun 29. About the same as other Sundays.

Mon 30. I cut feed. Doy hauled out two loads of feed. set out stack. Picked bales for Walker.

Tuesday Dec 1 1925

Tues 1 I had to go to town, saw Mr Cokerham. Exchanged checks with him, that is I gave him two \$20.00 checks for the \$40.00 check he held. One due Dec. 1, the other Dec 20. The Lubbock Insurance man came out to see me, I can't see him for the "frogs". Boy pulled for Shugart.

Wed 2 They all went to pull cotton. Sallie helped me cut maize. Threatening bad weather J. J. Webb came to see me. He wants to rent me 50 a. land. I guess I will take the land.

Thurs 3 I cut one load of maize. The folks did not pull much cotton, came up a west wind, rained a little in a.m. Started snowing in early afternoon. Snowed, rained and the wind is something awful. Now blowing 9 P.M. I had to put the calves in the feed bin. They would freeze I do believe. All stock are well sheltered to date. Plenty shed and feed.

Fri 4 Was called so we did not get up very early. In fact we were too late for kids to catch school truck. The boys went up and hauled a load of maize for Clyde Robinson \$1.25 per ton.

Sat. 5. we hauled out bal. cane. 2 loads of Haggis. The mules ran away did not hurt any thing. They all went to town this P.M. except Sallie, Lenora and I

Sun 6 Was about the place all day.

It is rather dull on Sunday. Since we do not attend any church services

Mon 7 I cut maize all day. The boys went and pulled cotton in the patch I had bought. Sold what they pulled for 2 1/2¢ per lb

Tuesday Dec. 8. 1975.

Tues 8 I went over and helped Harold pull cotton. We pulled 1047#. He sold it 1/4¢. The Government report put the 'damper down' some more. The money people have the poor devils spoke for. If one makes a good crop of any thing, one can't sell it for only "Beans and corn bread." It seems like there is a 'leak' some where. But two or (two hundred for matter) of farmers can't adjust the system. Just let a bunch of farmers start some practice more and the first thing one knows, some high caliber 'Link' gets in and eats up the whole lot.

Wed 9 I cut feed all day. The boys picked bales

Thurs 10 I sent three loads maize over to Sudan. Let Mr Morgan have it.

Fri 11 Took a load of maize to Amherst, could not get but \$16.50. We went on to the sale. I bought several things among them one set of chain harness, lines, bridles, sleds, sled knives, food chopper, lantern, scales and lost but not least a jersey cow. Cow \$50.00 Other articles \$28.55.

Sat 12 I took load maize to Sudan. Did expect to put in two loads. But had to wait on a cor. Boys took some more bales to Amherst, sold for 2¢ per #.

Sun 13 Went up town for ^{the} mail, but we were too late. Nice day.

Mon 14 The daddy sand storm all day. we did not do any thing. Call us the devil.

Tues 15 Was cold all day. I cut maize in afternoon

Wed 16 I cut maize all day. will be glad when it is done.

Thurs 17 Cut maize all day. Sun was a fine day.

Friday Dec 18, 1925.

Fri 18 Bud and I cut mays in forenoon. Harold took his cotton to Arakerst. He and Bud took load mays to Sudan in afternoon. Brought back some shattered grain.

Sat 19 The wind began to blow about sunup. By 9 o'clock the sand was walking about. We went up town in P.M.

The sand storm calmed down about 4 P.M. Sun 20 Another sand storm to day. Had to stay in doors all day. Cold to rite. Would like to see a few days of pretty weather, so I could get some cutting feed.

Mon 21 Was awful cold today. Took two loads of mays to town, sold for \$16.00 per ton. Paid J. C. Cooper \$5.00 for oil. Paid J. J. King \$15.00 on note for cash.

Tue 22 Hauled up two loads of bundle feet. Tied up a few bundles. Bay took two loads of Hazine to town sold for \$15.00 per ton. All feet stuff fell off today as much as \$2.00 per ton. Did think I would cut some more mays, but was too cold. Guess will not do any more till after Christmas. Have about sold all the feet stuff that I have to sell. Have a little more cotton to pull out. Mr Newton, Wanda Drake and Dorie come in about 10.30. I had gone to bed.

Sallie cooked supper for them. He bought 3 hens and one cockerel, of the Buff Orpington stock. Wed 23 Was real cold all day. We all went up town in the afternoon.

Thu 24 Cold today. we did not get up till late.

We went over to Mr Horns place on C. tree. to town. A very large crowd came to the

Friday Dec. 25, 1925.

Fri 25. Had nice Xmas dinner all seemed to
fill up. The day of the big feed will
long be remembered. Mr Morgan wanted
to go down to Littlefield and wanted to
go with us, we started at 1:30 p.m.

Morgan, Newton Harold and I.

Saw some nice form land. Good farms
nice houses.

Sat 26 We did not get up very early. Mr Newton,
Harold and I went back to see the
Jones place near Littlefield. On to Little-
field. Had dinner back to Sudan.
Saw the Whaley Lbr. Co. mgrs. then
on home. The man that bought Mr
Morgan out came in. A cold north E.
wind hit here about 8:30 p.m. cold, cold, cold.

Sun. 27. We did not have dinner till nine o'clock.
all things are going up. The man that bought
Morgan out sent him (Morgan) down with
an offer of \$5000 per A. that would not
turn the deal. I wish I had a piece
of my own. then I would not be in
the way of his selling out.

Mr N. and Sallie have gone up to
Morgans now. Has been awful cold all
day. up is cold now.

Mon 28 We went over to see Jeff Webb about the
loan. He wanted me to plant the whole 500 A.
in cotton. I could not do that.

We went up town in afternoon. Mr
Newton payed up the Whaley Lbr. Co. bill.
He made ready to start home
in the morning.

Tues 29 We were up early, had them off by 7 a.m.
They got as far as the Spade ranch.
Came back. Harold & Ben worked his Motor over

Wednesday Dec. 31 1925

Wed 30 They did not get started till 9 A.M.
Still cold. Harold & Bud loaded
maize for Morgan Roberson. I have the
'flur' or some thing. Lenord is a whole
lot better now. I would like to get
the field cleaned up so I could pasture
stalks. Morgan will move tomorrow.
To Sudan, I think. This cold spell has
sure knocked my cows in their milk.
I want to get some special feed
for them.

Thurs 31 The boys went back to town to help Roberson
finish his calf maize. They took 1500#
for me. Sold it to Roberson for \$1.00 per cent.
I am just about down with this cold.
Mr Morgan moved to town today. Cold.

Friday January 1, 1926.

Fri 1 We hauled bundle feed out. Was a
little damp. I went over to see
Mr. Humble the man east of me
about renting some more land
from him. He said he would let
me know in a few days. Looks
rainy tonight. I am just about sick
with the bad cold.

Sat 2 Was cold we finished hauling out the
bundle out. Cold all day.

Sun 3 Was at home all day. Mr Morgan
came down. Wanted me to keep his
cow for him a while. I told him I
would keep her if I could keep her in.

Mon 4 Cold! we cut maiz. So cold we could
not do much at it.

Tues 5 Cold! we stayed in. Morgan came for his
cow.

Wednesday Jan. 6 1926.

Wed 6 Still cold and squally, we stayed in.

Thurs 7

Frid 8

" " I sent Bud to town with a load of maize. Sold for \$17.50 per ton. I did intend to start for Okla. for a span of mules. But was too cold.

Sat 9

I sent some maize out of my feed bin to town. I wanted to pay Broyles I payed him \$25.00. I did think I would start for Okla. tomorrow. But will not. Harold and Dillie had a spat. I don't know what I will do with them.

I am afraid they will never get along. I think they fuss all the time. Lallie, Bud, Dorothy and Dillie went to Amherst. Lallie wanted exchange Dorothy's dress.  Starley's Pups came today.

Sun 10

Harold and wife are still on the peak. He says he is not going to live with her. She pulls a stunt every time he goes to town, and she can't go. She said last night, if he went to the show, she would go home to her dad. Well he went to the show. I don't know what they will do about it. We made ready to start for Okla. in the morning. Mr. & Mrs. John W. Co. came by for a pop call this P. M.

Mon 11

Bud & I left for Okla. at 7 A. M. we made the trip in very good time arriving there about 7 P. M. Was cold all the way down. I drank coffee for supper. Did not sleep at all. Mr. Fulton Omeal is speaking Jimmie. They were gone to a debate when we got there.

Tuesday Jan. 12 1926.

Sun 12 Mr Newton and I went down to see the mules he had contracted for me. I sure did like them Ok. But could not make the paper on them. He sold me Jack and Dick. They are good mules. But not so young as the others.

Wed 13 We loaded the mules and started for home about 8 A.M. Our motor froze up before we got to Eldorado. We made Floydada by 6 P.M. Stated on the last lap of our trip. About 10:30. But let the truck leave the road. We took a sling in one of these lakes that are so numerous on the plain. I thought sure the mules would turn the truck over. But they did not. We finally got them out. Then we had to find a place to sleep out of the cold wind. We were turned down the first two houses we tried.

The third one let us stay in a cotton picker shed. How ever we had a good bed. Cant vouch for the cleanness of it. But we slept good and warm.

Thurs 14 We borrowed some harness gelled the truck out and loaded our mules and got home near noon. they looked for us. Wed night.

Fri 15 I helped Sallie wash in A.M. out feed in P.M.

Sat 16 Cold and I stayed in the house dont like to get out in the cold.

Sunday Jan 17 1926.

Sun 17 We called on Williams folks in afternoon. They were not at home. I sent the boy to the Yellow hair ranch to take a mule. He was turned loose on me. Could not get rid of him in any other way.

Mon 18 I cut some maize sure did tire me.

Tues 19

Wed 20 Cold as the devil all day. We went out to farm sale North of town. did not stay long, was too cold.

Came back, saw Mr Bradley at Whaley Lbr. Co. Sallie & I called on Mr Webb in evening, when we started home the ground was covered with snow.

Thurs 21 I went up town to pay my taxes my truck license cost \$16.⁵⁰/_{xx} my gale tax & Sallie's were \$3.⁵⁰/_{xx} I made a loan at the Bank of \$25.⁰⁰/_{xx}

Fri 22 Snow still on the ground and every thing froze up. Sallie moved the stove in the front room. Sun is cold.

Sat 23 We have srt around all day. It is too cold to do any thing else. The boys blew the hors connection out on the car, as they went to town had to leave it on the road. Started for it in the truck run out of gas. Dukey did get home, then Bud had to go to Webb for soother. She will know it when she gets off of this place again. Snowing now. The ground is all covered when the first snow had melted.

Sun 24 A much larger snow fell last nite than the first one. I do not feel well. The 'blue' I guess is thinking about me.

Monday Jan. 24 1926.

Mon 25 We sat around the fire all day. The snow did not melt much.

Tue 26 About the same thing today. Mr. Fife came down for a game of dominoes.

Wed 27 a little warmer. I helped Sallie wash in forenoon. Riged up and started to break sod, for my Sudan patch. Sent 450# maize to town to be ground for cows. They sure do eat it good. 20¢ per cwt. for grinding

Thurs 28 Sent up to Lifer for a walking lester started listing after the ground thawed out. The ground plows very well, altho it is not as wet as I thought it would be. Rebrake the garden. Bud pulled cotton. Would like to finish the cotton now.

Fri 29 I plowed all day. I sure did get tired. The first time I have walked and holed land since 1913.

Harold & Bud spiked a bale of cotton and took it to Littlefield.

Made a 400# bale.

Sat 30 They took their cotton to Sudan sold for 8¢ per #. They were 'doaked' \$700 on light weight.

The folks went to a sale at Sudan this P. M. I plowed this forenoon. Sallie left Leonard with me.

I received my pen from Dad. I lost it last summer when I was down there. I have been pencils or school pens since.

Sun 31 Was cold and bad. So we stayed in about the house all day.

Monday Feb. 1 - 1926.

- Mon 1 Another birth day. Am 46 now. My eyes are all of my festivity? that is not up to par. They are not so good as some years since. I finished the maize, and helped Bud full some cotton.
- Tues 2 I helped Bud with the cotton today.
- Wed 3 I pulled cotton till noon. Took a load of cotton to Littlefield had it gined 1865⁷⁷ made 440⁷⁷ bales sold for 8.10⁰⁰ per lb.
- Thurs 4 I helped Starall pull cotton, I know I ought to be plowing, but I want to help him get his cotton out. For he will need it and then some.
- Fri 5 We pulled cotton all day. Finished his bale. That is we got a truck full. Lots of sand in the cotton. Bud & Dorothy are going to the show. He is trying to get the car started & now.
- Sat 6 I took Staralls cotton to Littlefield He did not have as much cotton as he thought. I only got 7.25⁰⁰ for it. Lenord is sick to-nite.
- Sun 7 Mr Wilsons came by for us to go home with them. But Lenord was too sick to leave. They took him to Sudan to see the Dr. He said he had pneumonia. So bad for a little fellow like that to be sick. They cant tell one a thing.
- Mon 8 Sallie set up with Lenord last Nite Bud & I helped John Webb thrash
- Tues. 9 They set up. We helped " " "
- Wed 10 Lenord is better. We finished Webb's thrashing at noon. Pulled cotton in P.M.

Thursday Feb. 11 1926.

Thurs 11 We pulled cotton till about 3 P.M. The wind came up and was so disagreeable we had to quit. I made a hot bed. I took my young saw

 Thurs 12

We pulled cotton, or Bud did. I helped Jeff Webb put out his orchard. I took John Webb separator home. Rented the place south of mine. He is going to have a sale out. He rented it to me.

Bud & I loaded up the cotton so I can't get an early start to Littlefield

Sat 13 I took cotton to Littlefield had 2090 # made 510 # bale. Sold for 8.25¢ per cwt. Paid Brayles what I owed him \$40.30.

Sun 14 I took Lady Law to Coaks male.

Harold went to see some Mexicans about pulling cotton. Alton Morgan called today.

Mon 15 I worked at the house. Fixed the hot bed. planted the different kinds of seeds. The gilt is Ok. Plowed a little. Harold made him a cotton pulling sled. I am afraid it won't do any good.

Tues 16 we pulled cotton. I did want to get done with it. Brought my saw home. Harold's sled did not do any good. Bud & I will help him finish his cotton. Or get out a bale for him.

Feb

Wednesday ~~Jan~~ 17 - 26.

Wed 17. We helped Harold till noon. The wind and sand came so hard and thick we had to quit. The sand storm is as bad as I have seen since 1922 (see Book three in spring of 1922) This is bad on the new comers.

Thurs 18 Worked on Lister some. The wind come from the North to-day. It howled till about 2 P.M. Calmed down some. The boy that left the cows here. Come back for dinner. He and the boys went up town in afternoon.

Fri 19 The man that owns the cows come out and got them he payed me \$2.50 for keeping them. We pulled the bal. of cotton that is all that I will fool with. I gave the bal. to Sallie and kids.

Sat 20 Bud and I loaded it up. Harold took the cotton to Lemhurst. He had 1/2 bale and I 1/2. made a bale weighing 440 # sold for 8.50¢. Bud and I rized up the lister, he flaughered on east side getting dry. I flauted some onion seed.

Sun 21 I went to see a Mr Venerable about getting a mule. I would not trade my cow for his mule. Saw Mr Testone about getting his dice. Mr & Mrs Fife called for a while.

Mon 22 I went up town with Mr Webb. I could not do any thing at Bank for it was closed Washington B. day. Harold went for the dice harrow. Bud lister till noon. Put fur on dice

Thursday Feb. 23, 1926.

Tues 23 Bud dices, Lallie & I finished the valleys I gave them. Harold went to see Geo. Nichols about a team of horses. Did not get them. He killed a calf and sold it out. I took the little jar of catter to Littlefield sold for $1\frac{1}{2}$ ¢. 550 # I brought back a bag of catter hulls. to put over my potatoes when I plant them.

We put six mules on the dice today. I saw Jack Dunlap a fellow I used to work for at Beechburnett during the oil boom days.

(See book Two Springs of 1919.)

Wed 24 A North west wind, cold and sandy snowed a little. I went over to Webb's sale. He sold at a good price. The sand flew about. I bought an ewer and a cultivator sweeps \$2.60.

Thurs 25 I went up town to pay my oil bill. \$6.00. Bud dices all day.

Fri 26 I planted my spuds, and watered them. Harold is getting busy. Bud played or dices all day. Dorothy stayed home from school. Had letter from C. C. Newton, said he would be out soon.

Sat. 27 I worked about the house in forenoon. Was over to the James old Ranch. So see if he had a mule to trade for a cow. I run the disk for Bud in after noon. Had party at Fife's. I did want to go. But did not have any shaving soap. So we stayed home.

I worked in garden. Took Della and Lenora to Dr. She was sick had high fever. Bud got his croquet set today.

Sat 20

Bud floured till noon. Just had to go to Sudan in p.m. I was up town in the morning. Took my note up borrowed \$25.00. Chopped some maize and cotton seed for cows.

Sun 21

We played some croquet in a.m. I took folks down to Mr. Wilsons in afternoon. Jr. & Lenora are sick just as one gets well another gets sick.

Mon 22

We worked about place in a.m. Harold & I worked on fence over on the place I have rented.

Tues 23

We worked on fence all day. Bud finished harrowing and started tusting Jeff Webb sent for me harrow. Boys finished fence. Did not plow.

wed 24

Three years ago to-day I was put in charge of a crew of men to build a dam on Bear Creek for the Waggoners. Firman & Johnson had the contract.

Thursday Mich. 25 1916.

Thurs 25 But flurst. Harold went to town. I fixed up a little chicken scratch shed. Cold all day. Looks like rain or snow.

Fri 26 Was snowing by 7 a.m. Is still pouring it on now 12 noon. The ground is covered. I went over to Webb's to get the address of the man I made fence for. Jon. A. Ladd, Memphis, Tex. Snowed near all day, a fine wet snow.

Sat 27 Some warmer. The snow all melted or nearly so. Had to put the stove up again. Sent for some coal. Fine season in the ground now.

Sun 28 There was a crowd of young folks here all day, playing ragquet. Threatening rain all day. Mrs. & Mrs. New man came in for a few games of 42 in the eve. Biley found a silver in the road. He sure was tickled.

Mon 29 Rained near all night I think, then lightly. Rained some after breakfast then about 10 a.m. began to snow and sleet. By noon we had a first class blizzard blowing. And on to about 7 P.M. Was like the storm we had on the plain and in western Okla in Jan. 1918. (See Book #2) It is colder now 10 P.M. than it has been this winter. The mules have been in the shed all day. Cows too. I have very good shelter for stock in a storm like this. But this shack we live in get my money when these storms come

Thursday Mich. 30 1926.

Tues 30 The storm was something awful for this time of year. Cant do anything but try to keep warm. all plants that are up are dead.

wed 31 about as the same thing as yesterday still cold.

Thursday April 1 1926.

Thur 1 Hauled out manure and scattered on garden. Broke up the tomato flat. Went up town in P.M. Saw Broules. Bud finished the Ladd land.

Fri 2 Finished cleaning out lats. Started Bud to testing on home place.

Sat 3 Broke up garden again, it is in fine shape now. went up town in afternoon. Jennie did not come. Dorothy is not taking that much. She wanted her dress. Bud and Dorothy went to show to nite.

Sun 4 The same crowd of young folks to play croquet. Mr & Mrs Webb did aim to come for dinner but they did not come till after noon Mrs & Mrs Life called in P.M. Newman & wife also. Just at nite Jimmie Drake & Siltou Oneal come in from Aluster Okla.

Think maby they will be married soon. They are sicking pretty low. we all went up to Lifer for a singing. Had a nice crowd & singing.

- Fri 9 Started raining about 4 A.M. and has rained near all day. is still raining now 11 P.M. The "sparkers" are still here. and from the looks of the weather they cant go soon.

Sunday May 2 1926.

Sun 2 The same thing to-day as last night Sallie is mad. and what hurts me these little ones do not know why I do not do this and that. they think from the way she howls me out that I do not want to do for them when I was making good money they all help spend it. I do not spend any money. just a few cents and the cheap "joss" at that.

It seems the time is here now if a man cant make the grade. He is on the list as a poor meal "ticket". I see people that has no way to go unless in a truck, and they seem to be happy. cant tell. The "dusty ones" ought to do better. Hard N.E. wind all day. Corn is beginning to come up. some feed is droyed out, some will come up.

Mon 3 I got McNealy's planter. Too wet to use it.
Rain It came a very hard rain some time in the night. We could not do any work in the field.

Tues 4 We took some corn to mill.
Rain Buf went up to Mr Lovers for his disk. Rained some to day. Sallie & I went up to Mr Walkers in afternoon.

Wed 5 Harold helped John Webb plant his sudan patch.

Thur 6 The boys planted cotton all day on Ladd's place. McNealy told me to send his planter home tomorrow.

Thursday 6, 1926. (May.)

Thurs 6 We had quite a sand storm today. This feel on this place is sure slow about coming up. May have to plant corn over. That is a large part of it. will not if I don't get a good stand. Some blue weeds are coming here.

Fri 7 We had some more wind and sand today. Bud started planting cotton on home place.

Sat 8 Mr Lovv came down to see if I would take two hogs up town for him. So I decided to sell my fat hog. Lovv came down. He and I went up town to see if Sturgess would buy my hog. He gave me 11 cts ^{per lb.} for him. We came back loaded them up. My hog weighed 256 # Lovv two weighed 414. We all went over to Mr John Webbs to a Hard Shell Baptist preaching. They seemed to have a great time. Donald finished cotton on Ladd place.

Sun 9 We were at home all day till in P.M. I went over to Amherst bought 3 pigs at \$7.50 each. That is a big price for pigs. Singing at Fifer's tonight. I will not stay up late. Big crowd here all afternoon playing croquet.

Mon 10 The most remarkable day I ever saw. Cold when we got up. Still cold at 10 a.m. then began to get warmer. By noon it was real hot. Came up a rain about 4 P.M. Then followed up the d — sand storm. Then cold again.

By night it was cold. The boys planted cotton off and on all day. Let cans out in the vacant Labor. They filled up on grass.

Tues 11

Started planting P.G. did. Bud went to town for a plow point came by Mr Vinbles for a lister came a rain at noon. Could not do any thing more. Call tonight.

Wed 12

We walked over to Ladd place. To see how things looked over there. Will have to plant feed over. Started boys with two one row planters at noon.

Thurs 13

The incubator is hatching fine. Think nearly all the turkeys eggs will hatch. and chickens too. Boys came in at noon and started planting cotton on home place.

Fri 14

Boys planted cotton till noon. Fixed up a scratcher. Had to scratch cotton that was planted before the big rain. Planted higrovia in P.M. Lallie & I went up to town.

Billy is in a drama at school. She had to go and dress him.

They have all gone to the play tonight. The chicks & turkeys are doing fine. 31 Turkeys out of 50 eggs. 39 fertile ones and 11 infertile ones.

Sat 15

Boys planted till noon. will have to plant my early feed over. I made a trip for Mr Love over near Baileyboro for a cow. We made it Ok. I de payed me \$3.00 for the trip. A little windy to day and cool.

Sunday May 16 1926.

Sun 16 I stayed home all day attending to my baby chicks and turkey. They are doing fine. I went over to Mr Cooks for some eggs will start incubator again tomorrow. They had a singing convention over at Amhurst today. I would of liked to have gone. But could not. The crowd of young people played croquet. Mr & Mrs Rankins called this p. m. Looks a little like rain to night. Jimmie is a little sick. Don't know what is the matter.

Mon 17 The thing came to a show down. I had to take some plow points to the shop. and I did not have any money. So I went up and hit up the little banker. Made the grade for \$75.00. She boys planted Rigra.

Tue 18 I went over to see how things were coming up on the Ladd place. I think the cotton will come to a stand and the maize that I planted over. was over to Mr Ferris for my planter, on to town. Had some corn ground. We all went to the seller. Was an awful looking cloud. Rained a big one.

Wed 19 I planted some peanuts, worked awhile in the garden. sent team over on Ladd place and disked up an old fence row. Looks rainy to night. Walker boys came down. wanted Harold to go to work.

Thursday May 20, 1926.

Thu 20

The boys planted ^{peanuts} sudan on Ladd land. Had to plant over all the 35 a. that I had planted over there. I finished my peanuts and planted some popcorn. Went up to Walkers for some cane seed. Dorothy is real sick. Cause unknown.

Fri 21

Boys finished the replanting Ladd place. By noon. Planted feed here this P.M. The sod planted cotton is coming up. Think I will get a stand. Dorothy was up to day. She had a little sick spell.

Think it was caused by her going bathing in tank a few days since. Black cloud hanging in N.W. tonight.

Sat 22

We worked till noon. Boys planted feed on east side field.

We went to Little field in P.M. Bought a can of syrup and a 25# sack sugar. It cost me the sugar \$1.65. Syrup 85 cts. At Sudan it would have cost sugar \$2.00 syrup \$1.20 a difference of 70 cts. Billy was sick when we got home. Looks rainy.

Sun 23

It sure did rain and hailed some. A big hail storm east and west of me. We all went to the cellar.

I think maybe my cotton will come to a stand. We went over to John Webbs in afternoon for a while. The big crowd gathered in afternoon for a croquet game.

Mon 24

Started boys to planting sod on Ladd place. I worked about house attending chicks. Cotton is coming up.

Sun 25 The boys planted over on the Ladd place all day. I worked about place. planted some Cashes watermelons and pop corn.

Wed 26 about the same as yesterday, a heavy cloud is hanging in S.W. Finished Ladd.

Thur 27 We sure did have a hard rain last night. In fact it rained near all night we lost 3 turkeys. too crowded up. water all over things. Sallie took Dorothy to the Dr. at Sudan. He thinks she is generally run down.

The big crowd was here all day playing croquet.

Fri 28 Bud harrowed sudan patch in forenoon. Harold planted cotton on the home sod in P.M. Bud finished harrowing corn and harrowed cotton balance of afternoon. Sure dose make

Rain → Cloud came up from S.W. @ 8:30 P.M. the rain, wind and last but not least hail did come down. It liked to have ruined our garden. did not hurt the cotton so bad I don't think.

Sat 29 I was up early to see what damage the hail storm did. It beat up the garden and beat down some cotton. The water covered up lots of my cotton. did not hurt cotton on Ladd place. took calves to Ladd pasture.

Saturday, May 29, 1926.

Sat 29 I put ring in saw saw. She roasts
my lat so bad. Branded the two
calves & took to pasture. Catevated
Abudl calf. Lost two more turkeys
Rain lost 'niti' Rained some in P.M.
and is raining awful hard now
10 P.M. water is running every
where.

Sun 30 I think it rained near all nite.
I walked over the field. Things
dont look very good. alth I cant
afford to replant.
was over to Ladd place. Crops
look very good over there.





Bud went to see if he could get a wagon header. Harold & I stacked heads. I could not get it. Harold & Bud went up town to see Mr. Caruth. He wanted to see his heads. We cut feed in P.M.

Mr Ladd called at nite.

Bud and I went down to see if they needed any help. They did not need any company for the night. The undertaker had charge of the body. Embalming H.S. & Bud could not stand to see him do it. Rained this P.M.
- Mon 27 Still raining, was raining all night when I was awake. The cotton that was open is all out on the ground. My feed is in good shape now. Will have it thrashed as soon as I can. Still cloudy 9.30 P.M.
- Tues 28 Did not do any thing, was too wet.

- Thurs 30 Boys went to town. I gathered a load of corn for my hogs, cut nut feed in afternoon. Things have dried up some. Cotton is down to 12¢ Cant do much unless pay 13¢ B. a Gro. Bill.

Friday October 1 1976

- Fri 1 We built a hog house for Bud's saw she had 8 pigs. cut feed in P.M. Started raining before night. Rained hard all night.

Saturday Oct. 2 1916

Sat 2 Rained showers and came two awful hard rains one in for noon and one in afternoon, and now 9:30 P.M. is raining like the devil. water ever when feed is all raining, it is sprouting in the shack and on the stalk. will have all done feed if it does not clear up soon. We put a new roof on shed room between showers. But it did not do any good as it still leaks. Fixed up chicken house, but they wont roost in it. Put a part of young chickens in the house they would come out as fast as we would put them in. Hay and feed stuff is the only nut to travel on a farm. If one has a cattie crop let it be surplus crops.

Sun 3 Rainy and cloudy all day. We started over to Hodges place in P.M. to see him about thrashing. But could not get there too much mud. water in the lakes covered the roads.

Mon 4 went up town to get some coal and coal oil. Bad roads.

Tues 5 we picked some cotton in afternoon the worst cotton I ever saw for the first picking.

Dellie & little ones went away to McCreary. Harold took them to train. They left about 9 P.M.

Mon 25 Sallie, Billy & I started for Okla at 7 A.M.

we made it Ok. until we were in 10 or 12 miles of Floydada. We had to detour these lakes. Bagged down. Had to unload my ballast (meigs heads.) Had team to pull me out. We made Floydada about 4:30 P.M. On to Matador. Stayed over night. was tired out. Fine day.

- Tues 26. We started for Okla early.
Made Okutee about 4 P.M.
Had some awful rough roads.

rain. Cook called. I payed him
season on cow. These blooming
pups killed another chicken.
The boys took cotton to Littlefield
sold for 11²⁰
→ Fixed up a cotton seed bin.
Picked cotton in P.M. Mr Dent
of Clutee Okla called. Too many
blue weeds.

Saturday Nov. 6 1926

Sat 6

We finished the bale by 2 P.M. took it to gin. The kids had a pound supper. Lots to eat and a large crowd. Stayed till 2 o'clock. I almost have the flu. Nice day.

Sun 7

Jeff Webb told me about a small family at Amherst that I could get to pick cotton. I went to see them. They come to see the cotton this P.M. was well pleased. We used to know the woman when she was a girl at Raes in 1914 and '15. I filled my bag this P.M. sold on 4. Let a man near Amherst have a 1/4. Let Webb have one and I kept one. Came a north wind just at night.

But does not amount to much.

I did this day send C. C. Newton of Cleveland, ^{Ohio} check, dated November 5th 1926, for \$500.00 to apply on a note, he holds against me, for a span of gray mules named Jack & Elick.

Mon 8

Cold the wind started blowing and by 8 o'clock was sure blowing out of N.W. The sand and tumble weeds sure did more. We did not do any thing till near night. Beat out a lot of beans.

Tues 9

Frost and ice all over. I cut maize in for noon. Picked cotton on Ladd place in after noon. 608# on bale & Billy & Jimmie is sick sore throat. Bessie eye is out of Ketter.

Wednesday Nov. 10, 1926.

Wed 10 We picked cotton all day.
Boys took cotton to town. To nite,
we will pull cotton tomorrow.
The man that was to come and
pick cotton did not come.

Thur 11 We pulled cotton all day. I pulled
545#. Donald took load of
pulled cotton to Amhurst.
Ted New man & Bud have
gone to town. Looks a little
rainy to nite.

Fri 12 Nice day. we pulled cotton all day.

Sat 13 Finished bale. Took it to Amhurst.
Came a norther.

Sun 14 We went to Littlefield to see if you

Tuesday Nov. 23. 1926.

Tues 23 We rigged up a cotton Puller and pulled a bale of snaps. Harold took it to town to gin. John Webb came over and wanted my truck to move some chickens. Had to send for it.

Wed 24 Boys pulled a bale of cotton they both went to gin. We could not use the header. The feed was down too much. I cut one load of heads on Ladd place.

Thur 25 The wind started blowing before we got up. By 10 A.M. one could not see 100 yds. down the road. It blew all day. I thought the house would go. I do not understand how the wind mill stayed intact. The cotton that the sand storm 8 days since left is all out and ruined. The yellow house mill blew down. It being the tallest wind mill in the world. I am conservative in saying the wind and sand today damaged me \$500.00.

Fri 26 Boys went to pull cotton on Ladd place. But came home they say the cotton is all ruined. I cut feed (went) on home place. They finished Sallies bale. Harold took it to gin. Bud has gone to get Webb to play 42.

Saturday Nov. 27 - 1926

Sat 27 We picked up some cotton when Bud had "sledded". The wind got up so high that we had to quit. Harold came in just before noon. He went to bed. Did not get gined off till near daybreak. He sold his mother's bale and one for me 7.25 cts per lb. I had to take a dock on my bale only weighed 390#. Bud & I gathered corn this p.m. "windy tonight"

Sun 28 We looked over the crops. Cotton is almost a total disstruction. all feed is flat on the ground. corn is nearly all on the ground. We went over to see some hogs west of me. cant call the mans name. Singing at 5:15 tonight"

Mon. 29 I cut feed all day. was tire-some. boys went to see a new cotton puller. They could not get it. Nice day.

Tues 30 I cut feed all day. Finished another bale for Sallie. Had it gined was offered 6.50 for it. 6 1/2 cts per lb.

December 1 1926 (Wednesday.)

Wed 1 We went over to gull some cotton for Harold. Could not do much at it. will make another kind of slide,

Thursday Dec. 2 1926.

Thur 2 We went over on Ladd place, pulled a bale of cotton. Harold took it to Littlefield. I finished the day cutting feed.

Fri 3 Harold did not get back from Littlefield till 4 A.M. Made a 90 # lent out of 1915 # snaps. He and Bud went to Sudan to sell cotton. They are not back yet, 8:30 P.M. I worked about house doing things that I have put off all fall. Not taking time out of the field. The first day that I have not been in the field since last days of August. That I could work.

Sat 4 We gathered corn all day. Two outfits. The corn is near all on the ground. Sallie and kids went to show torite. I stayed home read the papers.

Sun 5 Bad all day. See all over every thing. Cold.

Mon 6 Still cold and icy. Rained some last P.M. Jeff Webb came by. We went up town and over to Ankeny. Will sell some feed to Pay Brayles Bros. Store.

Tues 7 I went over helped J. Webb kill a beef. I took 1 ton's. Killed hogs this P.M. Mr. Terrible & wife called for a while. Has cleaned up and is not so cold.

Wed 8. Cold and raining when we got up. Cut the wheat up and salted it down.

Thursday Dec. 9. 1926.

Thurs. 9. We worked the sausage up and sacked it. Had it ground at town. We put up sixty pounds.

It is still rainy. The meat is in danger of spoiling. Altho it seems to be plenty cold.

Harold & Bud took two loads of Scigria to town sold for \$11.00

Per ton, on account of B & R. Gro. Co. I owe them \$62.00. H.G. Owe them \$50.00

Fri. 10. I took load feed to town as I took Mr Wests wagon home. He had my wagon, and I had his.

Boys hauled 3 truck loads to town. They have not come in yet. 8.30 P.M. I rendered out load this P.M. will not make much load out of two young hogs. Take all hogs to make the bred.

Sat 11 Sent one big load Scigria to town and 1200 # in afternoon to finish the amount I owe Broyles & R. That is with what Harold owe him too. 10 tons in all. Harold and I tried to haul load feed from Ladd place. But the wind got up so high, that we had to quit. Cold and a high wind all day. They have not come from town yet 10.30 P.M.

Sun 12 The boys came in about 7 a.m. They had been to a dance north of town. The wind was high near all day. The red pig we got of Paulin is chafed on a bone. She will die I am afraid.

Sunday Dec. 12. 1926.

Sun 12 Orbie Neumaan came up in P.M.
I let him have one of the old
sows pigs for what I owed him,
for cutting feed in September,
which was \$8.⁰⁰ Nat bal for a

I started in to plant corn. Planted all day. My side hurts me till I can hardly work.

Thur 9

Planted corn and bigra, all day.

Fri 10

planted cotton most of day. The planter gave me lots of trouble this P.M. Side is still sore. Mr Fife came down and got Elick to work. I will not need him before Monday.

Saturday June 11 1927.

Sat 11 I had to go to town in forenoon.
Started planting when I got back home Mr Nelson came out to see if he knew what was the matter with my planter. He could not fix it. I had to quit before night. Took the clutch to blacksmith he fixed it.

Sun 12 Jeff Webb sent for Sallie about 1 P.M. this day. Rained off and on all nite. Curley called for me before I got up. He wanted me to go and see about digging a grave for Webb's baby. It was born dead.

Rained in for noon. We buried the baby in afternoon.

Mon 13 I harrowed down beds in A.M. I planted cotton in P.M.

Tues 14 Planted cotton all day.

Wed 15 was

I went up town stayed near all day. Could not do any thing.

15 → Planted cotton till the cloud came up just be fore nite. fell a good rain

Sun 19 I did some work on an old plow in forenoon. Shaved and took the folks over to Vincennes. I went on to town to see Borron about paying for wheate. He told me to draw on the Bank Nelsons & Testaments were quarantined to day, for small pox, a blent came up from N.W. and a nice rain fell. However we did not need it. But we have had so much dry weather that one cant complain when it rains.

Mon 20 I went over by Testaments and Nelsons took some produce to town for them and brought out some groceries they sent for. They are huffer because some one turned them in to the county health officers. Got some cane seed, planted cotton all P.M. Saw Newman he wanted my old lister to plant some peanuts wings for my wheate tomorrow. My eye hurts me. The one that I got hurt 10 yrs. since (an account of which one can find in my Ledger #2.)

June 21 I went over to Amherst weighed truck went out to the Brantley farm where Webb had some wheate I loaded 51 bu. came by Sudan Biley went with me. Planted cane and some sudan seed. Plowed out fence rows on east and North side of field.

Wednesday June 22 1927.

Wed 22

Came up a cloud about day light. Sure did come a hard rain. I went over and payed Webb for the seed wheate.

Thurs 23

Finished planting Sidon seed ^{\$63 75} Planted higria all day. South from the house starting at the cane patch

Fri 24

Planted higria all day.

Sat 25

Scritchid 6 A cotton E side

Sun 26

walked over field this A.M. and and well pleased with stands so far. Think I will get a good stand of cotton on E. side. Looks a little dourney today.

Mon 27

Planted higria all day

Tues 28

.. .. Bud came in about 3 P.M. He would have been here Monday, but he had a car wreck in Mineral wells. Did not hurt any thing much.

Wed 29

Finished planting higria. Started on east side planting maize. Only have 10 a. over there. Sent two loads maize heads to town. Sold one load for \$12.00 per ton. The other one for \$13.00 per ". Payed Grissom \$15.65 will not have the maize for Jodie. He wanted a ton.

Thurs 30

I worked about place in forenoon went up town in after noon. Had to fix up some papers at Whaley Lbr. Co. would love to see a slow rain we need it to start things off.

Friday July 1 1927.

Fri 1 Harrowing cotton and go-deviling feed. I was up town for a while in P.M.

Sat 2 Billy & I cut some volunteer maize out of cotton. One of my old teeth got to hurting me and I had to quit and come to the house to pull it out. Sure did hurt. But I pulled it. We all went up town in P.M. I helped Bud get \$500.00. He wanted a little money. Cream test no good today.

Sun 3 The folks went to church this A.M. We all went to a Ball game at Sudan. Earth dig Sudan Stow game.

Mon 4 We did not observe the fourth today. Only in the field. Bud started plowing cotton. We chafed wood out of cotton in the forenoon, and thinned corn in after noon. The folks have gone to church to Nite. all except Billy & I. I was too tired.

Tues 5 Bud plowed cotton all day. The kids & I thinned corn and cut wood out of it. The ground is dry. That is on top.

Wed 6 I go-deviled some higria. Bud plow

Thur 7 I got Newmans cultivator and helped Bud plow cotton

Fri 8 We plowed cotton all day. Found some cotton dying. Kids finished cutting wood

Sat. 9. We all worked till noon.

I took Lady cow to Jeff Webb's
male. Changed my pig sow to

Had a little rain at home. Came
a fine rain at Sudaan. we were
up there after supper.

on this farm. Stuff sun looks good
this a.m. was at home till
about 3 P.M. we went over to a
ball game, near a Mr Storns
Place. Some country boys playing.
The folks are all gone to church

Fri 15 I harrowed cotton in a.m. Jim harrowed in p.m. In all we did not do much to day. Will have to plant the most of my seed over it did not come up in the blue weed spots. Bud and girls have gone to a party at Mr Morris.

Sat 16 We worked in the cotton in forenoon. All went up to Sudan in afternoon. They had a trades day at Sudan some horse races. and a few other entertainments.

Sun 17 We all spent the day at John Webb's. We drove over to Bulah. The country is in bad shape lots of the people have gone. The land is not planted, and what is planted is all weeds.

Mon 18 I took Ladys calf over to Jeff Webb's place to rear her.

18 a. I am to pay him \$1.50 per month. to keep her for me. we cut weeds out of cotton Bud plowed cotton

Tues 19 We all worked in the cotton all day.

- wednesday July 27 - '27.
 wed 27. we go deviled feed all day. Bud started in to plowing cotton on east 1/2. The fork sprouts on all well.
- Thur 28 we go deviled feed all day Bud plowed cotton.
- Fri 29 Finished up the go-deviling. was awful hot.
- Sat 30 I went up town earlier had to get Billy a pants and cap. Jimmie a pair of shoes before we could go to Lambert to the picnic. We had a good time.
- Sun 31 Jeff Webb's folks came over for the day. Jeff & I went over to the ball ground in P.M. They did not have any game while we stayed. Mr. Suet called in P.M. I saw Mr. Williams about bringing his matches over.

Monday August 1 1927.

- Mon 1 I went up town to see what I could get for some maize. Sold for \$14.00 per ton. Sent 1920# of maize up town. Sold 11 bu. wheat @ \$1.25 per bu. Payed Harrison \$126.00. Slate \$77.00. Bank \$5.00. Gas & oil \$1.26.
- Tues 2 I went down to Littlefield had the last of my teeth pulled (four!) I did not know when he pulled them out. No pain at all. But the "dope" he used in killing the nerves, hurt later on. I stayed in shade balance of day.
- Bud & I went to Williams for hog.

Wednesday Aug. 3 1927.

Wed. 3

The folks went plumb hunting. John Webb and part of his family went, also Mrs. Fife and two boys. They did not get very many plumbs. Was so hot in middle of day.

Bud lightened non-direction rods on truck in P.M.

Sallie & I fixed up some rust and paint in her house.

Thurs 4

We finished plowing the cotton patch. We have it in fine shape now. If it would only come a rain. Started going over cotton the second time with the hors.

Fri 5 I plowed in lignia south of house. Bud and others rode

Sat 6

I plowed till noon. Bud fixed field fence. Sallie was called over to J.J. Webb's place. Mrs. Campy is delivering a little Campy. She is the daughter of the Webbs.

Sun 7

We went over to Mr. Ford's in afternoon. No rain yet.

Mon 8

Plowed some in forenoon. Came up a little shower. I went up town with Jeff Webb at noon. Came up a cloud and rained a good rain. None of us worked any more to-day.

Tues 9

It a cold came in about noon we went up town in P.M. Mr. Williams came over. It and I made a hog trade.

Wednesday Aug. 10 1937.

Wed 10

We did not do anything today in the field. The boys & I went up town in P.M. and all of us went up to the street carnival. At night we played the "Bingo game." Sallie won a milk bucket and a lot of groceries. Had a good time.

Harold took his two red pigs to Amhurst sold them for \$5.00 each. On to little field to see what we could get for top hogs, was offered 9.25 per cwt. The Amhurst man came out and bought them just at night. Will deliver tomorrow.

We loaded up the hogs took them to Amhurst. Bud had 3 in the lot Harold one, and I one. Harold sent \$5.00 to Sallie at McKinney. Bud sent \$15.00 to C. J. Smith also of McKinney. To apply on the Car Note. It is raining a little 'tonite'. The boys have gone to Sudan also the kids they went with Jon. Webb's kids.

We chopped weeds out of cotton in forenoon. Harold & Bud worked on truck. We went up town in afternoon.

we had to have some work done on truck did not get started out of Penma until 10 A.M. made portates by noon and home by sun set. Had come a fine rain since we left.

Thur 18

The boys sold all the apples but about 3 bu. we were keep for our own use. I was up town in P.M. a black cloud is coming up from N.W. Now, 10 P.M.

Fri 19. The boys & girls chased weeds out of cotton. They got done. Flag & Pinnie Webb helped them. I helped Sallie with the apples. Bought daily home.

Sat 20 The boy worked on the little hogie' all day. I sowed wheat in my sudeen patch. We went up town at night.

Sun 21 We had dinner and I went up town for a box of asperines for Sallie. We started to the baptising (I guess that is the way to spell it) but we were too late. We went down to John Webb's. was out in his cotton the leaf worms are eating on his cotton. The folks are all gone to a singing at Veneables.

Mon 22 The boys started back to Rowan this A.M. Billy went with them. I went up town finished paying Feonor for the wheat drill.

Tues 23 I started in to plow some braus plowed 10 rows. John Webb and Roam Griffin came out in the field to see me. John Webb wanted me to take my car and come to his house and we would go out in the country, to make up some groceries or cash for a woman that had been left without anything to eat. She has six little ones. We made up \$12.50. Bought \$13.00 gro. took them to her. We have \$12.20 in the Charity fund.

Wednesday Aug. 24 1927.

Wed 24 The boys came in last night
I went with H.G. to town with
the load of apples, Les & W. what
Bud took with him.

Did not sell very many.

Thurs 25 I sent the truck over to Webbs

wheate saw & will start Monday.

Is slow work when one has to walk.

We went out driving in afternoon was out to Mr. Whites place west of town. Had a few watermelons. They were no good. The honey dew has killed the vines.

Mon 12

We went up to the opening of school. They had a nice program. The kids all seemed happy. I went up town with boys in P. M. Brought out two coops of chickens for a man by name of Crawford that is moving in from Dallas. Rained some bright.

The boys will start out in the morning to look for a job, until the crop at home is ready to gather.

Tues 13

It fell a very good cotton shower last nite. Day started foggy this a.m.

Wed 14

I pulled a few weeds out of feed stuff. was in hopes it would come another little shower. The kids are going to school now.

Thurs 15

It came a good rain during nite that is fine on my wheate will all come up now. I sure do get tired of sitting around. Nothing to do.

Friday September 16, 1927.

- Fri. 16. I went up town in afternoon. Looked
 2 gal. cream. Sun did come a hard
 rain when I started home, I
 went in the ditch the road
 was so slick. an awful hard
 rain at home.

Wed 5 We started at Lachney about 9 a.m. I bought a new tube and tire. we went to Littlefield, Hale Center, Plainview, Lachney and out to a Mr McTensies near east Caprock.

Thurs 6 We look over Mr Mc's. Binders did not like them saw several more on way to Floydada. Bought one from the night watch man of Floydada for \$50.00. we stayed over night at hotel.

Fri 7 we went out and started to wreck the binder began to rain had to stop for a while. finished loading just before sunset. Made plain view. Stopped for the night

- Sat 8 Saturday Oct. 8, 1927.
 we stayed at the Buxton
 hotel. was sure tired.
 Rained some time during
 night. we started about
 10 A.M. for Sudan. we run
 out of gas about 1 mile
 east of Sudan. Hatto sent
 out 15 gallons.

We worked on header. Finished putting it together. Tried it out. It sure does the buck act. We cut 6 rows. Bellie & little ones

Sun 16

Came in to nite. Life met them at the train. Bud and two young fellows came in about 1 A.M. We went up town for Bellie's trunk, but could not get it out of depot. Walker came down to see what arrangements had been made. We went to see Newman. We were stert on his feet. Nice weather.

Mon 17

We rigged up and cut for Newman made it all Ok. Only we tore our elevator canvas. Had to quit before nite. Mr Newton Bill Walker and one Smith from Clute, Okla. Came by, on way to Carleton, New Mexico. would like for them to stay a day or two.

Tuesday Oct 18 1927

Tues 18 We finished Newmans feed before noon. Moved up to Fife's. Had to stop and fix the water conveyor.

Wed 19 Cut all day for Fife. Did not finish his feed.

Thurs 20 Finished up Fife's, cut some of mine. Saw Mr White north of me. He has sixty acres to cut. Moved machine up to his field.

Fri 21 We cut all day for White

Sat 22 I stayed with the header till noon. Came home. We all went to town. Harold cut till near night. Had telegram from Fannie that she would be in on 6²⁰ P.M. train Monday 24th.

Sun 23 Walked over crop will cut my feed soon. We went up town in P.M. Over to see Mr Morgan for a few moments. Harold went to see a Mr Lynch that will start for California soon. He and wife are contemplating going on to Cal. with him. He did not get to see him. He would not be at his father's place till night.

Mon 24 Harold went up to Whites to finish his heading feed. He got done about 1 P.M. worked on machine bal. day. I met train. Sister Fannie came in from Cal.

Thursday Oct. 25. 1927.

Tues. 25 H.G. & I went up town to see some fellows about cutting their feed. They think it is too green. Fanny, Sallie & I went to town in P.M. The new oil stove came today.

Wed 26 We did nothing to-day. Harold's man that he is going to California with will leave Sat 6 A.M.

Thurs 27 We all sat around and talked. I took Fannie to the 6:05 P.M. train. She left for Los. Angeles Cal. her home.

Sat 29 Mr. Lynch called for Harold and family about 6:30 A.M. was a little cold and windy. Rained some last 'nite'. I sure did hate to see the boy leave, but maby he will do well. Hope so any way. Bud left this P.M. I am sure Louise did not want Bud to go back down there, but he has a girlfriend I think that is pulling him back. I was up town for a while this afternoon. Call tonite. Don't think will post.

Mexicans to pick cotton they
liked to set shack afire. (con 28)

Sat 5 Saturday Nov. 5. 1927.

I moved an oil stove over for them. They did not save the oil stove. They began to hallow and I went over. The women and kids were huddled up on outside. We got stove out doors. But it had melted down. They cooked and ate supper over at our kitchen. Had letter from Dellie. They arrived in California Monday Oct 31.

Sun 6 The Mexicans were up early and cooked breakfast on the ground or camp fire. I borrowed a 'batchelor' stove from Mrs Fife for them as Mr Fife had gone to Linnestone Co. on a death call. It was cloudy up and the weather looks threatening. Would like to get my feed cut and cotton picked over.

Mon 7 The Mexicans started picking cotton this A.M. I went up to Walker to cut feed. we cut all day. Bud came in this P.M.

Tues 8 We cut feed all day. Took off the first cotton 1450 #. Only put 1290 # in the bale. It weighed 485 #

Wed 9 We finished Walker's feed. Moved to mine. Took off another bale cotton. The weather is fine for all work. Wheat is heading ripe. cut one row.

Thurs 10 cut heads all day with machine.

Sat 12 " " Till noon finished about noon. Took two bales cotton to Gu. (see page 282)

Saturday Nov. 12 1927.

Sat 12 That made 3 bales for me. One for Newton. I shipped my three bales to Farm Bureau Association. Did not sell Newtons. Came home after dark. Cold as the devil.

Sun 13 I went up town to see Bishop. did not see him. We went over to Mr Fords in P.M. is cold to night.

Mon 14 We loaded up the turkeys I took them to town. The car did not come in until 2 or 3 o'clock P.M. We sold for 30¢ per lb. for #1 Turkey. 25¢ per # for old toms. Sold 9 that weighed 116# One old tom weighed 21#. Will keep 3 hens on one tom, for breeding stock. 4 was turned down on bring to light. Helped Bud load cotton, N.E. wind cold.

Tues 15 Went up town with Bud. He sold his cotton for 19.50¢. I sold Newtons for same. Did not settle up with Mrs Rabrison. We all went to Littlefield. They all bought some clothes. I bought me a leather coat. Cold to night. Walker brought my mules home, guess he finished cutting feed.

Wed 16 We picked cotton for Venerable.

Thur 17 we pulled cotton in mine today.

Sat 19 Bud and kids pulled cotton in for noon. I cleaned out my lat. went up town settled up with Mrs Rabrison. She was well pleased. Killed chate. we all went to Littlefield. Kids went to show. was cold. Slim cow found suck calf.

Sun 20 Stayed home all day. Sallie was under the weather. Kids gone near all day.
