From our point of view it does not appear to emit exclusively from within the realm of the Association's officer structure. This discrepancy should be corrected as soon as possible in order to assure our Association's autonomy and to allow TAMACC to determine it's own future course.

A reading of the proceedings clearly shows the implications of political pressure and an attempt to politicize the Association. This motive is almost as degrading to the TAMACC's purpose (unity of the Mexican-American Business community in Texas) as using the Assocation for an individual's advancement in the political arena.

The decision to change the date was extremely poorly timed and therefore destructive to TAMACC's credibility since many influential speakers had made commitments which could have been made to other concerns with as much advantage. Speakers included Hon. Lloyd Bentsen, Hon. J.J. "Jake" Pickle, Hon. Gonzalo Barrientos, Hon. John Trevino of the Austin City Council, Hon Richard Moya, Comissioner of Travis County and persons in economic development from Mc Allen and Corpus Chrisi. The speakers cannot be blamed if they view this as a personal affront. More importantly, the switch has damaged TAMACC's image locally and statewide. It has made the Association appear to be indecisive and disorganized.

The result of this may make it very difficult for the development of any future ability the TAMACC could have in being influential in promoting the Mexican-American Community's business interests.

Insult was added to injury (the damage to TAMACC's credibility) when persons influenced by the present director of OMBE were sent to Austin to validate the efforts of the Austin MACC's board of directors in obtaining suitable accomodations for the convention if the date were changed. A good faith effort was made to find facilities but none were available at the time of inquirey. However, Misters Garcia and Stassner made arrangements with the Sheraton Crest who had made it clear that facilities were not available. It is speculated that they received a cancellation after our inquiry. Although the Crest may have accomodated the convention it is undergoing extensive remodeling or repair and does not offer an appealing atmosphere. This was not the paramount point of contention however. The speakers could not have been asked to change their schedules on such short notice. As we all know, persons of this stature are obligated months in advance. This in itself lends circumstantial evidence to our belief that the convention was to be <u>used</u> for one person's benefit, namely that of the director of OMBE, since he would have been the only speaker "able" to appear on the dates of the convention which may have made an impact with his superiors.

The Travis MACC chose not to host the convention for the foregoing reasons. It is our feeling that changing the dates of the convention was an unfortunate and ill-considered decision. It will have the effect of subjecting TAMACC to political force and degrading it to serve an individual's interests rather than enchancing its potential as a force in its own right.

It is unfortunate that the question of where and when the convention was to be held actually obscured the real purpose of the convention. Our young Association needed this convention to go on as scheduled to reflect the solidarity we enjoy. Speakers, accomodations, workshops and many other plans have had to be cancelled only because it conflicted with one individual's schedule.

The Travis MACC is by no means advocating the abolishment of the Association nor is it renouncing the responsibility it has assumed in the development of minority businesses. In spite of this setback we still have the ambition to maintain consistency, integrity, credibility and dignity within TAMACC. We believe it is imperative that we meet very soon for the purpose of expressing our views as to the future of TAMACC. It is strongly urged that a concientious effort be made in order to arrive at logical procedures for future conventions and Association functions.
