





Your favor 24<sup>th</sup> just to hand, contents noted. As I could not accept your offer to buy guns etc in my possession, I packed carefully & shipped them to you. Have enclosed memorandum & off of same. ~~Shipment~~ of Dec 20/77, I found at deepest, when shipping remainder of lot, sent this lot back without paying freight this way. In my opinion, under the circumstances, it is just, that you should <sup>pay</sup> freight both ways on this lot, & return freight on remainder. If you had notified me of your intention to close all consignments, a few weeks in advance, I would not have ordered the last lot. I could also have forced the sale of greater portion of remainder.

The sale of guns etc to buffalo hunting is about over in February. The goods received






