After he had heard the performance of this gypsy tambourine player, Poet Esref commented upon it with this quatrain.

Like a <u>vali</u>, ⁵ he entered, collapsed on a cushion He performed as if he were equal to Allah, A player whom nobody else could equal; But he acted as if his tef were an orphan.

²Gypsies' ensembles are often hired to provide music for Turkish weddings.

A tef is a tambourine.

Daire means circle. The tambourine is a flat, circular musical instrument.
