After the raid into Memphis Tenn. Aug. 21st 1864. Genl. Forrest arrived at Grenada Aug. 24th and set about to reorganize his forces. McCulloch's Brigade composed of the 2nd Mo. Willis Texas Batt., the 7th Miss. the 5th Miss. 8th Miss. and the 18th Miss. was on the 29th of Aug. 64 ordered from West Point Miss. to Mobile Ala. leaving West Point Sept. 3rd by R.R.

Our Brigade did scouting and guard duty in and around Mobile. Pensacola. Wetton and various other places until Mobile fell into the hands of the enemy.

On Jan. 10th 1865 I left Mobile on furlow for 15 days to go to North Miss. for purpose of remounting. my horse having been shot by order; said to have glanders. I was furnished transportation to the head of navigation of Tom Bigby River, from thence via Columbus Miss. to Sardis Miss. my home. I had contracted 3rd day chills and for a long time was confined to a sick bed with Malarial Fever. I was never able to return to my command; but was Paroled at Memphis Tenn. May 29th 1865.
