My Dear Wife.

How nice doubtless be surprised to receive a letter from me at this point.

I got a letter from Mr. Fiddling, in yesterday stating that Walter, was very much worse, and I started yesterday evening to go to see him. I will go up tonight, for it is now dark on the "Gray Eagle".

I do not know what I shall do until I get there. if he is in a condition to be removed I will take him to an Asylum.

If you get this in time write to me here of Boston, and direct to Care of Broadway Street, and if the Boston has gone down, then send by mail with same direction.

I think I will get back here by Saturday and I will either get him into an Asylum here or take him to Columbus. I will write you from father and give you the particulars of his condition. I shall not get

Home until the Legislature adjourns.

My Dear Wife,

I got here last night on the
Boston, - I succeeded in getting
Father, to come with me. Not very
willingly. His mind is very weak
today, so that he is quite childish.
I think the excitement of yesterday
has much to do with it, as he is
not so well as when I first got
to him on Thursday. I hope when
he gets quiet again he will be
better. I will leave him here in
a private Asylum, under the
Care of Dr. Mead.

I received your letter this morning
I have not taken time to write. The
Gray & Co., will leave soon, and I
want to send this on her.

Write to me at New York by
the Boston, Monday.

I will be at home in 7 or 8 days
more.
